Jarabeck, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, 12 presented the VRP Consent Agreement for File No. 18-65-009433.1 13 \* \* \* 14 15 Report of Board Counsel - Regulations 16 [Thomas Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed 17 16A-6522 regarding early examination and continuing 18 education (CE) for clinical instruction. He noted 19 prior discussion of § 40.15(a) and suggested changes 20 in language, such as applications for licensure by 21 examination must be submitted to the State Board of 22 Physical Therapy in a format approved by the Board. 23 He commented that the change was due to paper 24 applications no longer being accepted. 25 Mr. Davis also referred to prior discussion under

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§ 40.63(j) regarding continuing education for direct
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   access certificate holder. The language was changed
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   to the following: Credits earned via this subsection
   will not count toward credits required under
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   $ 40.61(a)(1)(ii).
        Chairperson Potter referred to 40.192(c)(7)
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   regarding continuing education for certified physical
   therapist assistant, noting that the second and third
   line should read that accredits physical therapist
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   assistant programs.
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        Mr. Davis stated, once approved, he will present

   a finished annex as well as a preamble with the
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   suggested changes for the Board to formally vote to

        Mr. Davis addressed House Bill 138 of 2019,
   former House Bill 2617 of 2018 that died in committee
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   last session. He stated House Bill 138 of 2019
   received a unanimous vote in the committee and in the

   House, as well as complements the direction of the
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   Board with the 90-day language.

        Mr. Davis addressed House Bill 862, former House
22
   Bill 1836 that died in the Veterans Affairs &
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   Emergency Preparedness Committee regarding the
   Physical Therapy Licensure Compact. He noted that the
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Bill was introduced to the Professional Licensure

Committee.

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Chairperson Potter noted contiguous states that passed the compact, which will take on more relevance for the Board as Pennsylvania gets surrounded by states that have already adopted the compact. She noted implementation to be a time-consuming process, suggesting the Board be proactive in the process and what needs to be done if legislation passes.

22 | Budget Presentation

23 [Kimberly Adams, Chief of Fiscal Management, Bureau of

24 | Finance and Operations introduced herself and Amanda

25 Richards, Fiscal Management Specialist 2.

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Ms. Adams addressed licensee population from a revenue standpoint. She reviewed FY 2014-2015, FY 2016-2017, and FY 2018-2019 with a current licensee count at 27,185 with a recent addition of 105. She noted an additional 5,467 licensees from FY 2014-2015.
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Ms. Adams stated 95.9% of revenue was from renewals and applications. The current biennial total was noted.

Ms. Adams reviewed the categorical breakdown of administrative and legal expenses for FY 2016-17 and FY 2017-18, FY 2018-2019 budget, and expenses as of February 28. She noted a recent increase in expenses. She noted that expenses incur from direct-based cost, timesheet-based charges, and licensee-based charges.

Ms. Adams addressed revenues and expenses from FY 2016-2017, FY 2017-2018, and the FY 2018-2019 budget balance. She noted that revenue was exceeding expenditures and licensee population growth was showing a healthy balance for future years.

Chairperson Potter questioned whether the fee waiver in July 2020 was guaranteed.

Mr. Davis stated the current regulation that is being drafted by regulatory counsel concerning lowering fees was not yet complete.

Ms. Adams noted the FY 2019-2020 projection was

far lower due in part of the waiver taking place.

Ms. Adams provided a breakdown of Board member expenses for FY 2016-2017 and FY 2017-2018, noting the budget for FY 2018-2019. She noted expenses as of February 28, 2019, with a recent increase. She commented that the budget will remain the same for FY 2019-2020. She commented that any excess goes back to the restricted account for the Board's use.

Ms. Adams reviewed the expenditure sheet reflecting a pictorial overview of the fluctuation of expenses since 2006.

Chairperson Potter questioned whether devoting some of the surplus in the budget could be used to increase support administratively to lessen the burden on staff. Mr. Davis commented that the issues was being considered and suggested getting in touch with the Commissioner's Office for a contact person.]

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19 Report of Board Chair

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[Cynthia Potter, PT, Chairperson, stated that the Membership Survey Task Force by the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy's (FSBPT) final meeting was in February and thanked those who

completed the survey. She commented that the

25 satisfaction level with the federation was 95% or

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above in every single category, which reflects well on
1
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  the federation meeting the needs of the licensure
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  Boards around the country.
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Chairperson Potter stated that FSBPT does a good job of figuring out what states need and would like the Board to bring forward topics of interest.]
