Small, Ph.D., Chairman, called the meeting to order at 8:59 a.m. Dean Maynard, Ed.D., Public Member, was sworn in 10 as the Board's new public member prior to the 11 commencement of today's meeting. * * * 12 13 [Chris Stuckey, Board Administrator, reviewed the 14 emergency evacuation procedures for One Penn Center.] 15 16 [Chairman Small requested the introduction of Board 17 members.1 * * * 18 19 Approval of minutes of the December 2, 2019 meeting 20 CHAIRMAN SMALL: 21 Has everybody read the Minutes and does 22 anybody want to make a motion to approve 23 the minutes? 2.4 DR. Alan Tepper, Esquire, was present on 11 behalf of the Respondent.] * * * 12 13 [Tara Wikhian, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented 14 the Consent Agreements for File No. 17-63-012427.] 15 16 Report of Board Counsel 17 [Jackie Wiest Lutz, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred 18 Board members to information regarding House Bill 2110 19 introduced December 9, 2019, which requires all 20 applicants with health-related licenses to complete 21 training in implicit bias and cultural competence in 22 accordance with continuing education requirements. 2.3 She stated Senate Bill 67, which would allow 24 psychologists in other states to practice through 25 telecommunication with patients in Pennsylvania, was

unanimously approved by the House Committee. In addition, the House Committee also unanimously approved House Bill 1566, which would allow professional licensing boards to issue advisory opinions at the request of a licensee.

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Ms. Lutz referred to the Status of Cases as listed on the agenda and discussed two closed cases prior to her assuming the position of Board Counsel.

Ms. Lutz noted three cases that would be discussed during Executive Session.

Board members were referred to the Status of Regulations for further discussion. Ms. Lutz commented that the Board had finally been given the green light with regard to moving regulations through, which included 16A-6317, Continuing Education Regulation. Ms. Lutz updated the regulation to include suicide prevention as mandatory continuing education and was awaiting Board approval of the Annex.

She reminded members that the language was approved by the Board back in roughly 2015 but went nowhere. She reminded the Board that the bracketed information was being proposed by the Board to be removed; the underlined information was being proposed to be added by the Board. She instructed the Board on

15 [Chris Stuckey, Board Administrator, reviewed for Dr.

16 Maynard the fact that the Board had in August voted to

17 | waive Section 41.32 of the Board's Regulations for

18 Applicants who began an APA accredited doctoral

19 program on or after September of 2015, and that this

20 was due to the fact that their practicum experience

21 | meets the requirements for supervised experience for

22 | individuals who began their program on or after that

23 date.

24 She noted that the Board had gone a little

25 | farther, and said that for those people, we still must

receive a letter from the Director of Clinical
Training providing the dates, the number of months,
and the number of hours, to make sure that they did in
fact do 1,750 hours of practicum experience. And if
it turned out that they did not, then they could do
some post doctoral experience to bring their total
supervised experience to 1,750 hours.

Ms. Stuckey received a couple comments, including someone who had begun a graduate program in the fall of 2015, yet technically the first day of classes was the end of August of 2015. She asked Board members to comment regarding the matter.

Chairman Small explained that for many years the Board required one year of predoctoral internship followed by a year of supervised experience. He noted that this "overhauled" regulation provides for two years of practicum and internship experience before an individual receives a doctorate license.

The Board was in favor of removing the September of 2015 and adding that an individual who began an APA accredited doctoral program on or after the Fall Semester of 2015.

Ms. Stuckey inquired if Board still wanted to consider accepting practicum experience only in the doctoral program and not in the master's program.

Rachael Baturin, MPH, JD, PA Psychological Association, will review the matter with her colleagues and advise the Board.

Ms. Stuckey read into the record the following: that if predoctoral practicum hours from graduate school, i.e., hours prior to internship, were completed at community placements such as local hospitals or schools, but there was always a primary supervisor at the graduate university, can the primary graduate mentors sign off on those hours or do verifications of experience forms need to be filled out by the supervisors at the actual site. Board members had further discussion regarding the matter.

Dr. Erickson commented that it should be the person that assumes the oversight of the quality of technical aspects of the work that is being done during the practicum, or whoever can attest to the quality and level of supervision.

Ms. Stuckey inquired if practicum experience at less than 15 hours per week should be excluded from counting towards the required supervised experience. Chairman Small responded yes.]
