Probable Cause Committee 1 [Suzanne Hendricks, BSBH, RN, LPN, reported that the 2 Probable Cause Committee moved on the following items: 3 17 Petitions for Appropriate Relief and 34 Petitions 4 5 for Mental and Physical Examination. She stated the 6 committee met via telephone on November 16, 2018, and 7 moved on one Petition for Immediate Temporary 8 Suspension.] 9 * * * 10 Application Review Committee 11 [Ann Michele Coughlin, MBA, MSN, RN, Vice Chair, 12 stated the Application Review Committee did meet and 13 reviewed applications.] * * * 14 15 Advanced Practice Committee 16 [John M. O'Donnell, DrPH, RN, CRNA, MSN, discussed 17 being contacted by licensees as a Board member 18 questioning the processing time to make changes to 19 CRNP certification and for receipt of NCLEX results 20 for licensure applicants. 21 Ms. Keiser explained that the Commissioner 22 discussed at an earlier Board meeting, with the 23 stabilization of PALS, BPOA experienced an increase in 24 application processing timeframes. The Commissioner 25 provided the Board office with additional staff

including temporary staff and overtime to assist in 1 2 improving the application processing timeframes. 3 Processing timeframes have improved. With regard to 4 NCLEX results, currently the staff implement a manual 5 process to issue a license when an applicant passes 6 the licensure exam. In the future, the process will 7 be automated in PALS and that will also improve 8 processing times. Ms. Keiser commented that criminal 9 history record check requirement may also impact 10 application processing timeframes because applicants 11 may not always provide the correct background checks 12 so that staff can issue the license. Ms. Keiser 13 offered to review any specific inquiries related to 14 delays in application processing. She introduced Kori 15 Linn, Administrative Officer, who will be assisting 16 Ms. Miller with Board-related matters as well as 17 supervising the endorsement and examination areas.] * * * 18 19 RN/PN Practice, Education and Regulation 20 [Meeting would be held at later in the day.] 21 * * * 2.2 Dietitian-Nutritionist - No Report 23 * * * 2.4 IT & Communication Issues 25 [Suzanne Hendricks, BSBH, RN, LPN, stated that eight

2 NCLEX Pass Rate Trends

3 [Sue Petula, Ph.D., MSN, RN, NEA-BC, FRE, Nursing 4 Education Advisor, referred to several documents 5 related to Pennsylvania NCLEX Pass Rate Trends and 6 upcoming changes to the Test Plan, Item 110, for 7 discussion.

Dr. Petula stated 14 of the 55 practical nursing 8 9 education programs in Pennsylvania are on provisional 10 status. Last year there were 12 programs on 11 provisional status. Pennsylvania ranks sixth in terms of the number of practical nurse candidates that 12 13 tested nationally. In terms of registered nurse 14 programs, there were 25 associate degree programs, 41 15 BSN programs, and 16 hospital-based diploma programs. 16 Pennsylvania ranks fifth in terms of the number of 17 registered nurse candidates that tested nationally. 18 Three RN programs are on provisional status dropping 19 from 6 RN programs in the prior examination year. The 20 aggregate PA RN Pass rate was 92.84 percent with 21 Pennsylvania ranking fourth in comparison to other 2.2 states.

Dr. Petula noted that site visits from the Advisors and The Bureau of Enforcement and Investigation, the Director Education Program,

regulatory outreach to the nursing education 1 2 associations, and quarterly NCLEX reports to all 3 programs are means by which Programs can improve NCLEX 4 performance. She also discussed a gap analysis that 5 can be obtained via a program subscription to Mountain 6 Measurement, Inc.-NCLEX Program Reports that review 7 the strengths and weaknesses of each student tested in 8 the various curriculum areas.] * * * 9 10 Appointment - Request for Extension of Provisional 11 Status - Hazleton Area Career Center - Year 5 12 [Appointment was rescheduled to the January 2019 Board 13 meeting.] * * * 14 15 [The Board recessed from 9:55 a.m. until 10:03 a.m.] * * * 16 [Linda L. Kmetz, Ph.D., R.N., Chairperson, exited the 17 18 meeting at 10:03 a.m. for recusal purposes.] * * * 19 20 Appointment - Request for Extension of Provisional 21 Status - Lincoln University Bachelor's of Science 22 in Nursing (BSN) Program 23 [Sharvette Law Philmon, MSN, RN, NEA-BC, CNE, Director 24 and Chair/Associate Professor of Baccalaureate Nursing 25 Program of Lincoln University, presented before the

1 Board to discuss its Request for Extension of 2 Provisional Status of its BSN Program for a fourth 3 year.

Ms. Philmon advised the Board that Lincoln's pass 4 5 rates have increased from 25% in 2016 and 57.14% in 2017 to 66.67% in 2018. She updated the Board on the 6 7 initiatives which she believes led to the increase: 8 Implementation of the NCLEX Living Learning Community 9 initiative, institution of enhanced admission 10 criteria, participation in the AARP/Action 11 Coalitions/Office of Minority Health's initiative to 12 institute a non-academic mentoring program, stable 13 leadership in the positions of President, Provost, and 14 Director of Nursing Care and the hiring of different 15 level deans, creation of meetings for students 16 transitioning from pre-nursing to nursing, conducting meetings with junior and senior nursing students to 17 18 offer updates on NCLEX testing, and faculty 19 collaboration on the curriculum.

As part of the Living Learning Community, graduates remain on campus with an assigned faculty member while studying for the NCLEX. The mentoring program stemmed from the Institute of Medicine's Report regarding the disparity in pass rates for minority students. Lincoln is working with the PA

Action Coalition to pair students with practicing
nurses.

3 Ms. Philmon explained that the program has 4 started looking at the curriculum, but she believes 5 that an in-depth review by a third party is needed. 6 She explained that in November ATI made a presentation 7 to the faculty about gaps within the Program's curriculum based upon the NCLEX examination scores. 8 9 Students are being asked to remediate on areas where 10 they answered incorrectly on an examination. Also, the faculty are looking at the Mountain Measurement Reports 11 12 to map their curriculum but "it is not being used to 13 fidelity" necessitating a consultant. Faculty are 14 receiving professional development on assisting 15 students with clinical decision making and changing 16 their teaching practices.

Ms. Philmon noted that 9 students in the 2018 class 17 18 had not tested as of September 30th. She has been 19 reaching out to those students by text with NCLEX 20 questions.] * * * 21 22 Appointment - Request for Extension of Provisional 23 Status - Pennsylvania Institute of Technology -24 Practical Nursing Program

25 [Danielle Giuliano, PhD, MSN, BSN, RN, Director of

Nursing, Pennsylvania Institute of Technology; Geri Swindell, RN, Full-Time Faculty member; Dr. Kimberly Marucci, Ed.D, Dean of Academic Affairs; and Will Robinson, President, presented before the Board to discuss its Request for Extension of Provisional Status of its Practical Nurse Program for a fourth year.

Dr. Giuliano advised the Board that its current 8 pass rate is 76.9%. In 2014, the pass rate was 83%, 9 10 in 2015 it was 55.6%, in 2016 it increased to 65%, and 11 in 2017 it increased to 75.6%. Dr. Giuliano opined 12 that the program had an evening component, which has 13 since been discontinued, that brought the pass rate 14 down. Included in the 2018 examination pool was one 15 student who graduated in December 2016, and in the 2017 examination pool was one student who graduated in 16 June 2016. There are still two students from 2016 and 17 18 two from 2017 that have yet to test.

Dr. Giuliano, Ms. Swindell, Dr. Marucci, and Mr. Robinson provided information regarding the Program's remediation efforts: An increase in staff development and staff meetings to every six weeks; the establishment of a college-wide faculty professional development committee; the addition of simulation in areas outside of maternity for nursing students and the

purchase of simulation screens; the utilization of 1 2 SurveyMonkey for course evaluations and Moodle, the 3 college online platform for placement of course 4 schedules, assignments, grades and PowerPoint 5 presentations; the increased communication about 6 testing for the NCLEX® soon after graduation; the 7 partnership with the Delaware County Literacy Counsel for ELS learners; the use of less adjunct instructors; 8 the inclusion of pharmacology and math questions in 9 10 testing on every test in every course and the 11 institution of a fundamentals review on the first day of every semester; the purchase of ATI Complete, 12 13 including Capstone and ATI Virtual Coaching, a 14 Scantron, and an electronic healthcare tutor; the 15 implementation of a buddy-up system between freshmen 16 and juniors/seniors and a skills carnival; the 17 consultation with ATI to review the entire curriculum; 18 the communication with non-competing nursing schools 19 for program information that promotes positive pass 20 rates; and the creation of an alumni panel. 21 Dr. Giuliano explained that at the staff meetings 22 staff use the newly-purchased NurseTim and its 23 webinars, focus on curriculum development and test 24 taking, and develop test questions. The Program has 25 not used Mountain Measurement to map its curriculum.

She also explained that the Program has hired a 1 2 full-time person accountable for simulation who will 3 start on January 2, 2019. That member has not yet 4 obtained certification at Drexel University as 5 indicated in the Performance Improvement Plan. Three 6 full-time faculty members teach the didactic courses. 7 Dr. Giuliano also advised that the Program has submitted a request to the Board to increase its 8 9 program from 12 to 15-month program. That request is 10 under review. 11 Dr. Giuliano noted that the Program has a 20% 12 attrition rate due to academic and person reasons.] * * * 13 14 [Suzanne Hendricks, BSBH, RN, LPN, exited the meeting 15 at 11:19 a.m. for recusal purposes.] * * * 16 17 Appointment - Request for Extension of Provisional 18 Status - Prism Career Institute Practical Nursing 19 Program 20 [Jennifer Holzer, DNP, RN, Director of Nursing, Prism 21 Career Institute, and Jeffrey Mann, Campus Director, 22 presented before the Board to discuss its Request for 23 an Extension of Provisional Status for its Practical 2.4 Nurse Program for a fifth year. 25 Dr. Holzer advised the Board that Prism's pass

rate is currently 59/5%. There are approximately 115
students in the Program.

3 Dr. Holzer and Mr. Mann detailed the following 4 remediation efforts: Hiring two Assistant Directors 5 of Nursing - one for the day and one for the evening 6 program - and the promotion of a student services 7 director, restructuring and replacing of the nursing faculty, revising curriculum and courses, adding three 8 9 new computer labs and a fourth one currently being 10 built, and purchasing Shadow Health, an online virtual 11 clinical experience.

12 Dr. Holzer explained that curriculum changes 13 include replacing paper-and-pencil tests with online 14 testing, and beginning in January 2019, adding a 15 medical terminology course to replace English Composition, a test-taking strategies class to replace 16 17 computers, and a mental health class, splitting 18 pharmacology and adding 30 hours to anatomy and 19 physiology and decreasing the PPR Class to 30 hours.] * * * 20 21 [Linda A. Kerns, Esquire, exited the meeting at 2.2 11:22 a.m. and re-entered at 11:25 a.m.] 23 * * * 24 [Additional remediation includes: Implementing a 25 tutoring program; offering an NCLEX PN review class

and designating a person to serve as an NCLEX 1 2 coordinator; decreasing the number of courses in the 3 first term; renovation to the facilities and 4 upgrades to technology; the identification of key 5 aptitudes for students entering the program; and 6 implementing student activities, including a dress 7 down day, a student ambassador program, and a 8 student monthly newsletter. 9 Dr. Holzer explained that the Program is 10 considering addition other aspects of the TEAS test 11 to the admission requirements. It has a retention 12 rate of 76%-80%.] 13 * * * 14 [John M. She addressed the objective of their proposed 8 program, specifically to provide prepared BSN nurses 9 to meet the recommendations of the Institute of 10 Medicine to the rural areas of Fayette, Greene, and 11 Westmoreland Counties with the current nursing 12 shortage.

13 Dr. Kordas discussed the University's faculty and 14 student policies, as well as outlined the curriculum 15 plan in relationship to the proposed nursing 16 education program.
