Fee Increase Reports. She reminded members that the
Board will not be moving forward with the fee
increase, but will continue to monitor the matter.

Recently passed Act 6 was also noted for the Board's review.]

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9 Report of Board Chairperson

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10 [Kerri Hample, OTD, OTR/L, Chairperson, referred
11 members to the Model Occupational Therapy Practice Act
12 and the ACOTE doctorate mandate document.

Ms. Hample noted the requirement for licensure in the Act makes reference to a four-year program, and further discussed issues as ACOTE moves towards a doctorate program.

Ms. Hample stated that members from the Pennsylvania Occupational Therapy Association and American Occupational Therapy Association were invited to the meeting to discuss the best way to move forward with keeping the best interests of the profession in mind.

Ms. Wolfgang noted ACOTE's standards are accreditation standards and not the Board's licensing law. She explained that the Board does not have

regulatory provisions indicating what educational programs are recognized by the Board. Board Counsel suggested that the Board consider drafting regulations that recognize ACOTE and/or other appropriate accreditation agencies. The Board had further discussion on the matter.

Kristen Neville commented that regardless of which route the Board takes, legislative or regulatory, AOTA was available as a resource. She offered suggestions regarding the regulatory provision language.

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Amy Gerney, President, POTA, commented that POTA has legal counsel and a lobbyist and willing to entertain any efforts to amend discrepancies in the Practice Act. POTA was willing to work with the Board to accomplish that goal. Ms. Gerney also commented on the state's efforts to adopt national standards with regard to reciprocity.

Alyson Stover, Legislative Coordinator for POTA, commented on the current 183 ACOTE standards that a program must meet to reach doctoral levels, as well as the 169 standards for OTAs that far exceeds what a traditional graduate program offers. Dr. Stover offered to provide any additional information regarding NBCOT certifications and ACOTE accreditation

standards. There was further discussion concerning the matter as it relates to PA regulations concerning accreditation standards and certifications.

All Board members were encouraged to review language in the Acts for potential issues with regard to proposed fieldwork changes and ACOTE accreditation. It was noted POTA agreed to provide proposed language in early April before the Board's next meeting.

Dr. Baird noted that NBCOT has stopped moving forward with the idea of presumptive denial as it would not fit within the Practice Act. Chairperson Hample referred to a recent email noting the presumptive denial as a "cease and desist". Ms. Wolfgang explained that even though the presumptive denial policy was rescinded, NBCOT will continue to require a criminal background check. If NBCOT determines that a Pennsylvania applicant is not qualified for NBCOT certification due to criminal history, the Board may request examination for licensure purposes only. If the applicant passes the examination, the applicant would not be granted NBCOT certification.
