She referred members to § 9124(e) and discussed the requirement that convictions be directly related to the duties, functions and responsibilities of the practice unless the applicant poses an unacceptable risk to the people with whom the applicant would interact based upon an individualized assessment. The applicant/licensee with such a conviction must show rehabilitation under an eight factor test. Under (e)(9), the Boards will be required to write 14 regulations that would identify what crimes the Board has determined are directly related to the duty, function and responsibilities of the practice of the profession. There was further discussion regarding the matter.

In addition, the Bill requires the Board to issue preliminary decisions about whether an offense is directly related to the practice.

Ms. Pachter Schulder discussed Senate Bill 857 regarding telemedicine; House Bill 79 regarding lead testing; House Bill 1975 regarding seizure recognition for school nurses; and House Bills 1923 and 1924,

With regard to a possible conflict with Department of Health regulations or CRNP scope of practice or education, she noted that she has talked to the DOH and that these activities are within the scope and competencies of prescriptive authority and DEA prescribing for CRNPs.

With regard to the question about whether the CRNP who orders the conscious sedation must be being present in the room when it is administered, Ms.

Battista said that she found nothing, upon review of regulations for healthcare facilities, including 28 PA Code § 109.61, that states "medication or treatment shall administered only upon written or signed orders of a practitioner and in accordance with the provisions of § 107.61 to § 107.65," relating to

1 medical orders, which would require a change to the
2 Statement of Policy. Ms. Battista noted the reference
3 to "practitioner."

Dr. Caruso discussed how the proposed change aligns with CRNP scope of practice. She noted no conflict and the prescriptive authority of CRNPs.]

The Board discussed whether a set number of program director changes within a year should be included within (a). It was noted this suggestion was covered under (b)(2) of the regulation.

Jan Collier, MSN, RN, CNE, Nurse Administrator and Financial Aid Administrator, Franklin County Practical Nursing Program/PAPNA, questioned the ability of a program to determine the equivalency of math courses.

Ms. Pachter Schulder opined that the program has the ability to do so. She also provided options for determining the need for remediation including that mentioned during the L&I presentation and the nursing

1 education program's assessment of need and
2 remediation.

Ms. Hertzler reiterated the need to obtain the math competency to be successful in the program and to provide safe administration of medication. Dr. Petula also noted an increase in the number of test takers for Pennsylvania. Pennsylvania currently has 139 approved programs - 85 RN programs and 54 PN programs. Additional programs have submitted proposals to come before the Board. She noted the 55 satellite sites.

Dr. Petula noted of the 139 programs, 17 programs are on provisional status - 5 RN programs and 12 PN programs. Pennsylvania exceeds the United States average of pass rates for RN and PN programs. She next referred to charts of PA pass rates for RN and PN programs per year over the last ten years for comparison.

Dr. Petula discussed a Report 6, noting the number and percent passing of first-time candidates educated in NRB jurisdictions by degree type. She noted 30 percent of test takers in Pennsylvania were from Associate programs, 57 percent from Baccalaureate programs, and 12 percent from Diploma programs. She also noted the percentage of test takers from the different degree type programs across the United States. She acknowledged Pennsylvania's excellent performance on the examinations and the growth for RNs.

Dr. Petula also referred to data from 2014-2015 through 2018-2019 with regard to NCLEX® performance. She noted the first time pass rate threshold of 80 percent in PA.

Ms. Pachter Schulder noted the importance of this information in relation to RN/PN Committee and a letter from Dr. Danielle Giuliano. Dr. Giuliano requested that the Board change the minimum pass rate from all first-time test takers to only those taking the test in the first six months. Dr. Giuliano pointed to Ohio's standard.
