- 15 recusal guidelines. She explained mandatory recusal
- 16 as Board members who have a prosecutorial role in the
- 17 | matter or a direct personal financial interest in the
- 18 outcome of the matter.
- 19 Ms. Black stated it would be strongly suggested
- 20 to recuse if a Board member has a personal affection
- 21 for someone directly involved in the subject at issue,
- 22 has knowledge from outside of the case that they
- 23 cannot set aside in order to make a fair and unbiased
- 24 determination.
- 25 Ms. Black stated discretionary recusal would be

where a Board member felt he or she could not hear and dispose of the case or participate in a decision on a subject fairly and without prejudice.

Ms. Black commented that Board members should not hesitate to discuss the matter with Board counsel privately by telephone, during a meeting break, or as an aside prior to the beginning of a meeting in any circumstance where a Board member was uncertain about whether or not to recuse from that matter.

Ms. Black referred to 16A-4826 regarding a limited liability company. She mentioned the proposed regulations address the licensing of a limited liability company as funeral establishments. She stated the Funeral Director Law specifically authorizes the Board to grant licenses to operate funeral establishments to a sole proprietor funeral director.

Ms. Black also explained that a partnership of funeral directors was a restricted business corporation that meets certain criteria, including a professional corporation and certain preexisting general business corporations. She stated the General Assembly enacted the Limited Liability Company Act in 1994, which provided that these newly authorized entities may be organized to practice a profession.

Ms. Black stated, in order to permit funeral directors to take advantage of the benefits provided by an LLC within the limitation of the Funeral Director Law, the Board must amend its regulations to allow these business structures to become licensed either as a sole proprietor or partnership funeral entity.

Ms. Black noted that the Department of State's Regulatory Counsel was in the process of finalizing the governor's regulatory agenda, and this would be an opportunity to include this particular set of regulations in the regulatory packet.

Ms. Black questioned whether the annex drafted in 2016 was something the Board wanted to make changes to regarding the language or proceed with submitting it to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission and move forward with adopting it.]
