   Regulation Update - Regulations Status Summary
15
   [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,
16
   informed the Board that the Fees regulation (16A-5142)
17
   was under review by the Office of General Counsel,

   Office of Budget, and Office of Policy. Ms. Pachter
   Schulder projected publication of the regulations in

   proposed form in late spring. There were no new

   updates on the remaining pending regulations.]

   Legislative Update - Pennsylvania Update
24
   [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,
25
   referred to Senate Bill 354 as signed by Governor Wolf
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into Act 6 of 2018. Ms. Pachter Schulder discussed significant provisions of Act 6 including expungement of continuing education violations and practicing on a lapsed licensed up to six months. Both categories of offenses can be expunged following five years of non-discipline.

Act 6 also requires that all criminal matters and reciprocal discipline be reported within 30 days. Pachter Schulder discussed that 21.29a, 21.156b and 21.723a require that reciprocal actions be reported to the Board within 90 days and criminal charges and convictions be reported within 30 days. Department's view is that because Act 6 follows the regulatory amendments, all reciprocal and criminal actions be reported within 30 days. She noted a notice to be placed on the Board's website announcing the 30 days reporting requirements. The last significant provision in Act 6 is the inclusion of immediate temporary suspensions for Boards that do not have this provision within their Acts.

Ms. Pachter Schulder referred the Board to House Bill 2092 related to the nurse staffing standards in hospitals.]

1 to make recommendations for each of the licensing
2 Boards, but a report will be provided to each Board
3 for its input.

Commissioner Harlow stated the Pennsylvania

Licensing System (PALS) was approximately 85 percent

complete and 3.5 percent below projected expenditures.

All initial licensure applications will be moved to

PALS.

Commissioner Harlow explained the administrative process for licensing operations being completed through PALS. He encouraged the Board and associations to provide feedback to his office or the Board Administrator on the system.

Commissioner Harlow presented statistics regarding PALS renewals, reporting that the Nursing Board had 1,300 licensees successfully completing their renewals out of 51,000 in a two-day period and noting nine requests for help desk support.

Commissioner Harlow discussed answering calls regarding PALS. He and Ms. Keiser have been working to provide additional staff on the phones and to obtain approval for another staff position. He mentioned temporarily bringing on 20 Bureau-wide annuitants to assist with the transition of PALS. Mr. Harlow stated the basic processing time for

Dr. O'Donnell, as the Associate Director of the Peter M. Winter Institute for Simulation, Education, and Research, added that all Board members would be welcomed and proposed a 2- to 4-hour interactive learning experience for the Board members. Board members, Board staff, and association representatives voiced their interest in the visit. Dr. O'Donnell noted that his supervisor at the institute, Dr. Paul Phrampus, would be most willing to host the Board.]

Advanced Practice Nursing Committee Meeting

[Jodie Szlachta, CRNA, PhD, President of the

Pennsylvania Association of Nurse Anesthetists, and

- 1 Derek Reckard, President-Elect, discussed two bills
- 2 | affecting nurse anesthetists: The CRNA Designation
- 3 | Bill, Senate Bill 274, regarding title protection,
- 4 passed in the Senate by Senator John R. Gordner and
- 5 currently in the House Professional Licensure
- 6 | Committee chaired by Representative Mark Mustio; and
- 7 | House Bill 719, a companion bill introduced by
- 8 Representative Bryan Cutler, also in the House
- 9 Professional Licensure Committee with House
- 10 Representative Mustio as Chairman.
- 11 Dr. Szlachta informed the Board that Pennsylvania
- 12 has the most nurse anesthesia educational programs in
- 13 the United States. She also discussed challenges for
- 14 | military nurse anesthetists. Dr. O'Donnell discussed
- 15 practices for CRNAs within the military designated as
- 16 licensed independent providers.
- Dr. Szlachta also discussed House Bill 789, a
- 18 provision and supervision bill introduced by
- 19 Representative Jim Christiana, and Senate Bill 960, a
- 20 companion bill introduced by Senator Tom Killion,
- 21 requiring nurse anesthetists who work in a hospital to
- 22 be supervised by a physician. She stated this bill
- 23 was not supported by studies reflecting safety or
- 24 outcome measures of CRNA practice, as well as being
- 25 | contrary to State Board of Nursing regulations and the

2010 Institute of Medicine (IOM) Report that prompts the use of all APRNs to full scope of practice.

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Dr. Szlachta next discussed that CRNAs are reviewing their protocols regarding obtaining informed consent in light of the June 2017 Pennsylvania Supreme Court decision in *Shinal vs. Toms*, wherein the Court ruled that physicians may not delegate to others their obligation to provide sufficient information in order to obtain a patient's informed consent.

Dr. Szlachta discussed legislation being supported by health organizations regarding CRNAs and CRNPs obtaining informed consents. Ms. Marshall stated The Hospital and Healthsystem Association of Pennsylvania (HAP) was working with the Pennsylvania Medical Society to draft language for an amendment to the MCARE Act to address this issue. There was discussion regarding including supervision language to reflect the practice between physicians and nurse anesthetists.

Dr. Szlachta referred to a ketamine workgroup convened by Dr. Arlene Seid to establish guidelines for the use of ketamine in non-anesthetic circumstances. She noted that the group will be addressing the identification of appropriate facilities, required monitoring, safety concerns and

protocols, and required personnel or care team to both administer and/or be present during the administration of ketamine by bolus or infusion.

Dr. O'Donnell further explained that ketamine as a sedative-hypnotic IV anesthetic could be used for induction of general anesthesia as well as a variety of sedation, as well as a substitute for opioids due to the opioid crisis.

Ms. Marshall mentioned that HAP convened an Advanced Practice Professionals group in 2013 and some of the work from that group resulted in an Advanced Practice Professional's guidebook on the utilization in a hospital setting. Ms. Marshall plans to reconvene that group to not only update that guidebook but also consider developing an Advanced Practice Professionals Conference.

Ms. Pachter Schulder requested an update with regard to the status of midwives on an advanced practice standing. Ms. Vincent suggested organizing a meeting of midwives, anesthetists, and CRNPs to discuss advanced practice.

Jessica Poole, DNAP, MSN, CRNA, Pennsylvania
Association of Nurse Anesthetists, pointed out that
CRNAs in Pennsylvania attempting to volunteer for
disaster relief were being denied or sent to the

facilities to work as registered nurses at the bedside, not able to administer anesthesia.

Chairperson Kmetz thanked Dr. O'Donnell for arranging this appointment.]
