Psychological Association (PPA) convention, such as the Board's function, PSYPACT, EPPP, supervised experience requirement, and the status of the Board's regulations.

Ms. Wucinski noted the appointment of new Regulatory
Counsel to move regulations forward. Dr. McAleer
requested that a member of Regulatory Counsel attend
