Kimberly Cobaugh, NHA, Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 12:31 10 a.m. Roll call was taken. K. Kalonji Johnson, Acting 11 Commissioner, was not present at the commencement of 12 the meeting. * * * 13 14 Approval of minutes of the February 26, 2020 meeting 15 CHAIRPERSON COBAUGH: 16 Do I have a motion for approval of the 17 minutes from February 26th? 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1 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Acting Commissioner, entered the 2 meeting at 12:33 p.m.]
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- 4 Report of Prosecutorial Division
- 5 | [William Newport, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison,
- 6 conducted a roll call of the Prosecutorial Division
- 7 | staff in attendance. Mr. Newport introduced Trista
- 8 Boyd, Esquire, as the Board's new Prosecuting
- 9 Attorney, and summarized her professional background.]
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- 11 Report of Board Counsel
- 12 [Jaime D. Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the
- 13 meeting was being recorded. All parties remaining in
- 14 the meeting were thereby giving consent to being
- 15 recorded.
- 16 Ms. Black discussed the Waiver for the COVID-19
- 17 License Renewal Extensions granted on March 27, 2020,
- 18 which provided for a 90-day extension of license
- 19 renewal deadlines. She also discussed the Guidance
- 20 Released for a Continuing Education Extension due to
- 21 the Pandemic. As a result of the extensions of the
- 22 | license renewals, associated regulations establishing
- 23 renewal dates were also temporarily suspended.
- 24 Licensees are given until September 28th of 2020 to
- 25 | complete their CEs, though encouraged to complete by

June 30, 2020, if possible.

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Ms. Black discussed the training program extension. The COVID-19 Emergency made complying with the Boards AIT requirements difficult. Applicants should not be penalized or licenses jeopardized when, through no fault of their own, time periods continue to run or expire due to the COVID-19 Emergency. Governor approved the Board's request to extend the two-year timeframe an additional one year. She noted the Waivers and Guidance information may be found on the Board's website. Ms. Black offered Ms. Stuckey and herself to provide clarification.

Ms. Black reviewed the Recusal Guidelines with 1.3 14 the Board.]

Kelly, NHA, 11 reported the Committees had no outstanding issues.] * * * 12 Miscellaneous 13 14 Probable Cause Screening Committee 15 [Chris Stuckey, Board Administrator, noted a Probable Cause Screening Committee for the Board had not been 16 17 appointed. 18 Jaime Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, raised the 19 issue of whether the Board would want to appoint a 20 probable cause screening committee. This Board has never had a Probable Cause Screening Committee. 21 She 2.2 discussed the role of this committee, why it is used, 23 and inquired as to whether any member or members would 2.4 volunteers to serve on this committee. 25 Mr. Newport related his experience with a

Probable Cause Screening Committee and provided scenarios wherein the committee was beneficial.

Chairperson Cobaugh solicited volunteers for the committee.

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Vice Chairperson McDermond requested additional information as to what type of information and how it is provided to the Probable Cause Screening Committee. Dean Picarella, Esquire, Senior Counsel, provided detailed situations where the actions of the Probable Cause Screening Committee would be advantageous for the Board and the public. He explained how recusal of the Probable Cause Screening Committee factors into Board discussions and actions on those matters that may come before the Board.

Acting Commissioner Johnson discussed the protection of the public by the Probable Cause Screening Committee issuing an immediate temporary suspension (ITS) of a license. He inquired as to the timeframe for final Board decision on an ITS. Mr. Picarella noted a hearing is scheduled within 30 days upon the issuance of an ITS. The licensee may contact the Prosecutorial Division to work out a stipulation to the order. The orders will run generally 180 days. The licensee may also petition to be reinstated.
