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[Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Prosecutor, addressed departmental restructuring in order to better allocate time and better serve the Boards. He is the Senior Prosecutor and Monty Batson is the Prosecution Liaison for the Massage Therapy Board.

Mr. Picarella introduced Amanda N. Wojciechowski, Andrea L. Costello, and Glenn P. Masser as new Board prosecutors.]

Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, commented on 23 the General Revisions regulation package, noting that 24 the Regulatory Committee recently met and reviewed the 25 proposed revisions. Mr. Davis was hopeful that the

Regulatory Committee would present the package to the Board in April.

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Nina M. Kottcamp, LMT, NCMT, Coordinator,
Harrisburg Area Community College commented that the
Massage & Bodywork Licensing Examination (MBLEx) seems
to have changed somewhat. Specifically, the questions
seem to be increasingly difficult to understand.. She
spoke with Debra Persinger at the American Massage
Therapy Association (AMTA) Convention regarding MBLEx,
who reassured her that the sentences were still at an
eighth-grade reading level with the exception of
anatomy and physiology terms.

Ms. Kottcamp stated a top student contacted her, stating the student utilized four different apps to prepare for the exam and felt that the MBLEx questions were constructed in such a way that none of the apps were applicable.

Ms. Kottcamp noted a MBLEx pass rate of 100% for several years, which was now down to 98%. She commented that her curriculum had not changed and the acceptance level had not changed but the MBLEx had changed. She contacted others in education and noted her concern with a nationwide shift. She commented that the question writers were at an academic doctorate level and could be going beyond where entry-

level massage therapists should test.

Ms. Kottcamp stated the Harrisburg Area Community

College requested a background check prior to

acceptance, because they do not want to take money

from students who will not be accepted. She noted

that there are schools that do not do background

checks, where money is taken from students who cannot

be licensed in the end.]

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10 Report of Board Counsel

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11 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, stated many

12 members on the Board received an email back in January

13 from the Federation of State Massage Therapy Boards

14 (FSMTB) concerning a Subjective, Objective,

15 Assessment, and Plan (SOAP) Note Survey. The Board

16 discussed difficulties during the survey, and

17 | Chairperson Caufman will contact FSMTB to see if other

18 | Boards were experiencing the same issues.

Mr. Davis addressed an issue from November regarding whether or not organizations would be

21 willing to review the international applications. He

22 | contacted the National Certification Board for

23 Therapeutic Massage & Bodywork (NCBTMB), where the

24 service was provided for \$75 and that the applicant

25 | would be charged, not the Board.

Ms. Niner commented that every foreign-educated applicant comes before the Board because there is no regulation.

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Chairperson Caufman commented that the Associated Bodywork & Massage Professionals (ABMP) just acquired thousands of international classes through the Canadian division. She stated many international classes had been vetted through ABMP. She noted that a United States provider can teach internationally because the classes are there, vetted, and able for people to take.

Mr. Davis mentioned FSMTB's Massage Therapy
Licensing Database (MTLD), saying he is still
attempting to have FSMTB answer some additional
questions regarding the project, but he did not yet
receive a reply from Laura Simmons regarding the MLTD
project.

Chairperson Caufman noted the FSMTB Member Board Executive Summit in Cleland, OH, April 18-19, 2019.]
