Ms. Meyers noted that 21 22 the keys to effective communications are fairness, transparency and knowledge of rights, laws and 23 24 regulations. 25 * * *

[Becky Lesik, LMT, discussed the executive director summit for board administrators, which features training to help administrators to spot fraud. She noted that she received positive feedback from executive director summit participants. She discussed the Federation Authentic Information Review (FAIR) task force and the tools developed to identify application fraud and best practices for dealing with fraud.

Ms. Lesik discussed her role as the chair of the licensing renewal committee at FSMTB. She cited statistics from a survey of 3,845 licensed massage therapists.

She noted an average of 673 hours of initial training. There are more than 300 massage therapy schools and programs in the US accredited by a national accrediting body.

Ms. Lesik noted important topics such as risk management, relevant risks and regulatory reform. She stated FSMTB commended boards that had massage therapists sitting on their boards and recommended having a licensed massage therapist or subject matter expert at hearings before a hearing examiner.]
