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3 * * * 1 2 State Architects Licensure Board 3 January 11, 2018 * * * 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Architects Licensure Board was held on Thursday, 6 7 January 11, 2018. John R. Hill, RA, President, called 8 the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. 9 * * * 10 Roll Call 11 [Roll call was taken. A quorum was noted to be 12 present.] * * * 13 Introduction of Audience Members 14 15 [President Hill requested the introduction of audience 16 members.1 * * * 17 18 Pledge of Allegiance 19 [The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.] * * * 20 Approval of Minutes of the November 16, 2017 meeting 21 2.2 PRESIDENT HILL: 23 To start off, approval of the minutes. 24 They are in your agenda for today. Has 25 everybody had a chance to review them?

4 Are there any comments, corrections, 1 2 additions, or deletions to the minutes? 3 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.] Δ PRESIDENT HILL: 5 Any other comments? If not, can I hear 6 a motion to approve the minutes? 7 MR. CARNEY: 8 So moved. 9 MR. LEINBACH: 10 Second. 11 PRESIDENT HILL: 12 All in favor? All right. The minutes 13 are approved. 14 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 15 16 Report of Prosecutorial Division - Case Status Report 17 [Robert B. Armour, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, 18 referred to the Case Status Report. Mr. Armour 19 explained that the cases are coded in more than one 20 complaint category and may not be the actual number of 21 complaints. Mr. Armour noted 62 open files with 114 22 categories and clarified that the 62 files are 23 pliable. 24 Mr. Armour defined the functions of the Bureau of 25 Enforcement and Investigation, Board Counsel,

Professional Compliance Office, and the Prosecution 1 2 Division.1 * * * 3 4 Report of Board Counsel 5 [Ariel O'Malley, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a 6 brief summary of her professional background. 7 President Hill welcomed Ms. O'Malley. 8 He informed Ms. O'Malley of draft regulation revisions 9 from 2017 requiring additional Board discussion. Ms. 10 O'Malley noted that the Board has one pending disciplinary 11 matter, for which she will provide a draft adjudication for 12 the Board's review at its next meeting.] * * * 13 14 Applications 15 [President Hill noted applications for the Board's 16 review in Executive Session.] * * * 17 18 Report of Commissioner - No Report * * * 19 20 Report of Board Administrator 21 [Amanda Li, Board Administrator, referred to the 2.2 Statement of Financial Interests forms due May 1, 23 2018. 24 Ms. Li noted the National Council of 25 Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) Outreach

2	6:30 p.m. at Drexel University; Wednesday, January 24,
3	2018, from 11:15 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. at the Community

6	Pennsylvania. Ms. Li mentioned a proposed visit to
7	the Carnegie Mellon and American Institute of
8	Architects (AIA) in Pittsburgh on February 12th or
9	13th, 2018.
10	President Hill noted the importance of attending
11	the event to explain the function of the Architects
12	Licensure Board to the students at these universities,
13	with the goal of keeping the students in Pennsylvania.
14	Ms. Li discussed a letter from a licensee
15	regarding city inspectors. President Hill requested
16	the Board to review the letter in order to draft a
17	response.]

19	Appointment - Bureau of Finance and Operations
20	[Kimberly A. Mattis, Finance and Operations Manager,
21	Bureau of Finance and Operations, Division of Fiscal
22	Management, introduced Julie Snader, Chief, Finance
23	and Operations Manager, Bureau of Finance and
24	Operations, Division of Procurement, and Kimberly
25	Adams, Esquire, Board of Finance and Revenue.

Ms. Mattis provided information regarding the population and classes over the last three years. Ms. Mattis noted 9,891 licensees in December 2017 and currently 9,906. Ms. Mattis compared the last renewal cycle Fiscal Year 2015-2016 and noted 94 more than this time two years ago.

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7 Ms. Mattis reviewed revenue in different 8 categories over a biennial period. She noted revenues 9 for 2015-2016 and 2016-2017, totaling over \$984,000. 10 Ms. Mattis noted the Board's last change in renewal 11 fees was in 2003.

12 Ms. Mattis discussed Board expenses as a direct 13 expense, timesheet-based expense, and licensee-based 14 charges. Ms. Mattis reviewed biennial renewal 15 She noted cost categories, as well as periods. 16 administrative and legal costs. She noted expenses 17 for the last two fiscal years, 2017-2018 budget at 18 \$485,000 and expenses as of December 26, 2017, at 19 \$197,000. Ms. Mattis noted the Board's remaining 20 balance is continuing to grow. 21 Ms. Mattis discussed Board member expenses over 22 the last two fiscal years 2015-2016 and 2016-2017. 23 The Board's budget for the current fiscal year is

24 \$22,000 and expenses as of December 26, 2017 were just 25 over \$13,000.]

8 * * * 1 2 Report of Board President 3 [President Hill discussed the NCARB Direct 4 Registration Agreement to work with the PA Board as 5 far as approving exam candidates. 6 Ms. O'Malley stated the Board does not have the 7 legal capabilities to grant that authority to another 8 entity. 9 President Hill noted the NCARB Regional Summit 10 from March 9th to the 10th, 2018, in Wichita, KS, and 11 listed himself as President and Doug Carney to 12 attend.] PRESIDENT HILL: 13 14 We have currently listed myself as 15 President and Doug Carney to attend. 16 All in favor? Any opposed? 17 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 18 19 [President Hill noted the NCARB Region 2 Call for 20 Nominations and the proposed slate of Officers. 21 Mr. Leinbach stated all current seated members 22 are going to self-nominate, although others may apply 23 if interested. Mr. Leinbach noted the elections will 24 be held at the regional meeting Wichita, Kansas. 25 President Hill referred to NCARB Bylaws regarding

1 the Draft Resolution Preview that will be discussed in 2 further detail at the Regional Conference, Centennial 3 celebration for 2019, Rules of Conduct for review and 4 discussion, and NCARB Correspondence.

5 President Hill noted the "intern" title change 6 and Board Initiatives regarding outreach to PA Code 7 Officials and publication of new licensees for 8 recognition.

9 Ms. Mahrouki updated the Board on legislative 10 issues, noting that AIA was starting the second year 11 of the legislative session. Ms. Mahrouki stated the 12 mandatory continuing education and legal reform issues 13 will be revisited.

Ms. Mahrouki informed the Board that AIA sent a 14 15 letter to Governor Wolf, Commissioner Harlow, and both 16 Chairmen of the House and Senate for Consumer 17 Protection & Professional Licensure Committees 18 regarding the Executive Order. Ms. Mahrouki commended 19 the Governor's efforts to study the licensure Boards 20 as a whole. She added that mandatory continuing 21 education was a good idea for architects in 22 Pennsylvania and will assist with the reciprocity of 23 other states. Ms. Mahrouki also noted discussion 24 regarding the prosecution of the unlicensed practice 25 of architecture.

Mr. Potter mentioned the exposure draft of the 1 2 electronic seal regulation with all three licensing 3 Boards, noting concerns specific with respect to technology and the ability of the regulation to 4 5 address the electronic seals.] * * * 6 7 [The Board recessed from 9:46 a.m. until 10:00 a.m.] * * * 8 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 9 10 10:00 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session with Ariel O'Malley, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the 11 purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations. 12 13 The Board returned to Open Session at 10:51 a.m.] * * * 14 15 [The Board held a formal hearing in the matter of a 16 Provisional Denial of the Architect Registration 17 Examination Application of Peter J.
