She explained how the practice of nutrition, in particular medical nutrition therapy, has evolved over the past 20 years. Ms. Rowe noted one reason to get the Bill enacted is to prevent unqualified individuals from calling themselves nutritionists. She noted the difference between a dietitian and nutritionist is that the licensed dietitian nutritionist ensures quality of care.

Ms. Rowe was concerned that most people would be misled and would obtain treatment from those not qualified to give that treatment or even that treatment would be delayed. She explained that two professions currently fall under the licensed dietitian nutritionist title — registered dietitians and certified nutrition specialists. She noted that the words "treat" and "diagnose" would be added to the scope of practice for LDNs. Some older definitions were also updated.

She discussed the inclusion of the Diplomates of the American Clinical Board of Nutrition, who are primarily chiropractors with advanced level training in nutrition. Ms. Rowe noted additional updates

1 including a seat on the Board of Nursing. There was
