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3 State Board of Funeral Directors 1 2 July 29, 2020 * * * 3 4 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 5 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 6 with Jaime D. Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, to have 7 attorney-client consultations and for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations regarding the 8 matters on today's agenda. The Board returned to 9 10 public session at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 11 12 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Board 13 of Funeral Directors was held Wednesday, July 29, 14 2020. William Harris, Chairman, Professional Member, 15 called the meeting to order at 10:42 a.m. The Pledge 16 of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken. * * * 17 18 [Jaime Black, Esquire noted the meeting was being 19 recorded and that presence in the meeting was giving 20 consent to being recorded.] * * * 21 22 Approval of Board Minutes of July 29, 2020 23 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 24 Let's begin with approval of the Minutes of 25 the last meeting. Do I hear a motion to

approve those Minutes? 1 2 MR. KUKUCHKA: 3 I approve the Minutes as presented. 4 MR. MCCUSKER: 5 I'll second that. 6 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 7 Report of Board Prosecution Liaison 8 [Timothy Fritsch, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, 9 10 presented a Consent Agreement for File No. 16-48-01501.] 11 * * * 12 [Glenn P. Masser, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented 13 14 Consent Agreements for File No. 19-48-013895 and File 15 No. 20-48-004898 and 20-48-005132.] * * * 16 17 MOTIONS MS. BLACK: 18 19 Starting with the Consent Agreement at 20 Item No. 2 on the agenda, based upon 21 discussions in Executive Session I believe the Board would entertain a 2.2 23 motion to reject the proposed Consent 24 Agreement for Case No. 19-48-013895. 25 CHAIRMAN HARRIS:

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5 1 Do I hear a motion as such? 2 MS. RODRIGUEZ: 3 So moved. 4 MR. CUSTEAD: I'll second. 5 6 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 7 We have a motion and a second. All in 8 favor signify by saying aye. Any 9 opposed? 10 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 11 12 MS. BLACK: 13 Again, based on discussions in Executive 14 Session, I believe the Board would 15 entertain a motion to reject the proposed 16 Consent Agreement at Agenda Item No. 3, Case No. 16-48-01501. 17 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 18 19 Do I hear a motion on Number Three? MS. RODRIGUEZ: 20 21 So moved. 22 MR. KUKUCHKA: 23 Second. 24 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 25 We have a motion and a second. All in

6 favor signify by saying aye? 1 Any opposed? If not, the motion carries. 2 3 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 4 5 MS. BLACK: Number Four, I believe the Board would 6 7 entertain a motion to reject the proposed Consent Agreement at Agenda Item No. 4, 8 9 Case Numbers 20-48-004898 and 20-48-10 005132. 11 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 12 Do I hear a motion on Number Four? 13 MS. KIRK: 14 So moved. 15 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 16 Do we have a second? 17 MS. RODRIGUEZ: 18 Second. 19 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 20 We have a motion and a second. All in 21 favor signify by saying aye? [Jaime Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted a proposed 1 2 Adjudication and Order for approval and two 3 Reinstatement requests. MOTIONS (CONTINUED) 4 5 MS. BLACK: 6 Would the Board entertain a motion to 7 approve the proposed Adjudication and substitute the Board's Order for Case No. 8 9 19-48-005629 and direct Board Counsel to 10 issue a A&O in due course? 11 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 12 Do I hear a motion concerning Number Five? 13 14 MR. KUKUCHKA: 15 I'm not happy with that fine which I 16 think it's going to be \$4,000. I mean, 17 basically, they're practicing in the 18 State of Pennsylvania without a Funeral 19 Director License and I think that should 20 go to the max. 21 MS. BLACK: 22 Right. Tom, we're just approving the 23 proposed Agreement and we're going to 24 substitute a Board Order for that. 25 CHAIRMAN HARRIS:

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1 Tom, will you do that motion? 2 MR. KUKUCHKA: 3 Yes, I move. 4 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 5 Do we have a second? 6 MS. 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9 1 Do we have a second? 2 MS. RODRIGUEZ: 3 Second. CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 4 5 We have a motion and a second. All in 6 favor signify by saying aye? Any 7 opposed? 8 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 9 10 MS. BLACK: 11 Moving onto Item Number 7, will the Board 12 entertain a motion to approve the 13 Reinstatement of the License to Practice 14 as a Funeral Director of Carl C. Brown, 15 Jr., F.D., Case No. 20-48-03495? 16 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: Do we have a motion on Number Seven? 17 18 MS. KIRK: 19 So moved. 20 MR. MCCUSKER: 21 Second. 2.2 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 23 We have a motion and a second. All in 24 favor signify by saying aye? Any 25 opposed?

BLACK: Would the Board entertain a motion to 4 5 approve the Reinstatement of the License 6 to Practice as a Funeral Director of 7 Jeffrey Fierro, F.D., Case No. 20-48-003543? 8 9 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 10 Do I hear a motion pertaining to Number 11 Eight? 12 MS. KIRK: 13 So moved. 14 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 15 Do we have a second? 16 MR. MCCUSKER: 17 Second CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 18 19 We have a motion and a second. All in 20 favor signify by saying aye? Any 21 opposed? 22 [The motion carried unanimously.] 23 * * * 24 Applications for Review 25 MS. BLACK:

11 Will the Board entertain a motion to 1 2 approve the Application for Supervisor of 3 David Videon? CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 4 5 I'll make a motion to approve that. 6 MR. KUKUCHKA: 7 I'll second that. 8 CHATRMAN HARRTS: 9 We have a motion and a second. All in 10 favor signify by saying aye? Any 11 opposed? [The motion carried unanimously.] 12 13 * * * 14 MS. BLACK: 15 Item No. 13, would the Board entertain a 16 motion to provisionally deny the Application for Temporary Supervisor of 17 Stephen Polinski? 18 19 CHATRMAN HARRTS: 20 Do we have a motion to provisionally deny 21 that? MS. RODRIGUEZ: 22 23 So moved. 24 MS. KIRK: 25 Second.

1 CHAIRMAN HARRIS:

2 We have a motion and a second. All in 3 favor signify by saying aye? Any 4 opposed? 5 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 6 Items for Discussion 7 Discussion of Regulations 8 [Jaime Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, deferred to 9 10 Cynthia Montgomery, Esquire, Deputy Chief Counsel, for further discussion of 16A-4824, the Child Abuse 11 12 regulation. The addition to the regulation was that applicants for licensure as a funeral director have to 13 14 complete three hours of training in child Abuse and 15 Child Recognition and Reporting as required by Section 6383 of the Child Protective Services Law. 16 Section 17 13.231 related to biannual renewal of licenses, which 18 funeral directors would need to complete at least two hours of approved courses in Child Abuse Recognition 19 20 and Reporting. 21 There are comprehensive amendments to the existing 22 Child Abuse Reporting requirements, 13.301. All definitions have been updated to conform to changes to 23 2.4 the Child Protective Services Law and a couple of 25 changes recently to the definition as well, with the

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1 addition of leaving a child with a sexually violent 2 predator and engaging the child in a form of 3 trafficking persons or sex trafficking. She stated 4 the definition of perpetrator was also added.

5 Ms. Montgomery explained 13.302 is the actual 6 requirement for mandated reporting which points out 7 that all funeral directors are considered mandated reporters under the Child Protective Services Law and 8 noted that there are four criteria that need to be 9 10 met. She noted that reporting procedures have been 11 updated to incorporate the making of an electronic report. Section 13.303 was amended to require that 12 any photographs, x-rays medical tests that might have 13 14 been done of the child must be submitted within 48 15 hours after an electronic report was made. Section 13.304 was amended to require the reporting of the 16 suspicion of a child that died as a result of child 17 abuse. 18

The section on Immunity from Liability had been amended to conform to the changes to the Child Protective Services Law. Ms. Montgomery explained that Section 13.306 with regard to confidentiality remains the same, and Section 13.307, Noncompliance, reflects the most recent amendments to criminal penalties for failure to report.

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Ms. Montgomery had discussion regarding two 1 additional sections, 13.308 the mandatory training 2 3 requirements, and 13.309 which updates the administrative process for child abuse course 4 5 approval. 6 She noted an amendment to Section 13.401, which is 7 the continuing education credit hour requirement which includes the two hours of approved courses in child 8 abuse recognition and reporting. 9 Ms. Montgomery referred to the Preamble, which is 10 11 a summary of the proposal that gets published along with the Annex in the Pennsylvania Bulletin for public 12 13 comment. 14 MOTIONS (CONTINUED) 15 MS. MONTGOMERY: 16 I would be seeking a vote from the Board 17 to approve the Proposed Rulemaking 18 authorizing her to promulgate it through 19 the regulatory review process. 20 MS. RODRIGUEZ: 21 I make a motion. 2.2 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 23 Do we have a second? 24 MS. KIRK: 25 Second.

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1 CHAIRMAN HARRIS:

We have a motion and a second. 2 All in 3 favor signify by saying aye? Any 4 opposed? 5 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 6 7 [Thomas Kukuchka, Professional Member, exited the meeting at 11:20 a.m.] 8 9 * * * 10 [Ms. Black referred Board members to No. 10 on the agenda, 16A-4826, Limited Liability Company proposed 11 rulemaking, for further discussion. She indicated 12 this was first drafted in 2016 and addresses licensing 13 14 of limited liability companies as funeral 15 establishments. She inquired if Board members were 16 still in agreement with the Annex as drafted or would 17 there be changes or updates that need to be made. 18 Chairman Harris indicated he hasn't heard any objections regarding the matter and suggested it be 19 20 approved. MS. BLACK: 21 2.2 Would the Board entertain a motion to 23 direct Board Counsel to proceed through 24 the regulatory process with this packet? 25 CHAIRMAN HARRIS:

I would make that motion. 1 Do I hear a 2 second? 3 MS. RODRIGUEZ: 4 Second. 5 CHATRMAN HARRTS: 6 We have a motion and a second. All in 7 favor signify by saying aye? Any opposed? 8 9 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 10 11 [Ms. Black referred Board members to No. 11, the Licensure by Endorsement regulation, for further 12 discussion. Ms. Black noted this legislation was 13 discussed last fall by the Board and related to 14 15 licensure by endorsement for the Board to determine competency criteria of an applicant. 16 17 She noted that Board Counsel provided the Board 18 with the Annex at the December meeting. The examples of competency criteria in the template annex includes 19 20 experience in the profession for at least two out of five years immediately preceding the date of the 21 22 application, the completion of continuing education and achieving a passing score in a Board or Commission 23 24 approved exam. Board members had questions regarding 25 the regulation.

Commissioner Johnson commented that the Board had 1 2 to consider the context in which the legislation was 3 intended. He stated competency was one's ability to do the job at the level of professionalism that the 4 law requires and can be demonstrated by gainful 5 employment but that should not necessarily be the 6 7 deciding factor in determining whether one was competent. 8

9 After further discussion Board members agreed that 10 the competency criteria would include the current 11 requirement for Pennsylvania funeral directors of six 12 continuing education credits every two years. 13 Additionally, the Board voted to also use 2 out of the 14 last 5 years of practicing in the profession as the 15 other competency criteria.

16 Mr. Dupree expressed concerns he had regarding 17 possible loopholes in the law with regard to the 18 regulation. There was further discussion regarding 19 the matter.

20 MS. BLACK:

21 Does the Board want to entertain a motion 22 to direct Board Counsel to draft an Annex 23 to include the competency criteria as 24 discussed, which is two of five years and 25 six CE credits within the 24 preceding

18 months? 1 2 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 3 I want to move ahead with a motion to approve. Do we have a second? 4 5 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 6 Second. 7 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 8 We have a motion and a second. All in 9 favor signify by saying aye? Any 10 opposed? 11 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 12 Report of Commissioner 13 14 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner Bureau of 15 Professional and Occupational Affairs, thanked the 16 Board for its flexibility and patience as the transition was made to conduct meetings virtually. 17 Нe 18 acknowledged members of the Department of State policy team and directors from the two oversight committees 19 20 who were present on the telephone, as well as staff and the Board Administrator who continue to provide 21 22 administrative guidance for licensees and applicants. 23 Commissioner Johnson also congratulated the 2.4 Board's newest members.] 25 * * *

Report of Board Chairman 1 [William Harris, Professional Member, Chairman, 2 3 thanked everyone for attending via telephone. He 4 noted the Vice Chair would be conducting the meeting in September.] 5 * * * 6 7 Report of Board Administrator [Heidy Weirich, Board Administrator, thanked both 8 Commissioner Johnson and Chairman Harris for their 9 10 comments. She noted the staff was working very hard 11 to process applications in a timely manner.] * * * 12 13 Miscellaneous 14 Election of Officers 15 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 16 I would entertain any motions to appoint a new Secretary for the Board. 17 18 MS. RODRIGUEZ: 19 I would like to nominate Tom Kukuchka for 20 Secretary. CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 21 2.2 Do we have a second? 23 MR. MCCUSKER: 24 I'll second that. 25 CHAIRMAN HARRIS:

20 We have a motion and a second. All in 1 2 favor signify by saying aye? Any 3 opposed? CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 4 Tom Kukuchka is not us; we did this 5 6 without him, but I think he will be okay. 7 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 8 9 MS. BLACK: 10 Would the Board entertain a motion to 11 retain the current officers? 12 MS. KIRK: So moved. 13 14 MR. MCCUSKER: 15 Second. 16 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 17 We have a motion and a second.
