        Dr. McAleer questioned whether recent revisions
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of the Practice Act as well as Act 41 under the background and purpose section would be an appropriate place to mention those revisions and regulations. He questioned whether the law changing was part of the reason as far as the education.

Ms. Stuckey explained much of what was in the regulation package was due to the fact that the law changed regarding experience and removing the requirement that one year of the experience be completed after the award of the doctoral degree.

Ms. Lutz commented that it would be helpful to add that to the background and purpose section and will make amendments for the August agenda.

Ms. Lutz referred to \S 41.30(b)(2) and requested information from the Board regarding additional language.

Dr. Spayd explained the Board needed confirmation of the practicum hours. She commented that the Board did not need information about postdoctoral supervision as the individual would have already graduated by then. She stated the language needed to not include postdoctoral supervision.

Ms. Stuckey agreed that individuals would be out of their doctoral programs by that point in time, and any kind of postdoctoral experience would be verified

by the supervisor, not by the director of clinical
training at the doctoral program.

Ms. Stuckey suggested language to state individuals needed to verify a minimum of 1,750 hours in a predoctoral internship during an APA-accredited doctoral program and the amount of practicum experience within the APA doctoral program. Then from that number provided to the Board by the director of clinical training, the Board would determine whether additional experience would be needed to be done postdoctorally.

Ms. Lutz noted modifying the Annex language to read, "and the amount of practicum experience within an APA-accredited doctoral program."

Ms. Stuckey also noted to include the number of hours because that would be what the Board would consider in determining whether there needed to be more experience completed postdoctorally.

Dr. McAleer suggested removing "having completed at least 2 years of acceptable experience." He referred to § 41.30(b)(2), and suggested the language read, "in a sealed envelope signed by the director of clinical training on the envelope flap, verification from the clinical director of training at an APA-accredited doctoral program of having completed
