- 3 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel,
- 4 explained that this is a sine die year and that
- 5 legislation that was not passed will have to be
- 6 | reintroduced in January.
  - She deferred to Ms. Kieselhorst for additional information on the dietitian bill that was introduced.
- 9 Kessey J. Kieselhorst, MPA, RD, LDN, CPHQ,
- 10 explained that earlier in the month House Bill No.
- 11 2721 was introduced to make changes in the statute for
- 12 LDNs which had not been updated since 2002. The bill
- 13 | will be introduced again next year.
- 14 Ms. Kieselhorst highlighted some of the changes
- 15 to the bill, including updated language with regard to
- 16 qualifications for dietitians requiring that starting
- 17 | in 2024 dietitians must have obtained a master's
- 18 degree before sitting for the exam. Currently, the
- 19 requirement is for a bachelor's degree.
- 20 The scope of practice would be amended so that
- 21 medical nutrition therapy would fall within the
- 22 exclusive domain of the licensed dietitian
- 23 nutritionist. And also that LDNs will have the
- 24 exclusive ability to do nutrition-focused physical
- 25 exams and other complex nutrition assessments and

interventions.

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The terms dietitian, nutritionist and dietitian nutritionist can only be used by those who are LDNs licensed in Pennsylvania.

Ms. Pachter Schulder also noted that the House and Senate have approved resolutions to recognize Nurse Practitioner Week and Nephrology Nurse Week.

22 which time 60 Class A credits and 40 Class B credits

23 must be obtained. He summarized the requirements for

24 Class B credits as those earned for teaching college

25 students being deployed in the military or working on

a specialized hospital team.

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Ms. Pachter Schulder noted that licensees who are CRNAs would want to make sure that these Class B activities would fall within Section 21.134 of the regulations.

Dr. O'Donnell questioned whether education provided by an individual in the role of a clinical instructor to a student in a nurse anesthesia program would count as a Class B credit and be approved under this guideline. Ms. Pachter Schulder stressed that the licensee should ensure that documentation evidencing compliance with Section 21.134 of the regulations be in order in the likelihood of an audit.

Mr. Reckard stated the national organization deferred its position on the matter to the states as every board is different.]

- 21 NCSBN end-of-year exam results that were distributed
- 22 to all programs. Dr. Petula noted that 14 or 20
- 23 percent of the practical nursing programs are on
- 24 provisional status for exam year 2017-2018, with an
- 25 | average pass rate of 84.10% falling just below the

U.S. average of 85.38%. She noted that four programs, who will be on provisional status for a 4<sup>th</sup> or 5<sup>th</sup> year, will present at the Board's meeting in December and three more in January to request an extension of their provisional status. All 14 programs will be required to either submit an initial performance plan or update their current plans.

With regard to registered nursing programs, 6 RN Programs were on provisional status for exam year 2016-2017, and this year there are 3 on provisional status. Two of the programs are going on for the first year and the other will be on for a  $4^{\rm th}$  year.

Dr. Petula asked for feedback from the Board with regard to items the Board desires to be included in performance improvement plans. The Board discussed requiring the programs to identify if an improvement occurred and in what specific area, steps taken toward improvement for the prior exam year and what method was used to make the determination. Dr. Petula noted that expectations for a one-year program as compared to a four-year program would require different considerations.

The Board agreed that later this year it will write to the programs that have already been on provisional status for two years and suggest looking

at areas for improvement in advance of any unfortunate need to go on provisional status the following year.

Dr. Petula added that the National Council of State Boards of Nursing was conducting a research study to identify the regulatory quality indicators related to nursing education programs, including graduation rates of students, employer satisfaction regarding readiness for practice, NCLEX pass rates, consistency of graduate employment rates, graduate satisfaction with the program, the relationship of the nursing program with its clinical partners, the history of the Board of Nursing discipline with the graduates of the program and graduate preparedness to practice in an interprofessional environment.

Dr. Petula added further that at the conference it was also noted that research will clearly change the education of students, specifically the concepts of decision-making and critical thinking resulting in good clinical judgment and patient care outcomes.

Dr. Petula noted that at the conference there was discussion about breaking up the examination into a knowledge-based test and a clinical judgement test, but the existing testing method will continue. There was further discussion and comments regarding implementation of changes to the exams and the
