3 \* \* \* 1 2 State Board of Physical Therapy 3 May 17, 2018 \* \* \* 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 6 Board of Physical Therapy was held on Thursday, May 7 17, 2018. \* \* \* 8 9 Official Call to Order 10 [Cynthia Potter, PT, Chairperson, officially called 11 the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. A quorum was noted 12 to be present.] 13 \* \* \* 14 Approval of Minutes of the January 18, 2018 meeting 15 CHAIRPERSON POTTER: 16 The first item is the approval of the minutes. Are there any additions or 17 corrections to the minutes? 18 19 If not, is there a motion to 20 approve the minutes? 21 MS. FREY: 22 So moved. 23 MS. GRZYBEK: 24 Second. 25 CHAIRPERSON POTTER:

4 It's been moved and seconded to adopt 1 2 the minutes as presented. All in favor, 3 say aye. Opposed, no? Abstentions? [The motion carried unanimously.] 4 \* \* \* 5 6 Report of Prosecutorial Division 7 [Andrea Costello, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented a VRP Consent Agreement for File No. 18-65-01183.] 8 9 \* \* \* 10 [Jason Anderson, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, 11 presented Consent Agreements for File No. 16-65-12711, File No. 17-65-13585, and File No. 17-65-14381.] 12 \* \* \* 13 14 [Steven Mimm, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented a 15 Consent Agreement for File No. 14-65-05233.] \* \* \* 16 17 Report of Board Chairperson 18 [Cynthia Potter, PT, Chairperson, discussed the 19 cancellation of Board meetings, as well as meetings of 20 the Governor's Executive Order 2017-03 Advisory Group, 21 due to weather. She also updated the Board as to 22 database developments. Chairperson Potter referenced 23 a SharePoint discussion of the Advisory Group, as well 2.4 as the contributions from St. Francis University. 25 Chairperson Potter discussed the missed deadline

for credentialing a delegate for the Federation of 1 2 State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) meeting due 3 to the Governor's travel ban. She related her efforts to lift the ban. 4 Chairperson Potter discussed a Leadership Issue 5 6 Forum being sponsored by FSBPT in July, which the 7 Board is also precluded from attending. Geraldine Grzybek, PT, as a new board member, expressed her 8 9 dissatisfaction with not being permitted to participate in the regulatory training in order to 10 11 better service the state.] \* \* \* 12 13 Report of Board Counsel 14 [Juan Ruiz, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred to the 15 Status of Regulations as prepared by Thomas Blackburn, Esquire, Regulatory Counsel. He noted the approval of 16 17 the Act 38 rulemaking by the Independent Regulatory 18 Review Commission (IRRC). 19 Mr. Ruiz noted a proposed Adjudication and Order 20 for discussion in Executive Session.] \* \* \* 21 2.2 Miscellaneous 23 Discussion - CE for acting as clinical instructor 24 [Mr. Ruiz noted the receipt of numerous letters in 25 support of granting CE credit for acting as a clinical

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1 instructor.

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2	Sandra Campbell, PT, as a Director of Clinical
3	Education, discussed her consistent interaction with
4	clinical instructors. She referenced other states
5	that permit clinical instructors to include the
6	supervising students, which challenges the instructors
7	and the students. Ms. Grzybek voiced her support of
8	this initiative.
9	Mr. Ruiz explained the procedures for developing
10	a regulatory change.
11	Scott Voshell, Vice President, Pennsylvania
12	Physical Therapy Association (PPTA), provided
13	informational material related to student clinical
14	education and dry needling.
15	Mr. Voshell thanked the Board for their time and
16	dedication to the people of Pennsylvania, as well as
17	the Physical Therapy profession. He discussed the
18	importance and the need for clinical education for
19	physical therapy students. He noted the increased
20	productivity demands on clinicians and facilities so
21	students may complete clinical assignments.
22	Mr. Voshell suggested the Board form a task force
23	to establish rules and regulations to provide a
24	formula for awarding CEUs for the clinical instruction
25	of students.

Chairperson Potter voiced the Board's desire to 1 2 pursue this initiative. Mr. Ruiz discussed gathering 3 information and the steps for the Board to proceed 4 with rulemaking.] \* \* \* 5 6 Discussion - Dry Needling 7 [Scott Voshell referred to his handouts related to proposed dry needling regulations. PPTA recognizes 8 the Board's authority to prepare rules and regulations 9 10 for the safe practice of dry needling, as well as its 11 responsibility to develop education and practice 12 standards. 13 Mr. Voshell discussed the capabilities and 14 continuing education of physical therapists to perform 15 dry needling within their scope of practice. He noted the potential for opposition from other healthcare 16 professionals. He offered PPTA's willingness to 17 18 participate with any state regulatory authority to 19 facilitate the process for dry needling rulemaking. 20 Chairperson Potter offered the Board's position 21 and input on this particular topic. Mr. Ruiz 2.2 discussed commencing a legislative initiative on the 23 matter. 24 Mr. Voshell offered to provide additional

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25 information and a presentation on dry needling to the

Board at a future meeting. The Board appreciated the 1 2 offer but felt it was not necessary. The Board 3 discussed providing support letters to the appropriate 4 legislators.] \* \* \* 5 6 Discussion - Eligibility before graduation 7 [Mr. Ruiz discussed an email from Wayne C. Crawford, Esquire, Executive Director of the Professional 8 9 Licensure Committee, questioning the Board's desire to 10 amend Section 40.15 to permit students to take the state exam prior to actual graduation. 11 12 Chairperson Potter discussed the current 13 participation and criteria of Pennsylvania schools. 14 She noted the debt of students coming out of school 15 and their desire to find employment sooner. 16 Chairperson Potter supported the regulatory change on 17 this matter. 18 Ms. Campbell discussed the challenges for students to timely sit for the exam. She reviewed the 19 20 conforming regulations of neighboring states. The benefits to Pennsylvania to move forward with this 21 22 regulation change were noted, particularly keeping the 23 students in Pennsylvania. 24 Mr. Ruiz will review the practices of other State 25 Boards to permit students to sit for exams prior to

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graduation. The Board directed Board Counsel to move 1 2 forward with a regulatory change on this matter.] \* \* \* 3 Discussion - Telemedicine 4 5 [Ms. Grzybek discussed a letter from Medrisk regarding 6 the availability of Telerehab. Medrisk is offering 7 continued physical therapy treatments through 8 telerehabilitation. She noted many questions related to the safety and security of patients, as well as the 9 10 liability of physical therapists performing the initial evaluation. 11 12 Mr. Ruiz advised the Board to refer the matter to 13 the Prosecutorial Division to investigate and bring back to the Board for further determination. 14 15 The Board agreed to continue its discussion 16 regarding regulating telemedicine in Pennsylvania.] \* \* \* 17 18 Appointment - Applicant Jennifer Wilson request for 19 3rd attempt 20 [Jennifer Wilson, Applicant, provided information to the Board supporting her request for a third attempt 21 22 to sit for the exam on July 10, 2018. She reviewed 23 her efforts to study and prepare for the exam, as well 24 as dealing with her testing anxiety. Ms. Wilson 25 discussed her strengths with working with patients,

such as being a good hands-on learner and 1 2 motivationally positive with patients.] \* \* \* 3 4 Appointment - Applicant Aubrey Lindner request for 5 3rd attempt [Aubrey Lindner, Applicant, provided information to 6 7 the Board supporting her request for a third attempt to sit for the exam on July 10, 2018. She reviewed 8 her current study plan utilizing a mentor, 9 10 ScoreBuilders Basecamp, ACE, and the NPT app. Ms. 11 Lindner discussed overcoming failures with scenario 12 questions.] \* \* \* 13 14 Report of Commissioner - No Report \* \* \* 15 16 Report of Board Administrator 17 [Michelle Roberts, Board Administrator, noted the 18 Security Awareness Training to be conducted by the 19 Board after its Executive Session.] \* \* \* 20 21 [J. J. Thomas presented before the Board and provided 22 a brief summary of her professional background. She 23 commended the Board for their commitment to serving 24 the people of Pennsylvania. 25 Ms. Thomas requested the Board reconsider the

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1 offer for an expert to educate the Board from a
2 physical therapist's perspective on dry needling. She
3 urged the Board to become a governing body on the
4 matter.

5 Chairperson Potter stated a representative of the 6 FSBPT provided a demonstration on dry needling to the 7 Board in the past. Ms. Thomas noted changes to the 8 practice since the demonstration.

9 Chairperson Potter noted that the Board does not 10 have legislative authority on acupuncture. She 11 reviewed the Board's familiarity and support for 12 changes in this practice. Mr. Ruiz referred to the 13 definition of acupuncture under the Acupuncture 14 Licensure Act.

Ms. Thomas disputed dry needling falling under the practice of acupuncture. She discussed overlaps in the scope of practice between manipulative professions.]
