3 * * * 1 State Board of Funeral Directors 2 3 January 12, 2022 * * * 4 5 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 6 7 with Jaime D. Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on 8 9 the items on today's agenda that are currently pending 10 before the Board and to receive the advice of counsel. 11 The Board entered into public session at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Board of Funeral Directors was held on Wednesday, 14 15 January 12, 2022. William G. Harris, Chairman, Professional Member, called the meeting to order at 16 17 10:30 a.m. * * * 18 19 Roll Call 20 [Chairman Harris requested a roll call of Board 21 members.1 * * * 22 23 Report of Prosecutorial Division 24 [Timothy A. Fritsch, Esquire, Board Prosecution 25 Liaison, presented the Consent Agreement for Case No.

21-48-006706 and Case Nos. 20-48-008633 & 20-48-1 2 008634. 3 Wesley J. Rish, Esquire, Rish Law Office, LLC, counsel for the respondent, was present and 4 5 participated in the discussion regarding Case Nos. 20-48-008633 & 20-48-008634. 6 7 Ms. Kirk asked Mr. Fritsch to describe a typical 8 inspection. Mr. Fritsch explained that inspectors are looking 9 10 for current licenses and display of the license. Нe 11 stated most facility checks are focused on the prep 12 room and following regulations specific to the 13 required equipment and structure, as well as 14 confirming the room is sanitary and airtight with 15 proper ventilation. 16 Mr. Fritsch also noted inspectors review the 17 preneed accounts, records, and forms to make sure they 18 are in compliance with Board requirements.] * * * 19 20 [Glenn P. Masser, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 20-48-009649.] 21 * * * 22 23 Report of Board Counsel 2.4 [Jaime D. Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed 25 everyone that the Board met in Executive Session prior

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to today's meeting for the purpose of conducing quasi-1 2 judicial deliberations on the items on today's 3 agenda.] * * * 4 5 Approval of minutes of the November 23, 2021 meeting 6 MS. BLACK: 7 I believe the Board would entertain a motion to approve as final the November 8 9 23, 2021 Board meeting minutes. 10 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 11 Do we hear a motion? 12 MR. KUKUCHKA: So moved. 13 MR. MCCUSKER: 14 15 Second. 16 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 17 We have a motion and a second. All in 18 favor, signify by saying aye. Any 19 abstentions or recusals? Any opposed? 20 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 21 22 MS. BLACK: 23 I believe the Board would entertain a 24 motion to approve the Consent Agreement and Order at Case No. 21-48-006706. 25

BLACK: 8 Moving on to item 5, I believe the Board would entertain a motion to ratify the 9 10 Additional Employment Request of Samuel 11 Teolis. 12 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: Do we have a motion on number 5? 13 MR. KUKUCHKA: 14 15 So moved. 16 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 17 Do we have a second? MS. KIRK: 18 19 Second. 20 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 21 We have a motion and a second. All in 22 favor, signify by saying aye. Anyone 23 opposed? Any recusals or abstentions? 24 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 25

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Report of Board Counsel - Adjudication and Order 1 2 MS. BLACK: 3 Item 6. I believe the Board would 4 entertain a motion to approve as final 5 the Adjudication and Order for Keene & 6 Carney Funeral Home, Inc., Case No. 20-7 48 - 007624. 8 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 9 Do we have a motion on number 6? MS. RODRIGUEZ: 10 11 I make a motion. 12 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: We have a motion. Do we have a second? 13 14 MS. IMBURGIA: 15 I second. 16 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: We have a motion and a second. All in 17 18 favor, signify by saying aye. Any 19 oppositions, abstentions, or recusals? 20 [The motion carried unanimously.] 21 * * * 22 Requests for Review 23 MS. BLACK: 24 Item 8. I believe the Board would 25 entertain a motion to approve the

Application under Act 41 to Glenn 1 2 Steiner. 3 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: Do we have a motion on number 8? 4 MS. IMBURGIA: 5 6 I make a motion. 7 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 8 We have a motion. Do we have a second 9 on number 8? 10 MS. RODRIGUEZ: 11 Second. 12 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: We have a motion and a second. All in 13 14 favor, signify by saying aye. Anybody 15 opposed? Any abstentions or recusals? 16 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 17 18 Appointment - Prosecution Division Annual Report 19 Presentation 20 [Carolyn A. DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy Chief 21 Counsel, Prosecution Division, provided a summary of 22 the prosecution division's caseload during 2021. 23 Ms. DeLaurentis informed the Board that 157 cases were opened in 2021 for the State Board of Funeral 24 25 Directors and is down from 185 cases in 2020. She

noted closing 186 cases in 2021, which is also down 1 from 2020 at 240. She noted that more cases were 2 3 closed than opened in the calendar year. She reported 4 92 open cases for the Board as of January 1, 2022. Ms. DeLaurentis addressed enforcement actions, 5 6 noting 26 cases that resulted in discipline and 30 7 warning letters in 2021, which is a decrease from 60 8 in 2020. 9 Ms. Kirk requested a copy of the presentation. 10 Ms. DeLaurentis noted the prosecution division opened 1,223 COVID-related cases in 2020 with 15 of 11 12 those cases for the Board. She noted 543 COVIDrelated cases were opened in 2021 with 17 of those for 13 the Board. 14 15 Ms. DeLaurentis reported 18,363 cases were opened 16 in 2021, which is up from 2020 with 13,394. She also 17 reported closing 15,994 files for 2021 and 13,274 in

18 2020.

Ms. DeLaurentis noted the total number of current cases for the office as of January 1, 2022, is 15,141. She mentioned being very proud of the work of the prosecution division and professional compliance office.

24 Ms. Kirk asked whether the 15,141 for 2022 are 25 new or carried over cases.

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Ms. DeLaurentis explained that the 15,141 cases 1 2 that are currently open could be cases from prior 3 years and newer cases and may be cases waiting for 4 adjudication, consent agreements, or investigation.] * * * 5 6 Items for Discussion 7 [Jaime D. Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed the Probable Cause Screening Committee. She stated Board 8 9 Counsel was asked to update the list for each board to 10 ensure it is accurate. She noted that the Board does 11 not have a specific committee but uses officers of the 12 Board for the Probable Cause Screening Committee members. She asked whether the Board wanted to 13 officially designate the officers of the Board to 14 15 serve in that capacity or appoint members to serve on the Probable Cause Screening Committee. 16 17 Ms. Black reminded Board members that the 18 committee addresses cases as they arrive that involves 19 a situation that endangers the public. The Probable 20 Cause Screening Committee members make the 21 determination whether a licensee should continue to 2.2 have their license and act in that capacity while due 23 process occurs of if it rises to the level of needing 24 a temporary suspension on the charges. 25 Ms. Black mentioned that should a case from the

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Probable Cause come before the Board, any individual
or individuals who serve on the Probable Cause
Screening Committee for that case would have to recuse
themselves.

5 Ms. Black stated the PCSC members could be any 6 members of the Board and do not have to be officers. 7 She requested an official designation of members so the information can be provided to prosecution. 8 She 9 cautioned the Board against having too many members on 10 the committee, which could cause quorum issues if the 11 matter comes before the Board. Therefore, Ms. Black 12 suggested limiting the committee to one or two members. 13

14 Ray Michalowski, Esquire, Senior Board 15 Prosecution, noted overseeing several other boards and believed having one member with an alternate member 16 17 would be appropriate for the size of the Board. Нe 18 noted cases could include temporary suspensions or 19 probation violations, and boards use one person plus 20 one alternate to avoid what Ms. Black mentioned regarding recusals and no longer being able to vote or 21 22 participate in the matter.

23 Chairman Harris recommended designating one 24 person and an alternate. Ms. Imburgia volunteered to 25 be a member, and Ms. Rodriguez volunteered to be an

14 1 alternate.] * * * 2 3 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 4 I will make a motion to that effect, 5 Carmella as the designate and Milian as 6 the alternate for the Probable Cause 7 Committee. 8 Do we have a second? 9 MS. KIRK: 10 Second. 11 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 12 We have a motion and a second. All in 13 favor, signify by saying aye. Any 14 opposition, abstentions, or recusals? 15 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 16 Report of Commissioner - No Report 17 * * * 18 19 Report of Board Administrator 20 [Kristel Hennessy Hemler, Board Administrator, 21 informed Board members that the February Board meeting 22 was changed from Thursday, February 17 to Friday, 23 February 18, 2022. 24 Ms. Hemler reminded everyone that all renewal 25 applications have to be submitted before they can be

She noted that a funeral director, who has a 1 renewed. 2 funeral supervisor license, must submit both. She 3 also noted that establishments need to submit their licenses as well as a branch. She mentioned that the 4 5 system will continuously check to confirm all of the applications have been submitted and then be renewed. 6 7 Ms. Hemler addressed a small issue this renewal, where funeral directors think they have to get their 8 9 funeral director license renewed before they submit 10 the next application and is causing a backup. 11 Chairman Harris and Ms. Kirk thanked Ms. Hemler for doing a wonderful job for the Board.] 12 * * * 13 Public Comments 14 15 [Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 16 commented that he audits the Board meeting to see how 17 Board counsel can best serve the Board. Glenn Steiner thanked the Board for their 18 decision, noting he looks forward to being a licensed 19 20 funeral director in Pennsylvania. 21 James Erikson, CAE, Assistant Executive Director 22 and Chief Operations Officer, Pennsylvania Funeral 23 Directors Association, reiterated the compliments to 24 Ms. Hemler for being responsive and helpful to staff 25 at the Pennsylvania Funeral Directors Association

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(PFDA). He also thanked Ms. Black for her assistance
concerning applications.
Jason G. Benion, Esquire, Saxton & Stump,
addressed House Bill 1464 regarding crematory

5 temperature, and is hopeful that there may be action 6 on that during this legislative session. He suggested 7 anyone interested in that bill keep in contact with 8 their members of the General Assembly.

Mr. Michalowski also complimented Mr. Fritsch, 9 10 Ms. Hemler, and Ms. Black for doing a great job. He 11 referred to the presentation by Ms. DeLaurentis 12 concerning COVID cases. He stated the small number of 13 cases and cooperation seen in resolving those during 14 the pandemic has been impressive and complimented the 15 entire industry, as well as the Board, given the 16 tremendous strains put on the industry during COVID.] * * * 17 18 Adjournment 19 CHAIRMAN HARRIS: 20 I make a motion to approve the 21 conclusion of the meeting. 2.2 Do we have a second? 23 MR.
