Pennsylvania State Board of Medicine Adopts USMLE (United States Medical Licensing Examination) Policy Regarding Maximum Limit of Four Attempts at a USMLE Step or its Component

At its meeting on March 21, 2013, the State Board of Medicine adopted the current USMLE policy of placing a limit on the total number of times an examinee can take an individual Step or Step Component (i.e., Step 1, Step 2 CK, Step 2 CS or Step 3). Effective January 1, 2013, examinees became ineligible to take a Step or Step Component if they have six or more prior attempts on that Step or Step Component, including incomplete attempts.

At its meeting on September 2, 2020, the State Board of Medicine adopted an updated USMLE policy. <u>Effective January 1, 2021</u>, examinees will become ineligible to take a Step or Step Component if they have <u>four or more prior attempts</u> on <u>that Step or Step Component</u>, including incomplete attempts.
