3 * * * 1 2 State Board of Physical Therapy 3 July 19, 2018 * * * 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 6 Board of Physical Therapy was held on Thursday, July 7 19, 2018. * * * 8 9 Official Call to Order 10 [Cynthia Potter, PT, Chairperson, officially called 11 the meeting to order at 9 a.m. 12 Chairperson Potter welcomed Christopher Staub and 13 Attorney Tom Davis. 14 Jeffrey R. Elliott was not present at the 15 commencement of the meeting.] * * * 16 17 Approval of Minutes of the May 17, 2018 meeting CHAIRPERSON POTTER: 18 19 The next item is the approval of the 20 minutes. Any additions or corrections? [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.] 21 2.2 CHAIRPERSON POTTER: 23 Any other additions or corrections? 24 If not, is there a motion to approve? 25 MS. GRZYBEK:

So moved. 1 2 MS. CAMPBELL: 3 Second. 4 CHAIRPERSON POTTER: 5 It's been moved and seconded to adopt 6 the minutes. All in favor, say aye. 7 Opposed, no? 8 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 9 10 Report of Prosecutorial Division 11 [Jason T. Anderson, Esquire, Board Prosecution 12 Liaison, noted a reinstatement hearing scheduled for 13 10:00 a.m. and an Adjudication and Order for 14 discussion during Executive Session.] * * * 15 16 Report of Board Chairperson 17 [Cynthia Potter, PT, Chairperson, addressed Governor Wolf's recommendations from Executive Order 2017-03 18 19 regarding professional licensure. 20 Ms. Lambert encouraged the Board to review the 21 report available on the website. She encouraged 22 suggestions and/or feedback from the Board. Ms. 23 Potter stated the data will support the Board in 24 making decisions and progressing regarding the issue 25 of decreasing barriers to licensure.]

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5 1 MS. ROBERTS: 2 What we would need is a motion to elect 3 Cindy Potter as the delegate to 4 represent the Board. MS. GRZYBEK: 5 6 So moved. 7 MR. ROBB: I'll second. 8 9 CHAIRPERSON POTTER: 10 It's been moved and seconded to elect 11 Ms. Potter as the delegate to the 12 federation. Any discussion? All in 13 favor, say aye. Opposed, no? Abstentions? 14 15 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 16 17 Report of Board Counsel 18 [Juan Ruiz, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted matters for 19 discussion in Executive Session. Mr. Ruiz noted a 20 Motion to Deem Facts Admitted and Enter Default that 21 has been withdrawn. 2.2 Mr. Ruiz discussed continuing education for 23 clinical instruction for PT and PTA students, as well 24 as taking the National Physical Therapy Examination 25 prior to graduation. He referred to two regulations

1 for amendment relating to credit for clinical 2 instruction.

Ms. Grzybek suggested not exceeding more than 8 hours in a two-year period and creating an online form for the site coordinators to complete. She stated that the licensee would then be given the completed form for verification of hours. The Board would then have a record for audit purposes.

9 Mr. Staub suggested two to three hours per year 10 or a total of six hours over the course of a two-year 11 period would be reasonable, noting that the hours 12 should be applicable to direct access with a total of 13 four credits over two years. He emphasized that the 14 differential diagnosis be the main component in any 15 type of teaching setting.

Ms. Campbell suggested providing a limitation to four hours and requiring less than half of the differential diagnosis credits required of direct access certificate holders.

Ms. Grzybek requested to include that individuals be APTA Credentialed Clinical Instructor Program Level or Level 2 as a suggestion and not mandatory in the regulation.

24 Mr. Ruiz reviewed the regulatory process for25 promulgating a regulation.

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Ms. Campbell noted that the Commission 1 2 Accreditation in Physical Therapy Education (CAPTE), 3 which is the accrediting body for PT education, requires 31 or 32 weeks of full-time clinical 4 5 educational experience defined as 35-40 hours a week. 6 She reviewed clinical experiences for PT students, 7 noting 40 hours, which is 1-contact hour out of the 30, looking at an 8-week clinical experience. 8 Ms. Campbell also noted that the accrediting body 9 10 requires full-time weekly, defined as 35-40 hours a 11 week with flexibility. 12 Mr. Ruiz noted a 1-credit hour per 40 hours of instruction for a max total of 4 credit hours. 13 14 Ms. Grzybek added, in a 2-year period applicable 15 to general license or direct access license but not 16 both, 4 total for the individual.] * * * 17 18 [Jeffrey R. Elliott entered the meeting at 9:10 a.m.] * * * 19 20 Appointment - Applicant, Lauren Noecker - Request for 21 3rd Attempt 22 [Lauren Noecker addressed the Board to request a third 23 attempt at the physical therapy assistant examination. 24 Ms. Noecker was enrolled in an online prep class for 25 the Board exam, reviewing materials, and purchased

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score reports to better prepare in areas where she did 1 2 not do well during the exam.] * * * 3 4 Appointment - Applicant, Christopher Tiffany - Request 5 for 3rd Attempt 6 [Christopher Tiffany addressed the Board to request a 7 third attempt at the physical therapy examination. Mr. Tiffany was working on a strategy to be better 8 9 prepared for a third attempt. He was using the 10 results from ScoreBuilders tests to review issues, to 11 add study tools, and to take an online review course. 12 He will work more with his teachers and found a mentor 13 through his current part-time job.] 14 * * * 15 Report of Board Counsel (Continued) 16 [Juan Ruiz, Esquire, Board Counsel, discussed the 17 ability for candidates to take the NPTE prior to 18 graduation as a manner of removing barriers to 19 licensure. Mr. Ruiz discussed the need to change the 20 wording in the regulation. 21 Ms. Grzybek was in favor of schools providing a 2.2 letter to indicate that a candidate was suitable to 23 test. 24 Ms. Campbell stated that the Federation of the 25 State Boards of Physical Therapy actually has an

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online process for registered candidates. 1 She 2 explained that West Virginia uses the federation portal for verification of a candidate. 3 Ms. Roberts stated individuals would still send 4 5 an application and transcript to the state for 6 approval. 7 Ms. Grzybek noted the importance of the student concentrating on their clinical rotation and was in 8 9 favor of a time frame between 60 to 90 days.] 10 MR. RUIZ: Is there a motion to direct Counsel to 11 12 draft proposed annexes for the Board to review at a future Board meeting 13 14 concerning the continuing education for 15 clinical instructors and the ability for 16 students to take the NPTE prior to 17 graduation? MS. CAMPBELL: 18 19 So moved. 20 MS. GRZYBEK: 21 Second. 2.2 CHAIRPERSON POTTER: 23 The motion has been moved and seconded. 24 Any further discussion? All in favor, 25 say aye. Opposed, no? Abstentions?

Harlow, Commissioner of Professional and 13 Occupational Affairs, updated the Board on the 14 Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS), noting a new 15 support call center with options to talk to Board staff and a menu option for technical support. 16 17 Ms. Lambert noted modernized operations with an 18 automated workload and offered a complete presentation 19 in the future. 20 * * * 21 Report of Board Administrator 22 [Michelle Roberts, Board Administrator, noted the Case 23 Status Report, 2018 remaining Board meeting dates, and 2.4 2019 Board meeting dates. 25 Scott Voshell, Vice President, Pennsylvania

Physical Therapy Association, questioned fee reduction
in licensure. Mr. Ruiz replied Mr. Blackburn was
still drafting the fee package.

Mr. Voshell questioned whether there has been any 4 movement on contracting out CE approval. Ms. Roberts 5 6 stated the regulation that allows for ProCert approval 7 had passed as final. She also noted the acceptance of matters approved by the American Physical Therapy 8 9 Association (APTA) or any of its sections or chapters. 10 Mr. Voshell questioned whether there would be an option for a larger institution to obtain preapproval 11 12 instead of going through the entire process. Ms. Roberts stated there was no fee to apply for 13 14 preapproved provider status.] * * * 15 16 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 17 11:27 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 18 with Juan Ruiz, Esquire, Board Counsel, and Thomas 19 Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the purpose of 20 conducting quasi-judicial deliberations. The Board 21 returned to open session at 11:55 a.m.] * * * 22 23 MOTIONS 2.4 MR. RUIZ: 25 The Board was just in Executive Session
