3 * * * 1 2 State Board of Medicine 3 May 21, 2019 * * * 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Board of Medicine was held on Tuesday, May 21, 2019. 6 7 Keith E. Loiselle, Chairman, Public Member, called the 8 meeting to order at 9:01 a.m. * * * 9 10 Acknowledge Public - Turn Off Electronic Devices 11 [Chairman Loiselle requested that all electronic 12 devices be turned off. He also requested the introduction of audience members.] 13 * * * 14 15 Approval of minutes of the April 16, 2019 meeting 16 CHAIRMAN LOISELLE: 17 May I ask for a motion to approve the 18 minutes from the previous meeting? 19 DR. LEVINE: 20 So moved. 21 CHAIRMAN LOISELLE: 22 Dr. Levine moves. 23 MR. JOHNSON: 24 Second. 25 CHAIRMAN LOISELLE:

4 Acting Commissioner Johnson seconds. 1 2 All in favor of approval of the minutes, 3 say aye. Are there any opposed? 4 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 5 6 [Chairman Loiselle requested a roll call be taken.] * * * 7 8 [Chairman Loiselle welcomed Dr. Levine to the meeting 9 and thanked her for the savings to the state by being 10 both the Pennsylvania Secretary of Health and 11 Physician General.] * * * 12 13 Report of Prosecution Division 14 [Jason T. Anderson, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, 15 presented the Consent Agreements for File No. 16-49-10050 and File Nos. 18-49-001325, 17-49-12304, 16-49-16 13251, and 16-49-09782.] 17 * * * 18 19 [Anita P. Shekletski, Esquire, Board Prosecution 20 Liaison, addressed the Office of General Counsel's 21 (OGC) Mediation Program. She explained the format of 22 a mediation. She commented that OGC attorneys have 23 gone through mediator training and provide the service 24 at no cost to either party. 25 Ms. Shekletski noted that either party can ask

for mediation or refuse it. She referred to Lyness as 1 2 being a reason why it has not been used frequently in 3 Pennsylvania. She stated it is confidential and a phrase would be in the consent agreement that the case 4 5 has gone to mediation. 6 Chairman Loiselle commented that mediation works 7 when the respondent or respondent's counsel and the Board and/or counsel cannot come together, noting it 8 9 to be another option. 10 Chairman Loiselle questioned whether mediation was reportable to the National Practitioner Data Bank. 11 12 Ms. Shekletski explained that every discipline is 13 reported to the data bank except for cost and VRP 14 agreements.] * * * 15 16 [Anita P. Loiselle, Chairman, Public Member, commended 7 Acting Commissioner Johnson and the Department of 8 Health for taking definitive action to issues 9 presented to the Board by various stakeholders and 10 licensee groups. 11 Chairman Loiselle mentioned his goal as Chair of 12 the Board is to have a more direct link between the 13 members of the Board, the ideals of the Board, and the legislature. He noted other states that have regular 14 15 meetings with the legislative committees, whether 16 senate or representative committees for health care in 17 their states. He commented that heading off issues 18 before they become problematic will save a lot of time 19 and headache and will benefit the citizens of 20 Pennsylvania.] 21 * * * 22 Report of Committee on Licensure Qualifications - No 23 Report * * * 24 25 Report of Board Vice Chairman - No Report

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* * * 1 2 Report of Department of Health 3 [Rachel Levine, M.D., Physician General/Secretary of 4 Health, stated Pennsylvania is operating under a 5 disaster declaration that Governor Wolf issued in 6 January 2018, noting the sixth iteration of the 90-day 7 disaster declarations. She addressed prevention, rescue with naloxone, and treatment. She discussed 8 opioid stewardship and announced a 25% decreased in 9 10 opioid prescriptions in less than three years. 11 Dr. Levine addressed patients with severe acute and chronic pain who need opioids and noted an 12 advocacy program starting in 2019, where patients who 13 14 feel they are being unfairly treated or abandoned by a 15 physician can call to be provided with the appropriate 16 care. 17 Dr. Levine noted success with the medication 18 naloxone to reverses opioids with about 20,000 19 emergencies medical service (EMS) saves in 15 months 20 and over 10,000 police saves in the last 4 years. She 21 mentioned a naloxone distribution day, where the 22 public could obtain naloxone from our community health 23 centers. She addressed the importance of getting 24 people into treatment, including an active warm 25 handoff program and expanded treatment, particularly

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1 access to evidence-based quality medication-assisted
2 treatment for opioid use disorder.

Dr. Levine noted progress in 2018 with a decrease 3 4 in overdose deaths. She mentioned the need to adjust 5 to the changing landscape, as was in the news from the 6 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) a 7 number of weeks ago. She commented that there was an 8 increase in the number of stimulants, such as 9 methamphetamine and cocaine, coming into Pennsylvania 10 and deaths from methamphetamine and cocaine that is 11 laced with fentanyl.

12 Dr. Levine addressed an outbreak of hepatitis A 13 in Pennsylvania, particularly among specific 14 demographic groups. She stated hepatitis C and HIV 15 was a concern and will be asking the legislature to 16 change the rules in terms of The Controlled 17 Substances, Drugs, Device, and Cosmetic Act for traditional harm reduction. She stated she will be 18 19 working with legislature regarding traditional harm 20 reduction, which is a syringe service program 21 supported by the Trump Administration, Health and 2.2 Human Services, and the CDC.

Dr. Levine addressed the medical marijuana program, which is under the regulation of the Department of Health. 9

Dr. Levine mentioned a new program called the Rural Health Initiative to save rural hospitals that are under significant financial stress.

Dr. Valigorsky commented that he has a pain practice and receives a number of patients from primary care physicians who no longer want to write prescriptions for their narcotics.

8 Dr. Levine addressed patients with acute and 9 chronic pain who require opioids and patients with 10 pain who could receive biofeedback, acupuncture, or 11 various combinations of treatments. She stated 12 patients who are abandoned and cannot get pain 13 medicine may go to the black market. She suggested 14 weaning patients.

Dr. Levine commented to be very careful not to co-prescribe medicines such as benzodiazepines and the importance of co-prescribing naloxone so families have naloxone at home in case of an overdose. She stated some primary care physicians do not feel they have the expertise and will make a referral.

21 Chairman Loiselle agreed that there is a place 22 for opioids when used appropriately. He mentioned a 23 conversation he had with Dr. Valigorsky regarding 24 physicians becoming gun-shy when prescribing to 25 patients who should be receiving opioids.

Chairman Loiselle referred to a letter that 1 2 Carolyn Byrnes from the Department of Health provided 3 concerning patient advocacy. He suggested adjusting 4 the wording to note that there are other ways to 5 accomplish the goal without having patients see other doctors. 6 7 Chairman Loiselle thanked Dr. Levine for the update and insightful words.] 8 9 * * * 10 [Kalonji Johnson, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of 11 Professional and Occupational Affairs, exited the 12 meeting at 9:53 a.m.] * * * 13 14 Report of Board/Regulatory Counsel 15 [Peter D.
