Recusal Guidelines. She informed Board members that

9 mandatory recusals could include a situation where a

10 member would have have some sort of prosecutorial role

11 | in a matter or direct personal or financial interest

12 in the outcome.

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Ms. Black said that recusal might be strongly suggested recusals when there is a personal affection for someone directly involved in the subject at issue. She noted that merely knowing a person or knowing of a person who is involved in a pending matter was not enough to warrant a recusal. She also noted strongly suggested recusals would include having knowledge from outside of a case that cannot be set aside in order to make a fair and unbiased determination.

Ms. Black noted discretionary recusals could include a Board member not being able to hear and dispose of a case or participate in a decision on a subject fairly and without prejudice.

Ms. Black encouraged Board members to contact her 1 2 directly in advance or at a meeting if they are 3 uncertain whether a recusal is appropriate.] \* \* \* 4 5 Requests for Review MS. - 15 Education Committee and their role.
- 16 Ms. Hemler informed Mr. DuPree that the
- 17 | Continuing Education Committee was formed at the last
- 18 | Board meeting and consists of Ms. Rodriguez, Ms.
- 19 | Imburgia, and Mr. Kukuchka. She explained the
- 20 process, where applications are emailed to the
- 21 providers pa.gov accounts, and the Continuing
- 22 | Education Committee reviews those applications for
- 23 course approval instead of waiting for a Board meeting
- 24 to make those decisions.
- 25 Mr. DuPree asked whether it would be possible to

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have a meeting registration for national associations
that have annual meetings and have a flat rate for
approval as opposed to associations applying for all
of their courses to be approved.
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Mr. DuPree commented that some conventions go over the course of three or four days and may have 10 to 13 courses, and the Pennsylvania Funeral Directors have to figure out which course is approved as opposed to allowing them to have a flat rate and just submit all of the courses. He suggested having the organizations that had been a provider the previous year be able to apply once a year for an event that would be over several days.

Ms. Black stated the Board would likely need a regulatory amendment in order to restructure continuing education (CE) and was a matter the Board could discuss.
