She stated Act 41 of 2019 went into effect on August 29, 2019, which provides a way for boards and commissions of the Bureau to provide a Commonwealth-issued license to applicants currently licensed or certified in other jurisdictions.
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Ms. Black stated the purpose of Act 41 was to reduce unnecessary barriers to licensure for new residents, veterans, military spouses, and other individuals who wish to move to and work in the Commonwealth.

Ms. Black mentioned discussion at the July meeting, where the Board voted on competencies, which included having experience for 2 of the 5 years immediately preceding the date of the application or completing of 6 hours of continuing education in the preceding 24 months.]
