He commended Deputy Policy Director Mark Farrell, one of the architects or designers of the administrative and regulatory waivers, which allowed Pennsylvania to bring licensed professionals to the forefront.

Board Chair Loiselle also commended and thanked Counsel and staff for keeping the backlog to an absolute minimum to allow many practitioners available and licensed appropriately to provide services. He thanked Acting Commissioner Johnson for answering all of the Board's questions.]

[Mark B. Woodland, M.D., thanked the DOH and Secretary

of Health Dr. Levine for an example of how to lead

during a crisis.

He thanked the Governor for recognizing the victims of COVID-19 by ordering all flags at half staff. Dr. Woodland thanked first responders, midwives, and those who are working long hours and putting themselves directly in the front lines during this emergency.

There was discussion regarding maternal and child health in Pennsylvania, including the future of telehealth, protective equipment, vertical and antibody transmission, and the way personal protective equipment (PPE) has changed due to the crisis.

Ms. Howard mentioned a new method to clean the N-95, which she noted Ohio had already implemented. Dr. Woodland noted a reprocessing program for the N-95 mask was already in place and future masks were being made with pouches for reusable filters that may change the look of the mask.

As it concerns graduate medical education, Dr. Woodland noted the largest match ever in the United States with 5,048 programs offered, 34,256 positions, up from 32,194 in 2019 and 30,232 positions in 2018.

Dr. Woodland noted this COVID crisis had derailed medical education over the last two months and probably through the end of the year. There was further discussion regarding the matter.

There was further discussion on the process to make N-95 masks reusable. Ms. Howard indicated that most N-95 masks can be reused 20 times.]
