- 25 Ms. Wolfgang asked Ms. Niner to investigate the

publication of newsletters in order to provide an assessment at the next Board meeting.

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Ms. Wolfgang discussed the 2019 renewals and the importance of clarity regarding the channels of communication with license holders. She noted that the Board indicated to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) that the Board would notify licensees via a newsletter or some communication. She questioned whether the new Code of Ethics would be on the application.

Ms. Niner explained that the information had been posted to the website. She stated email notifications were sent for renewals. She will revise the email notification to add information regarding the Code of Ethics and new CE requirements for 2021.

Ms. Niner will also include the information with the renewal requirements. The announcement regarding the Code of Ethics and certified occupational therapy assistants (COTAs) requirements will also be added to the website.

Ms. Wolfgang updated the Board on the Child Abuse Reporting Requirement regulation (16a-679), stating that the Bureau decided to focus on the Pennsylvania State Board of Dentistry and send one package through the regulatory process. She stated, as soon as the

Dentistry package is finalized, the Board will make the necessary changes to their package for a quick passage through the regulatory process.

Ms. Wolfgang discussed the pending Educational Programs regulatory package (16A-6712). She commented that the prior Board vote to send the Proposed Annex for 16A-6712. She discussed the definition section changes.

Chairperson Hample noted a concern with taking the equivalent piece out of the regulation due to the act including the word "equivalent." She believed the word "equivalent" was no longer relevant except for the licensees who have been practicing for years.

Dr. Baird stated the state licensure definition would leave the Board open to further scrutiny due to the current multiple entry points within the profession. She could see no harm in leaving out the entry-level degree requirements language.

Ms. Gatty suggested taking out the brackets and referring to the academic requirements of an educational program described by the act, specifically 8(a)2 or an equivalent program as defined in our definition, and then making the second part on the accreditation piece another requirement.

Ms. Wolfgang stated the act states four-year

1 program or its equivalent as established by the Board.

Chairperson Hample questioned, if we put this regulation in, then we are defining the approved part and ignoring the equivalent part?

Ms. Wolfgang referenced the proposed language that defines equivalent as a doctorate, master's, or certificate program. She explained that individuals coming from another state who graduated with a certificate but have successfully completed an educational program for an occupational therapist that is accredited and recognized by the Board would meet the educational requirements.

Dr. Baird noted that the definitions under § 42.1 would be deleted.
