Board members for making sure the timely obligation for discussion of Act 53 is met.

Commissioner Johnson discussed, in his capacity as Commissioner, scheduling public hearings to publicly engage members of the business community about the proposed lists of criminal convictions that would be applicable to licensing determinations. He stated this forum was provided for these business members to discuss any questions or concerns about the list.

Deputy Chief Counsel Montgomery provided further information about the list. She indicated that under Section 3117 of Act 53 of 2020 it was the duty of the Commissioner to publish this list of convictions that may constitute grounds to refuse to issue, suspend or revoke a license, registration or permit. As a subset, the list included those directly related to the trade, occupation or profession.

Ms. Montgomery stated the list has been disseminated to this Board's list of interested parties and stakeholders, including associations, individuals, and educational institutions. She indicated the only comment the Board received was from a prior Board member who stated that organized crime should be added to the list. Ms. Montgomery added

that after the list was put out, the Board was asked to revise them to specifically identify the crimes that are directly related to the profession versus those that are impacted under Sections 3112 (d), (e) and (f).

Dr. Salvatore Cullari inquired as to whether organized crime should be added, and further inquired as to the definition of "professional licenses" as listed under 18 Pa. C.S. §3022 on the list. Ms. Lutz referred to the Crimes Code for further explanation of that definition.

Dr. Erickson inquired if his understanding that one could commit murder and obtain a professional license, but if a sexual assault was committed, one would never be able to obtain licensure as a healthcare provider in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania under the statute was correct. Ms. Lutz noted that is what is indicated in the statute. There was further explanation offered.

Board members held additional discussion with regard to including organized crime on its list of criminal offenses. Chairman Small noted for the record that no Board members objected. Those members of the audience online were asked to comment. It was noted there were no other questions or comments.
