Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, to have attorney-client consultation and for the purpose of 8 conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on items on 9 10 the agenda that are currently pending before the Board and to receive advice of counsel. The Board entered 11 into public session at 10:30 a.m.] 12 \* \* \* 13 14 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 15 Board of Funeral Directors was held on Monday, October 16 25, 2021. William G. Harris, Chairman, Professional 17 Member, called the meeting to order at 10:32 a.m. \* \* \* 18 19 Roll Call 20 [Chairman Harris requested a roll call of Board 21 members.1 \* \* \* 22 23 [Jaime D. Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed 24 everyone that the Board met in Executive Session to 25 conduct quasi-judicial deliberations on items on the

agenda that are currently pending before the Board and 1 2 to receive advice of counsel. 3 Ms. Black also reminded everyone that the meeting 4 was being recorded, and those who continued to 5 participate in the meeting are giving their consent to 6 be recorded.] \* \* \* 7 8 Approval of minutes of the September 15, 2021 meeting 9 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 10 We'll move to number 1 on the agenda, 11 and that will be to approve the meeting 12 minutes from September 15, 2021. 13 If there are no changes or updates 14 on that meeting, I would ask someone to 15 make a motion to approve? 16 MR. MCCUSKER: So moved. 17 18 MS. IMBURGIA: 19 Second. 20 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 21 We have a motion and a second. All in 22 favor, signify by saying aye. Anybody 23 opposed? 24 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 25

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5 Report of Prosecutorial Division 1 2 [Timothy A. Fritsch, Esquire, Board Prosecution 3 Liaison, had nothing to report from the prosecutorial division but offered to answer any questions from 4 5 Board members.] \* \* \* 6 7 Report of Board Counsel 8 MOTIONS 9 MS. BLACK: 10 Moving on to item 2. I believe the 11 Board would entertain a motion to deny 12 the Motion to Deem Facts Admitted and 13 Entry of Default for BPOA v. BKG Funeral 14 Home & Cremation, Inc., Case No. 17-48-15 13836. 16 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: Do we have a motion on number 2? 17 MS. IMBURGIA: 18 19 I motion. 20 MS. KIRK: 21 Second. 2.2 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 23 We have a motion and a second. All in 24 favor, signify by saying aye. Anyone 25 opposed?

BLACK: The last thing I have is items 9 and 10. 6 7 I believe the Board would entertain a motion to approve the Additional 8 9 Employment Requests of Justin Keiper and 10 Dina Cantelmi. 11 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 12 I will make the motion to approve that. Do we have a second? 13 14 MS. RODRIGUEZ: 15 I second. 16 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 17 We have a motion and a second. All in 18 favor for approval, please say aye. Ιs 19 there anyone opposed? 20 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 21 22 Report of Commissioner 23 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of 24 Professional and Occupational Affairs, addressed the 25 extension of regulatory waivers through March 31,

1 2022. He noted the extension includes virtual 2 allowance of Board meetings and that the Board will 3 continue to operate in the same fashion as it has for 4 the last 18 months. He thanked the Board for their 5 continued patience.

6 Commissioner Johnson urged Board members to 7 strongly consider the virtual option when offered for 8 their own health and safety. He mentioned a new 9 process regarding physical travel requests for 10 accommodations to national or regional conventions 11 through a new travel portal.

12 Commissioner Johnson discussed statutory 13 amendments to the Sunshine Act requiring actions be on 14 the agenda and formally voted upon and finalized 15 before any administrative approvals for travel requests. He recommended everyone submit travel 16 requests to Ms. Hemler or Ms. Black as soon as 17 18 possible for processing because of national shortages 19 and difficulties procuring accommodations.] 20 \* \* \* 21 Report of Board Chairperson - No Report \* \* \* 2.2 23 Items for Discussion [Kristel Hennessy Hemler, Board Administrator, 24 25 addressed a new process in place for establishments

1 when holding human remains. She stated that funeral 2 establishments would have to fill out a form that 3 should be typed and emailed to the Board Resource 4 Account at ra-funeral@pa.gov.

Ms. Hemler explained that Board staff will review 5 6 the requests and assign a Board member to the request 7 for review. She noted the request would then be uploaded to the establishment's file in the 8 9 Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS), and the establishment would be notified of approval. 10 She 11 commented that Board staff would reply with the request to the establishment if additional information 12 13 was required before approval by the Board member. 14 Ms. Hemler emphasized that the 10-day time period 15 starts once an establishment receives the remains. 16 The 10 days is not counted from the time of death. 17 Establishments that need to hold a body for more than

18 10 days after its receipt of the human remains should 19 make its request through PALS.

20 Ms. Hemler noted the form is on the Department of 21 State website at www.dos.pa.gov/funeral under general 22 board information and applications and forms.

Ms. Hemler referred to the Funeral Consumers
Alliance and Consumer Federation of America Report for
the Board's information.

Ms. Hemler noted the International Conference of Funeral Service Examining Boards would be holding a conference in Houston in February 2022 and offering a grant to one of their Board members, which would be discussed at the next Board meeting.

6 Chairman Harris thanked Ms. Hemler for all of her 7 help and reminded everyone to type those forms for 8 clarity.

9 Commissioner Johnson echoed sentiments from 10 Chairman Harris, noting that the process was 11 spearheaded by Ms. Hemler and Ms. Black who recognized 12 the need and a concern. He noted it to be a great 13 example of good governance and actions and thanked 14 both of them and Board members for all of their help 15 with the operational implementation.] \* \* \* 16 Legislative Initiatives 17 18 [William G. Harris, Chairman, Professional Member, 19 reminded everyone of the legislation regarding 20 cremation and lowering the temperature of operating a 21 crematory in Pennsylvania. 2.2 Chairman Harris commented that continuing 23 education (CE) is continuing to work well. He 24 mentioned attending the National Funeral Directors 25 Association Convention (NFDA) in Nashville. He noted

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receiving credits after attending an arranger course 1 2 and one on embalming and restorative art.] \* \* \* 3 4 Public Comment 5 [Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, noted attending meetings to observe and make sure the 6 7 counsel office can best serve each individual board. James Erikson, CAE, Assistant Executive Director 8 9 and Chief Operations Officer, Pennsylvania Funeral 10 Directors Association, requested more information 11 regarding the 10-day extension process. 12 Ms. Hemler commented that the process is going 13 smoothly. She noted receiving questions about where 14 to find the form but mostly just keeping track of 15 everything and making sure all of the requests are equally distributed amongst Board members. 16 17 Mr. Erikson requested clarification in terms of 18 the process and whether the applicant is notified by 19 email of their approval. 20 Ms. Hemler stated the establishment would be 21 emailed the approval back, letting them know that the 22 request has been approved and that Board staff will be 23 uploading the request and approval directly to the establishment's file in PALS. 24 25 Jason G. Benion, Saxton & Stump, echoed comments

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from Chairman Harris regarding pending crematory 1 2 legislation that is before the General Assembly. He 3 referred to the relevant bills at House Bill 1464 and Senate Bill 765 for further information and review. 4 5 Chairman Harris mentioned receiving a call 6 concerning how to file a complaint and asked Ms. 7 Hemler to share the process with those attending this 8 meeting. 9 Ms. Hemler explained that the best way for 10 somebody to make a complaint is on the PALS website at 11 www.pals.pa.gov under the file a complaint tab on the 12 home page. She mentioned that every complaint 13 submitted is assigned a complaint number. She noted a 14 1-800 number would also be provided that can be used 15 along with the complaint number to receive an update 16 on the status if someone has not heard anything within 17 two to three weeks.] \* \* \* 18 19 Adjournment 20 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 21 I will make a motion to adjourn the 2.2 meeting. 23 Do we have a second? 24 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 25 Second.
