Harris, Chairman, 14 Professional Member, called the meeting to order at 15 10:07 a.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken. K. Kalonji Johnson, Acting 16 17 Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs, 18 was not present at the commencement of the meeting. A quorum was noted to be present. 19 * * * 20 21 [Heidy M. Weirich, Board Administrator, reviewed the 22 emergency evacuation procedures for One Penn Center.] 23 * * * 24 Approval of Minutes of the August 29, 2019 meeting 25 CHAIRMAN HARRIS:

Masser, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented 24 the Consent Agreement for Case No. 17-48-014157.] * * * 25

Appointment - Bureau of Finance and Operations Budget 1 2 Presentation 3 [Kimberly A. Mattis, Director, Bureau of Finance and 4 Operations, introduced herself and Julie Snader, 5 Deputy Director, Bureau of Finance and Operations. 6 Ms. Mattis referred the Board to a financial 7 packet contained in the agenda. She provided 8 information regarding the Board's licensee population. 9 She noted 6,203 licensees for FY19-20 with a steady 10 increase in licensees since FY14-15. 11 Ms. Mattis referred to sources of revenue, noting 12 the biennial total for FY18-19. She noted the 13 majority of revenue was from renewals and applications 14 at 95 percent. 15 Ms. Mattis next reviewed the expenses of the 16 Board, which can be incurred from direct charges, 17 timesheet charges, and license-based charges. She 18 also referred to administrative and legal expenses. 19 She noted the expenses for FY17-18, FY18-19, as well 20 as the budgeted figures for FY19-20 and the expenses 21 as of 11/21/2019. She had no concern for the Board to 22 go over budget based on the numbers. 23 Ms. Mattis reviewed the financial status figures comparing the revenue and expenses together. 24 She 25 reviewed the beginning balances for FY17-18, FY18-19,

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and FY19-20, and the anticipated balance at the end of 1 this fiscal year, noting a very healthy balance 2 3 through FY22-23.] * * * 4 5 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Acting Commissioner, entered the 6 meeting at 10:28 a.m.] * * * 7 8 [Ms. Mattis reviewed the Board's budget and Board 9 member expense categories. Any 8 9 opposed? 10 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 11 Appointment - Quaker State Funeral Directors 12 Association (QSFDA) 13 14 [Lisa Branch-Edwards, Legislative Chair, Quaker State 15 Funeral Directors Association (QSFDA), introduced herself to the Board, as well as introduced addition 16 QSFDA members in attendance. She noted boxes of 17 18 cremated remains. 19 Ms. Branch-Edwards reported that urban explorers 20 or trespassers of abandoned funeral homes found 21 approximately 48 boxes of cremated remains in Baker 22 Funeral Home, which is located in Philadelphia, PA. 23 The boxes were removed by the Philadelphia Medical 24 Examiner's Office. QSFDA held an emergency meeting 25 with Mr. Baker, the prior funeral director, and met

with the Bureau of Enforcement regarding the matter. 1 2 Ms. Branch-Edwards reported on the collaborative 3 efforts between QSFDA, the Philadelphia Medical 4 Examiner's office, and Mr. Baker was instituted to 5 reunite these remains with their loved ones. Due the significant number of creative remains found at the 6 7 Baker Funeral Home, the Philadelphia Medical Examiner's office could not accept all of the remains. 8 9 Ms. Branch-Edwards discussed the incredible 10 endeavors to be undertaken to handle all of the 11 remains, as well as the files located at the facility. 12 She provided information of a woman from an ABCaffiliated station efforts to contact this Board and 13 14 others regarding the remains of her loved one. Ms. 15 Branch-Edwards was able to locate these remains, but the facility has been secured. 16 The Baker Funeral Home 17 building was sold, and the new owner plans to commence 18 demolition after the new year. The new owner agreed 19 to hold the building's demolition until the remains 20 are removed. 21 Ms. Branch-Edwards requested guidance from the 2.2 Board on the matter. 23 Chairman Harris thank Ms. Branch-Edwards for 24 providing this information to the Board. Acting 25 Commissioner Johnson stated QSFDA had reached out to

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1 the Commissioner's Office in November. He could not 2 respond to any request due to potential conflicts with 3 his adjudicatory position on the Board. The 4 information was forwarded onto the Enforcement 5 division for investigation.

Acting Commissioner Johnson discussed the unique service of the funeral director profession, as well as raising awareness of these activities to the local legislators. He discussed the authority of the Board governed by the legislation and its practice act. Mr. Johnson expressed his hope and prayers that the remains would be reunited with their loved ones.

Ms. Branch-Edwards appreciated the authority of the Board. She discussed the dissolution of a funeral home business.

16 Chairman Harris stated the Board hoped the 17 remains could be cared for or placed in a secure 18 facility to be properly memorialized. He suggested to 19 QSFDA to reach out to the local legislators, other 20 funeral directors, and cemeteries in the area to 21 assist with the matter.

Jennifer Kirk, Esquire, questioned Ms. Branch-Edwards as to her immediate solution to the problem. Ms. Branch-Edwards outlined a planned protocol to reunite the remains with family. She discussed a 1 continued circumstance of cremated remains not being 2 picked up by family members and these remains are held 3 at the funeral home for an extended period of time. 4 Ms. Branch-Edwards explained the unclaimed remains 5 would be buried in a recoverable grave and the files 6 would be destroyed.

7 Acting Commissioner Johnson discussed obtaining the proper ownership of the property following the 8 9 dissolution of a business. Ms. Branch-Edwards 10 reiterated that the new owner agreed to release the 11 remains and files to QSFDA. Acting Commissioner 12 Johnson noted the opportunities for discussion with 13 the Department of State and the Office of Legislative 14 Affairs.]

He explained that 13 applicants from other states could be provided a 14 provisional license in order to meet the requirements 15 as set by the Board. The Application Committee would have to determine if the applicant's qualifications 16 17 were substantially equivalent to Pennsylvania to 18 obtain licensure. 19 Mr. Fritz stated prior discipline in another 20 state or criminal convictions would also be considered 21 by the Board. The process would make it easier for an 22 applicant from another state to obtain Pennsylvania 23 licensure. 24 Mr. Fritz outlined the determinations of the 25 Board and definitions to be included in this proposed

1 regulation of the Board. He reported that Act 41 was 2 enacted and supported by the Governor's Office in 3 October 2019. The original idea was to address 4 concerns for military personnel and spouses 5 transferring from state to state.

Acting Commissioner Johnson reiterated that the Board has final approval on an applicant's licensure, but the Board must draft the requirements for licensure supporting Act 41. He noted licensure by reciprocity or endorsement.

11 Chairman noted prior discussion for the formation of a committee to review the matter and present a 12 13 draft for consideration by the whole Board. Mr. Fritz 14 discussed setting requirements to demonstrate 15 competency to the Board, such as requiring 60 college 16 credits, and implementing provisional licensure. The timeline for promulgating this regulation is 17 18 months from October 2019. The Board's 18 19 recommendations will be reviewed at its February 20 meeting.] 21 * * * 2.2 [Chairman Harris wished all a Merry Christmas and safe 23 travel over the holidays.] * * * 24 25 Adjournment
