3 * * * 1 2 State Board of Examiners of Nursing 3 Home Administrators 4 August 2, 2017 * * * 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 6 7 Board of Examiners of Nursing Home Administrators was 8 held on Wednesday, August 2, 2017. Kimberly Cobaugh, 9 Chairperson, called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m. * * * 10 Introduction of Audience 11 12 [Chairperson Cobaugh requested the introduction of the audience in attendance.] 13 14 * * * 15 Evacuation Announcement 16 [Chris Stuckey, Board Administrator, reviewed the 17 emergency evacuation procedures for One Penn Center.] * * * 18 19 [Chairperson Cobaugh welcomed new members, Michael P. 20 Kelly and Anna E. Messmer-Wise. Each provided a brief 21 summary of their professional background.] * * * 22 23 Approval of Minutes of the May 3, 2017 meeting 24 CHAIRPERSON COBAUGH: 25 The next thing is approval of the

4 minutes of May 3, 2017. 1 2 MS. HEWSTON: 3 So moved. 4 MS. MCDERMOND: I'll second. 5 CHAIRPERSON COBAUGH: 6 7 All in favor? 8 [The motion carried unanimously.] 9 * * * 10 Report of Board Counsel 11 Status of Regulations/Guidelines/Statements of Policy [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, addressed the prior 12 13 legislative initiative request regarding the removal 14 of the provision for high school graduates qualifying 15 for licensure. Ms. Pachter Schulder stated it has been the 16 17 Board's desire to have a two-year college education or 18 an RN license as the minimum licensure requirement. 19 Ms. Hewston stated there must be an understanding 20 of the nature of the business to strategize and deal 21 with the family dynamics and complexity of the patient 22 within the regulatory environment. She discussed the 23 need for leadership abilities and skills in dealing 24 with staffing issues and the Department of Health's 25 involvement in the long-term care regulations.

Kimberly Cobaugh, Chairperson, addressed Det 1 2 Norske Veritas Healthcare, Inc. (DNV Healthcare), an 3 accrediting agency certified through (CMS) Centers for 4 Medicare & Medicaid Services to accredit nursing homes 5 and hospitals. She explained the regulatory 6 environment is complex with hospital-based units. 7 Ms. Pachter Schulder reviewed the need for a statutory change. It was discussed whether 8 Pennsylvania Coalition of Affiliated Healthcare & 9 10 Living Communities (PACAH) would have an interest in 11 taking a leadership role, being a sponsor, and pushing 12 the legislation. 13 Ms. Pachter Schulder agreed to prepare a 14 legislative initiative following a Board-approved 15 motion to put forth a legislative initiative requiring the minimum of a two-year college degree or RN 16 17 licensure as a minimum standard to hold a license as a 18 nursing home administrator and to add the provision 19 for the impaired professionals to the licensure act.] 20 MS. HEWSTON: 21 I'll make that motion. 2.2 MS. BALDI: 23 I'll second. 24 CHAIRPERSON COBAUGH: 25 All in favor? Any abstentions? Thank

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6 1 you. 2 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 3 Report of Board Chairperson 4 5 [Kimberly Cobaugh, Chairperson, discussed her concerns 6 with regard to the staffing shortage of certified 7 nursing assistants and licensed practical nurses in 8 the nursing home facilities. Additional Board members 9 discussed similar concerns in their area. 10 The Board discussed providing a voice in the 11 rewriting of the regulations. Ms. Pachter Schulder 12 will draft a request for a member of the Board to 13 participate in a Department of Health workgroup for 14 the revision of the long-term care regulations.] * * * 15 16 Report of Deputy Commissioner - No Report * * * 17 18 Report of Board Administrator - No Report * * * 19 20 Report of Board Members - No Report 21 * * * 22 Report of Committees 23 Examination Committee [Diane M. Shepherd 11 Childs and Colleen Joanna Torres. 12 Valentina Y. Krizel will be discussed in Executive Session. 13 14 Ms. Hewston also noted the Approved Endorsement 15 Applications and approved examination applications for 16 those who completed an (AIT) Administrator in Training 17 Program.] * * * 18 19 Correspondence 20 [Chairperson Cobaugh stated that Randy Linder, MHSA, CAE, President & CEO, NAB, requested that the Board 21 22 accept NAB-approved AIT programs. 23 Chris Stuckey, Board Administrator, noted NAB-24 approved bachelor's degree programs requiring a 1000-25 hour AIT program through the college. As the AIT

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programs were not pre-approved by the Board, the Board 1 2 would be unable to accept the programs as it would 3 require a regulatory change. 4 Ms. Pachter Schulder will draft a response to Randy Lindner stating his request would require 5 6 regulatory changes.] * * * 7 8 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 9:45 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 9 10 with Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel, 11 and for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial 12 deliberations and to receive advice of Counsel. The 13 Board returned to open session at 10:25 a.m.] 14 * * * 15 MOTIONS MS. PACHTER SCHULDER: 16 17 While in Executive Session, we conducted 18 quasi-judicial deliberations on two 19 matters on the agenda: Jesse Lee Aultz 20 and Valentina Y. Krizel. 21 Is there a motion to grant Jesse Lee 2.2 Aultz's request to retake the licensure 23 examination and to strongly recommend to 2.4 him that he take educational courses 25 that will prepare him to retake the

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9 examination, and in the unlikely event 1 2 he would fail the examination again, he 3 would have to appear before the Board and document the education that he's 4 5 taking in order to prepare himself to retake the test? 6 7 MS. MCDERMOND: 8 I'll make a motion. 9 MS. HEWSTON: 10 I'll second it. 11 CHAIRPERSON COBAUGH: 12 All in favor? Opposed? 13 [The motion carried unanimously.] 14 * * * 15 MS. PACHTER SCHULDER: The second was in terms of Valentina Y. 16 17 Krizel's request for a waiver of the 18 120-hour course due to her completion of 19 a post-baccalaureate certificate. 20 Is there a motion to provisionally 21 deny that request for a waiver on the 22 grounds that the post-baccalaureate 23 certificate is not equivalent to the 24 120-hour course and provide her with the 25 right to request a formal hearing to

disprove the denial? 1 2 MS. BALDI: 3 I'll make a motion. 4 MS. HOLLADAY: 5 Second. 6 CHAIRPERSON COBAUGH: 7 All in favor? Opposed? 8 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 9 10 Miscellaneous 11 [Anne E.
