Kristin Malady, BSN, RN, 10 11 Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:12 a.m. \* \* \* 12 Roll Call 13 14 [A roll call of Board members was taken by Chair 15 Malady.] \* \* \* 16 17 Introduction of Board Counsel 18 [Carole Clarke Smith, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 19 introduced members of Board Counsel.] \* \* \* 20 21 Introduction of Board Prosecution 22 [William A. Newport, Esquire, Acting Senior Prosecutor 23 in Charge, identified members of Prosecution.] \* \* \* 24 25 Introduction of Board Staff

[Wendy Miller, MSN, RN, Executive Secretary, 1 2 introduced Board staff.] \* \* \* 3 Introduction of Audience Members 4 5 [Kristin Malady, BSN, RN, Chair, thanked Theodore "Ted" Stauffer for managing the virtual meetings. 6 She 7 requested Mr. Stauffer introduce the audience members 8 and asked them to email Board Administrator Cindy 9 Miller directly regarding their attendance at the 10 meeting.] \* \* \* 11 12 [Theodore Stauffer, Executive Secretary, Bureau of 13 Professional and Occupational Affairs, noted the 14 meeting was being recorded and those who continued to 15 participate were consenting to be recorded.] \* \* \* 16 17 Adoption of the Agenda CHAIR MALADY: 18 19 Looking at today's agenda, are there any 20 changes to the Agenda? Hearing none, do 21 I have a motion to adopt the Agenda for 22 today's meeting? 23 DR. KMETZ: 24 So moved. 25 DR. COUGHLIN:

Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of 14 Professional and Occupational Affairs, addressed a 15 conference call that he, Wendy Miller, and others from the Department of State participated in with some of 16 17 the Board's stakeholders, including the Pennsylvania 18 State Nurses Association (PSNA) and Pennsylvania 19 Association of Nurse Anesthetists (PANA), in reference 20 to a letter drafted by PSNA regarding concerns, among 21 other matters, with processing and customer support 2.2 within the Bureau. 23 Commissioner Johnson apologized to the Board, 24 public, stakeholders, and licensees for the lack of 25 customer phone support by the Bureau in terms of

critical questions being answered. He noted the work 1 2 of the Bureau staff and Board of Nursing. He will 3 work on improving the relationship with all. Нe commented that every member of the organization worked 4 5 to their limit over the past 12 months and continue to 6 be committed to ensure that every single qualified 7 applicant receives their license. Chair Malady noted her appreciation of 8 9 stakeholders coming forward and meeting. She believed all were working to the best of their ability.] 10 \* \* \* 11 Report of Prosecutorial Division 12 13 [Chair Malady noted VRP Consent Agreement Items 2 14 through 20. She requested Ms. Evancho check to make 15 sure item no. 5 has mental health language.] \* \* \* 16 17 [Chair Malady noted Ms. Boyd's cases 21 through 24.] \* \* \* 18 19 [Chair Malady noted Ms. Evancho's cases 25 and 26.] \* \* \* 20 21 [Chair Malady noted Ms. Guilfoyle's cases 27 through 2.2 30.1 23 \* \* \* 24 [Chair Malady noted Mr. Schertz's cases 31 and 32.] \* \* \* 25

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[Chair Malady noted Mr. Sniscak's cases 33 and 34.] 1 \* \* \* 2 3 [Chair Malady noted Ms. Tucker's cases 35 through 37.] \* \* \* 4 5 [T'rese Evancho, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, informed the Board that Prosecution partnered with the 6 7 Dauphin County Victim/Witness Assistance Program that 8 provides advocacy to victims of crime through the 9 criminal justice system. It is a one-year pilot 10 program that will provide advocacy support to victims and witnesses throughout the prosecution process.] 11 \* \* \* 12 13 Regulation Update 14 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel, 15 noted the Nursing Education Programs regulation was initially reviewed by the Regulatory Counsel and she 16 17 is adding information to the Preamble to help those 18 who are not familiar with the Nursing Education 19 Programs regulation. She will update the Board on any 20 additional changes at the April meeting. 21 Ms. Pachter Schulder informed the Board that the 22 regulations approved by the Board at the last meeting 23 concerning Licensure by Endorsement under Act 41 will 24 be referred to Regulatory Counsel. 25 Ms. Pachter Schuler noted the Opioid and Organ

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Donation regulations may be capable of being written together in one package regarding Continuing Education. She noted the Board of Medicine and the Board of Osteopathic Medicine will also adopt the regulation which will be similar to the Board of Nursing.

7 Ms. Pachter Schulder stated the Volunteer License 8 regulations were being drafted as a package for all 9 the Boards so that all the regulations look the same. 10 Ms. Pachter Schulder informed the Board that the 11 Child Abuse regulation was delivered to the 12 Legislative Committees and the Independent Regulatory 13 Review Commission. She noted receiving no public 14 comments after being published in the Pennsylvania 15 Bulletin. She stated the regulation was not ready for adoption as a final-form regulation but anticipated it 16 17 will be before the Board at its next meeting.] \* \* \* 18 19 Legislative Update - Legislation Affecting 20 Nurses/Nursing [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel, 21 22 referred to Senate Bill 25 regarding Advanced Practice 23 Registered Nurse (APRN) licensure for Certified 24 Registered Nurse Practitioners (CRNPs), noting it was 25 introduced since the Board's last meeting.]

\* \* \* 1 2 Report of Board Chairperson 3 [Kristin Malady, BSN, RN, Chair, addressed her virtual attendance at the 2021 National Council of State 4 5 Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Midyear Meeting March 9-11, 6 2021. She stated the first day focused on bias. She 7 addressed the second day focusing on NCSBN Model Act and Rules where new language was proposed to be 8 presented prior to the Annual Meeting so 9 10 representatives from the Board could vote on the 11 proposed language. 12 Chair Malady noted discussion regarding the Next Generation NCLEX® (NGN), noting the launch is 13 projected for April 2023. She mentioned conversations 14 15 concerning what the boards across the country faced 16 during the pandemic. She also mentioned much talk 17 about how the Nursing Compact was essential in moving 18 nurses across states and was a lifesaver for many of 19 them. 20 Chair Malady encouraged Board members who were not in attendance to visit NCSBN's website and view 21 22 those presentations.] 23 \* \* \* 24 Appointment - Nurse Board FY 2020-2021 Budget Review 25 [Kimberly S. Adams, Chief of Fiscal Management, Bureau

of Finance and Operations, Department of State, 1 2 addressed licensee population from a revenue 3 standpoint. She noted a licensee population in 2016 4 at 296,018, increasing by over 14,000 in 2018 to 5 310,394, and another increase of over 6,000 to 316,604 6 in 2020. She provided a recent update reflecting an 7 increase of 1,014 licensees, giving a current licensee 8 population count of 317,618.

9 Ms. Adams noted revenue by source. She reviewed 10 categories and actual revenue for FY 2018-2019 and FY 11 2019-2020, noting the biennial total. She noted 93.3% 12 of revenue was coming from renewals and applications.

13 Ms. Adams provided a categorical breakdown of expenses for FY 2018-2019 and FY 2019-2020 with the 14 15 current budget for FY 2020-2021 and expenses as of February 26, 2021. She noted the current expenses. 16 17 She informed the Board that their budget was adequate. 18 Ms. Adams reviewed revenues and expenses for FY 19 2020-2021, noting the budget figure. She explained 20 that the application and renewal fees were bringing 21 the Board out of the deficit, estimating the Board 22 should be back in the black in FY 2023-2024.

Ms. Adams reviewed Board Member Expenses, noting the current expenses and the current budget for FY 25 2020-2021. She noted current expenses as of February

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26, 2021, noting the budget figure will be carried 1 2 over to FY 2021-2022. She stated any excess money not 3 used will remain in the restricted account for the 4 Board's use. Noah Logan of PSNA requested that the 5 6 presentation be posted on the website. Chair Malady 7 informed Mr. Logan that the Board will check with the Commissioner's Office as to whether the report could 8 9 be made available on the website.] \* \* \* 10 11 Pennsylvania Nurse Peer Assistance Program (PNAP) 12 Annual Report 13 [Joann Megon, RN, Executive Director, Pennsylvania 14 Nurse Peer Assistance Program (PNAP), provided a 15 summary of PNAP's mission, including support for nurses and nursing students experiencing addiction and 16 alcoholism and those with significant mental health 17 disorders. 18 19 Ms. Megon noted a decrease in referrals from 20 PNAP, PHMP, and other resources in 2020. She noted 21 290 inquires, 18 refused intake, 52 refused 22 evaluation, and 40 diagnosed, refused enrollment. 23 For 2020, Ms. Megon noted 233 enrollments for 24 monitoring, 990 monitored, 202 successful completions, 25 61 closed non-compliant, 286 with DUI charges only,

and 75 with other drug or alcohol related charges. 1 2 Ms. Megon provided an overview of referrals by 3 discipline since 2009 with a total of 12,510. 4 Ms. Megon stated 4 of the 233 new enrollees to 5 monitoring in 2020 were diagnosed with a primary 6 mental health disorder, and 229 were diagnosed with a 7 primary substance use disorder. Ms. Megon reported 85 relapses while under the 8 9 monitoring contract, which, at 8.6%, is good 10 considering the national average at 11.9%. She stated 11 27 nurses who relapsed had returned to practice, and 12 none of the relapses were work related. Ms. Megon stated 110 nurses violated while under 13 14 contract and continued monitoring with PNAP, and 62 15 violated their contract and refused to continue 16 monitoring with PNAP. There was a total of 172 violations, with a violation rate of 17.3% in 2020. 17 18 Ms. Megon reported 202 successfully completed their contract, and 17 were referred to PNAP after 19 20 prior successful completion. The rate of recidivism 21 for 2020 was 8.4%. 2.2 Ms. Megon noted 674 nurses were being monitored 23 with an active license, 539 (80%) were granted 2.4 permission to return to practice, and 414 (61.4%) have 25 returned to practice.

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Ms. Megon addressed advocacy by PNAP in 2020, reporting that PNAP provided testimony to the Board of Nursing in 2 mitigation and Order to Show Cause hearings, 19 PNAP enrollees had their licenses reinstated, and PNAP Case Managers provided advocacy in 28 criminal matters.

Ms. Megon noted PNAP provided 6 continuing education presentations to health care facilities, nursing schools, and nursing organizations, 12 marketing/performance improvement presentations to treatment facilities, and 4 outreach presentations at

12 health care professional groups with enrollees.

Ms. Megon addressed PNAP staff, noting 7 offices throughout the state, with the home office located in Trafford, PA.

16 Ms. Megon announced PNAP started a financial 17 assistance program January 1, 2021. She stated PNAP 18 loses many nurses to the program due to their 19 inability to pay for drug screens. She noted PNAP has 20 funds available. Participants can apply for 21 assistance paying for their screening. She described 22 the program as a three-month program that allows 23 nurses time to be approved to return to work so long 24 as the nurse gets advocacy from their case manager and 25 is dedicated to recovery.

1 Chair Malady commended PNAP for clearly being a 2 successful program. She commented that the Board is 3 committed to supporting licensees with these issues in 4 order to keep them working. She mentioned that some 5 states at the recent NCSBN Midyear Meeting noted an 6 increase in relapses, and she questioned why PNAP did 7 not see an increase.

8 Ms. Megon explained that the stats were all from 9 2020 and the number of relapses definitely increased 10 from January 1, 2021, noting having to catch up with 11 stats missed last year.

Ms. Megon addressed a question from Betsy Snook from PSNA regarding whether there would be a budget presentation from PNAP. Ms. Megon will contact the PNAP Board of Directors and provide such information to the Board.]

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18 [T'rese Evancho, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, referred to prior Board discussion concerning item no. 19 20 5 on the agenda, requesting to remove the agenda item 21 from discussion at this meeting to ensure the language 22 is accurate and the Respondent is not at a 23 She suggested placing it back on the disadvantage. 24 agenda for the Board's next meeting and making it 25 retroactive to this meeting since it was an error by

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18 1 Prosecution.] \* \* \* 2 3 Report of Committees - Probable Cause Screening 4 Committee 5 [Sue E. Hertzler, LPN, reported the Probable Cause 6 Screening Committee moved on 11 Petitions for 7 Appropriate Relief, 20 Petitions for Mental/Physical 8 Examination, and 1 Immediate Temporary Suspension 9 conducted on March 11, 2021.] 10 \* \* \* 11 Application Review Committee 12 [Kristin Malady, BSN, RN, Chair, reported the 13 Application Review Committee met several times with 14 Board Counsel and reviewed applications to be sent 15 through the process.] \* \* \* 16 17 Advanced Practice - Education, Regulation, & 18 Application Committee [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel, 19 20 noted being hopeful that the Board would receive 21 updates from the stakeholders at the April meeting 22 regarding their legislative efforts affecting 23 nursing.] 24 \* \* \* 25 Advanced Practice and RN/PN Practice, Education,

& Regulation Committee 1 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel, 2 3 addressed Act 116 of 2020 regarding carryover of 4 continuing education, noting it to be an amendment to 5 Act 48, which was codified in what is referred to as 6 Act 53 regarding the Commissioner's powers and ability 7 to write a regulation that permits carryover. She stated § 21.131(f) of the regulation prohibits 8 carryover, noting the Board previously decided it did 9 10 not desire carryover. She questioned whether the 11 Board desired to amend § 21.131(f) and permit 12 carryover, or if they still wish to keep the 13 regulation as it is. The Board decided to retain 14 § 21.131(f) as promulgated.] \* \* \* 15 16 Dietitian-Nutritionist Committee 17 [Kessey J. Kieselhorst, MPA, RD, LDN, CPHQ, noted 18 acting on one application.] \* \* \* 19 20 IT & Communication Issues Committee 21 [Kristin Malady, BSN, RN, Chair, noted being unaware of updated information on a new electronic agenda.] 22 23 \* \* \* 24 Report of Board Members Who Attended a Meeting on 25 Behalf of the Board

[Linda L. Kmetz, PhD, RN, addressed the discussion at 1 2 NCSBN Midyear Meeting regarding other states' 3 challenges during the pandemic, stating it was clear 4 that the Pearson Vue Testing Center closure in many 5 states had an impact on the ability for graduates to 6 test. She commented that initial licensure during the 7 pandemic was a real hardship for many. Dr. Coughlin highly recommended everyone view the 8 9 presentations and applauded all for working and being creative with extending dates and finding ways to keep 10 11 individuals employed.] \* \* \* 12 13 Report of Executive Secretary 14 [Wendy Miller, MSN, RN, Executive Secretary, noted the 15 April 30, 2021 Registered Nurse renewal had opened and was going smoothly. She reported 35% of Registered 16 17 Nurses, 38% of Certified Registered Nurse 18 Practitioners, and 41% of Clinical Nurse Specialists 19 had renewed. 20 Ms. Miller welcomed Dr. Sue Petula back to assist the Board as a Nursing Education Advisor annuitant. 21 2.2 Ms. Miller announced reactivation applications, 23 except for COVID reactivations covered by the 24 Governor's waiver, were online in PALS. Paper 25 reactivation applications were no longer being

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accepted. She noted the prescriptive authority 1 2 applications and change forms went online in PALS at 3 the end of September and were going well. She 4 addressed change forms, noting there was back data 5 from older prescriptive authority applications the 6 staff had to complete before changes could be 7 submitted. She mentioned a problem with the display when printed, but those issues were being resolved. 8

9 Ms. Miller anticipated the paper applications 10 would soon be removed from the website and 11 transitioned to all online. She stated there would 12 soon be an announcement on the website prior to those 13 forms being removed from the website with simple 14 directions as well.

15 Ms. Miller also addressed the 2021 National 16 Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) Midyear 17 Meeting, noting the Next Generation NCLEX® is 18 anticipated for release for RNs in April 2023 but 19 slightly behind the Practical Nurses. She encouraged 20 signup on the NCSBN website to receive a Next 21 Generation NCLEX® Newsletter for up-to-date 2.2 information.

Ms. Miller addressed test site availability,
where temporary test centers were opened to relieve
the burden. She reported the number of first-time

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test takers nationally had been consistent and 1 2 actually above last year. She encouraged students to widen out the search territory of the test sites if 3 4 they are not getting a test time that is suitable and 5 check back on occasion.
