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2 State Board of Massage Therapy

December 4, 2018

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The regularly scheduled meeting of the State

Board of Massage Therapy was held on Tuesday, December

4, 2018. Becky Caufman, LMT, Chairperson, called the

meeting to order at 9:32 a.m.

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[Chairperson Caufman requested that all cell phones be turned off and audience members register. She also requested the introduction of Board members, staff, and audience members in attendance.]

16 Renewal Demonstration

17 [Katelin Lambert, Deputy Commissioner, Bureau of

18 Professional and Occupational Affairs, addressed the

19 PALS renewal system. She informed the Board that

20 massage therapy renewals were enabled on Friday,

21 November 30, 2018.

Ms. Lambert provided an overview of the renewal

23 process, including a review of email and user ID

24 information. She noted this as the last renewal

25 period wherein notices would be sent through the mail.

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She addressed options for resetting passwords, login assistance, email validation, text alerts, and security.
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Ms. Lambert explained the PALS dashboard, providing the option to renew licenses. She noted that PALS has the ability to accept uploads for a more efficient process, as well as the ability to save the information entered in an application to be resumed at a later time.

Ms. Lambert stated the license would be available on the verification site once renewed, an email would be sent, and a paper license would be received in 10-14 business days.

Ms. Niner reminded the Board that paper applications would no longer be accepted. She suggested utilizing a local library or friend for those who do not have a computer.]

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5 Report of Board Regulatory Counsel

6 [Thomas Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, stated the Fee 7 regulation was published as final.

Mr. Davis addressed the Child Abuse regulation, noting that the State Board of Dentistry was still waiting for their regulation to pass. He commented, once the Dentistry Board's regulation passes, all other Boards will copy and continue with the same language.

Mr. Davis noted General Revisions for review. He mentioned the massage therapist in cosmetology salons, noting an Annex drafted in March 2015 that mostly mirrors the statute.

Chairperson Caufman commented that the inclusion of massage therapy people working in a salon setting became an issue, mostly due to the space requirements and protocols to protect the massage therapists.

Mr. Davis referred to the different sections of PA Code. It had been suggested during the last regulation meeting that fines be increased from \$1,000 to \$2,000 for those who employ unlicensed massage

therapists.

Vice Chair Minzer of the Independent Regulatory
Review Commission (IRRC) suggested that the Board
draft information to educate licensees regarding the
function and process of the Board. The formation of a
working committee to educate licensees and a FAQ
section on the website and informative brochures was
also suggested.

Ms. Niner noted the suggestion to send information to the schools or ask for communication between the schools and the Board was referred to as a communications and outreach workgroup.

Chairperson Caufman noted the difficulty in getting information out to people but recognized information technology (IT) revisions that were not available two years ago. She asked the Regulatory Committee to investigate the practice of Boards in other states on the matter.

Ms. Porambo suggested setting a goal to complete the regulations six months before the renewal period for the next session.]

Chairperson Caufman noted a whole section of the report with questions that were asked by the participating member Boards. She stated other states are considering general revisions and increasing their education hours. She noted initial application fees as high as \$300 to \$400. She stated many of the now require an FBI criminal background check.

Ms. Niner noted that Pennsylvania requires background checks from the current state of residence for each individual. Individuals who have lived in multiple other states can provide an official state-level background check or the official FBI background check.

Chairperson Caufman discussed the push to accept international education and the on-demand webinar.

Chairperson Caufman addressed the CBD oil debate, noting that it is still a Schedule I drug with no real guidelines.

Chairperson Caufman noted FSMTB's continued desire for Member Boards to populate the Federation's Massage Therapy Licensing Database (MTLD) with licensee information.

25 Ms. Corey noted prior discussion with the Board

regarding resolutions and bylaws as Chair of the
Policy Committee. She stated the resolution to create
a model law related to human trafficking passed but
not the amendments regarding the elections of the
Board.

Chairperson Caufman commented that a task force was set up to draft model language to be adopted by the state Boards, which is being completed in reference to the type of statute in each state.

Ms. Corey mentioned that the creation of the model law regarding human trafficking passed, but the numerical versus pass/fail language did not pass. She also believed that the bylaws concerning elections did not pass.

Chairperson Caufman requested that Ms. Niner attend the Executive Summit in April.

Mr. Davis discussed methods utilized by other Boards with regard to the prosecution of licensees, stating that in many other states, the Board decides whether or not charges should be brought and whether the charges were founded. He noted the Supreme Court decision, Lyness v. State Board of Medicine, 529 Pa. 535 from 1992.

Mr. Davis discussed that in 2009 the Texas legislature enacted new provisions to allow a person

to find out before applying whether he or she would likely be denied a license and found that this was part of the statute.

Mr. Davis noted a brief discussion related to requiring massage therapy students to utilize a time clock while at school.

Laura B. Embleton, Government Relations Director, Associated Bodywork & Massage Professionals, who also attended FSMTB, stated the Model Practice Act is an establishment licensing act and did not support human trafficking being included in the practice act. Ms. Embleton addressed barriers to professions, stating that the decrease in CEs was a pushback on the regulation.

Ms. Porambo questioned whether the overall 67.8 percent pass rate of the MBLEx was addressed with respect to the low percentage. It was noted as a national grade exam with the purpose of assuring the professions have good knowledge.

Chairperson Caufman noted that FSMTB has worked to accommodate people with issues.]
