2 State Board of Psychology

3 August 12, 2019

5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State  
6 Board of Psychology was held on Monday, August 12,  
7 2019. Vito J. DonGiovanni, Psy.D., Chairman, called  
8 the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m.

9 \*\*\*

10 [Chris Stuckey, Board Administrator, reviewed the  
11 emergency evacuation procedures for One Penn Center.]

12 \*\*\*

13 [Chairman DonGiovanni noted the formal hearing  
14 scheduled for 1 p.m.]

15 \*\*\*

16 Appointment - Carolyn A. DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy  
17 Chief Counsel, Prosecution Division Presentation  
18 [Carolyn A. DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy Chief  
19 Counsel, Prosecution Division, introduced herself and  
20 provided a brief summary of her professional  
21 background.

22 Ms. DeLaurentis provided information for the  
23 Pennsylvania State Board of Psychology for  
24 FY 2018-2019, noting that 79 cases were opened with 88  
25 open files as of July 1, 2019.

1 Ms. DeLaurentis noted 14 warning letters, 2  
2 suspensions, 4 reprimands, 2 voluntary surrenders, and  
3 3 probations issued.

4 Ms. DeLaurentis noted 69 immediate temporary  
5 suspensions, in general, for the prosecution division  
6 in FY 2018-2019 with 11,359 open cases as of July 1,  
7 2019. She reviewed the last fiscal year, noting that  
8 14,030 cases were opened, which was up from 12,604 the  
9 prior year. She also noted 13,270 closed files the  
10 last fiscal year.

11 Ms. DeLaurentis addressed the Pennsylvania  
12 Justice Network (JNET), where the prosecution division  
13 receives an alert when licensees from all of the  
14 Boards and Commissions are charged with a crime.

15 Ms. DeLaurentis noted that the Bureau of  
16 Enforcement and Investigation (BEI) attempts to serve  
17 the immediate temporary suspensions on the same day.  
18 She also commended the prosecutors for their great  
19 work.

20 Ms. DeLaurentis discussed the Office of General  
21 Counsel's Mediation Program, which is at no cost to  
22 licensees or the Board. She stated the consent  
23 agreements will reflect whether the cases were  
24 resolved through mediation.]

1 Report of Board Prosecution

2 [Nathan C. Giunta, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison,  
3 presented the Consent Agreement for File No. 17-63-  
4 05663.

5 Allan M. Tepper, J.D., Psy.D., Esquire, Counsel  
6 for the Respondent, was also present and participated  
7 in the discussion.]

8 \*\*\*

9 Approval of minutes of the June 17, 2019 meeting

10 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI:

11 Approval of the minutes from the last  
12 meeting. Did everybody have a chance to  
13 read the minutes? Any additions or  
14 corrections?

15 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.]

16 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI:

17 Any other additions or corrections?  
18 Hearing none. I entertain a motion to  
19 approve.

20 DR. MCALEER:

21 So moved.

22 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI:

23 Dr. McAleer.

24 DR. BRADLEY:

25 Second.



1 refusal.

2 Ms. Wucinski stated Act 41 also allows for a  
3 provisional license, which she then equated to the  
4 Board's temporary license. She explained that a  
5 holder of the provisional license may practice until  
6 the license is denied by the Board, the provisional  
7 license expires, or the holder fails to comply with  
8 the terms of the provisional license.

9 Ms. Wucinski informed the Board of the need for  
10 discussion regarding substantial equivalence. She  
11 mentioned the American Psychological Association  
12 (APA) accreditation, stating that it is not equivalent  
13 but noting the need to determine whether regional  
14 accreditation is substantially equivalent concerning  
15 competency. She referred to CE or working two years  
16 of the last five years in the profession or any other  
17 method the Board feels would establish competency.

18 Ms. Wucinski suggested creating a committee to  
19 review applications in between Board meetings so  
20 licensees do not have to wait until the next Board  
21 meeting when applying under Act 41. She noted that  
22 Act 41 was passed to help military spouses.

23 Ms. Wucinski addressed state exams, noting that  
24 the Board would need to review the requirements in  
25 other states to determine if the other state's

1 requirement is substantially equivalent to the  
2 requirements in Pennsylvania. She commented that  
3 individuals who come to Pennsylvania will not have to  
4 take the state exam, and if they meet the requirements  
5 for Act 41, the individuals may obtain a license.

6 Ms. Wucinski addressed the provisional license,  
7 where individuals who come to Pennsylvania can start  
8 practicing on a provisional license immediately if the  
9 Board determines appropriate CE and competency.

10 Chairman DonGiovanni discussed residency  
11 requirements, noting prior denials due to residency  
12 requirements not being sufficient and meeting  
13 Pennsylvania's regulations.

14 Ms. Wucinski referred to item 6 on the agenda for  
15 discussion during Executive Session. She commented  
16 that people will be applying in Pennsylvania who are  
17 not from APA-accredited schools but have been licensed  
18 in another state for at least two years and have been  
19 practicing without incident or issues.

20 Ms. Wucinski explained that individuals must be  
21 licensed in another state and actively practicing.  
22 She commented that original endorsement regulations  
23 are not banished and that Act 41 is just an  
24 alternative path to licensure by endorsement. She  
25 noted that the Board's current standards are



1 equivalent, not substantially equivalent.

2 Ms. Lambert noted Act 41 to be another tool in  
3 the toolbox for licensure, where Pennsylvania is not  
4 looking at the licensees on an individual basis for  
5 their qualifications and are considering the other  
6 state's regulations and requirements. She explained  
7 that requirements from the state the individual is  
8 coming from would be reviewed.

9 Ms. Wucinski commented that individuals in  
10 Pennsylvania must complete an APA-accredited doctoral  
11 program, and Walden and Capella online schools are  
12 regionally accredited, which is where determining  
13 substantial equivalence is important. She commented  
14 that the guidelines are to be utilized in future Board  
15 meetings and also by the committee created today to  
16 use when receiving Act 41 applications.

17 Dr. Spayd suggested contacting the Association of  
18 State and Provincial Psychology Boards (ASPPB) to  
19 determine the minimum CE requirements in other states.

20 Dr. McAleer commented that CE accomplishment is  
21 one of the lowest levels of competency and is why  
22 ASPPB is considering developing other tests pertaining  
23 to competency used nationwide in addition to the  
24 knowledge portion.

25 Mr. McAleer commented that APA accreditation

1 actually serves both the education and the competency  
2 portion. The Board is beginning to consider and  
3 examine on a case-by-case basis students who have  
4 graduated from APA programs and looking at perhaps  
5 using their practica experience to be equivalent.

6 Chairman DonGiovanni suggested that applicants  
7 should have at least 30 hours of CE, including 3 of  
8 ethics, in the past two or three years.

9 Chairman DonGiovanni and Dr. McAleer offered to  
10 be on the committee to review applications.

11 Rachael Baturin, MHP, JD, Pennsylvania  
12 Psychological Association, mentioned that about five  
13 states do not require CE at all, and the minimum  
14 requirements for CEs in some of the other states is 20  
15 a year.

16 Ms. Wucinski noted that the competency section  
17 would include a provisional license, where individuals  
18 make up what they are lacking while working. She also  
19 noted that the Board could require that individuals  
20 must have been practicing two of the last five years  
21 in the profession.

22 Ms. Wucinski confirmed the Board's discussion of  
23 at least 30 hours of CE in the last two years with at  
24 least 3 hours in ethics. She questioned the Board  
25 whether there would be any additional hours.

1           Chairperson DonGiovanni commented that at least 3  
2 hours for potential licensees to learn about  
3 Pennsylvania regulations and laws without taking the  
4 exam.

5           Ms. Wucinski provided a summary of the Board's  
6 decision regarding Act 41, where the Board wants to  
7 have practice two of the last five years and wants to  
8 review the CE from the state the licensee is licensed  
9 to confirm at least 30 hours of CE in the last 2 years  
10 with at least 3 in ethics. She noted that the Board  
11 also wants to make it a requirement that individuals  
12 complete at least a 3-hour course regarding  
13 Pennsylvania regulations that could be part of the 30  
14 hours.

15           Ms. Wucinski commented that information is still  
16 being gathered to determine how Act 41 is going to be  
17 created, whether it will be one regulation that  
18 applies to all Boards or looking at an addendum to  
19 their existing endorsement regulations for each  
20 individual Board. She stated the Boards have to come  
21 up with what they feel is competent, which will be the  
22 standard currently used.

23           Ms. Guilfoyle noted a concern with individuals in  
24 another state who know they are going to lose their  
25 license but have no disciplinary charges pending.

1 Ms. Wucinski stated complaints come in all the  
2 time against licensees, and the act does not require  
3 them to notify the Board if they have been questioned  
4 but should answer the questions honestly because it  
5 could be held against them in the future.

6 Ms. Wucinski addressed the provisional license,  
7 noting that the Board could just defer to the existing  
8 regulation of six months with one renewal.

9 Ms. Baturin questioned whether individuals would  
10 need the suicide and the child abuse CE. Ms. Stuckey  
11 explained that new applicants who want to get a PA  
12 license must take a 3-hour course in child abuse and a  
13 2-hour course for renewal. She stated the child abuse  
14 course is not required to receive a temporary license  
15 but will be needed if it is converted to a permanent  
16 license.

17 Chairman DonGiovanni questioned whether it can be  
18 mandated to require 1 credit for suicide prevention as  
19 part of that 30 hours of CE. Ms. Wucinski will  
20 research the issue. She mentioned that the Board will  
21 be giving the committee authority to grant licensure,  
22 but any questions regarding individuals meeting the  
23 requirements of Act 41 will go in front of the Board  
24 at the next Board meeting.

25 Ms. Wucinski referred to the proposed rulemaking

1 package concerning 16A-6320 regarding qualifications  
2 for licensure regulation. She noted the need to  
3 review changes concerning Section 41.32 regarding  
4 experience qualifications.

5 Ms. Stuckey noted prior discussion by the  
6 directors of clinic training and the Board concerning  
7 the law change which removed the requirement that one  
8 of the two years of supervised experience be completed  
9 after the award of the doctoral degree. She explained  
10 that the Board is currently accepting the predoctoral  
11 internship as a first year and looking for the second  
12 year to come after, but from the information provided  
13 by the directors of clinical training, the practicum  
14 that is completed prior to the predoctoral internship  
15 meets the Board's requirements for supervised  
16 experience.

17 Ms. Stuckey stated the practicum requirements  
18 were changed in February 2015 and went into effect in  
19 November 2015. She referred to information received  
20 from Dr. Linda Knauss, where she indicated that if  
21 someone started their doctoral program in September  
22 2015 forward, the individual would already have two  
23 years of supervised experience when the individual  
24 completes the doctoral program and receives the  
25 degree.

1 Ms. Stuckey commented that if an individual  
2 started their doctoral program in September 2015 or  
3 forward, the Board would not need to look at any  
4 supervised experience because of the fact that their  
5 graduation would reflect the required two years from  
6 an APA-accredited doctoral program.

7 Ms. Wucinski noted that the section will remain  
8 in effect for all other applicants who might be coming  
9 in and graduated from an APA-accredited school. She  
10 suggested putting a subsection in that says all  
11 applicants who began their doctoral program after  
12 September 2015 from an APA-accredited school do not  
13 have to meet this requirement. She suggested taking a  
14 vote today to begin waiving the requirement while  
15 awaiting a change to the regulations.

16 Ms. Stuckey stated there is a notice on the  
17 Board's website with regard to the review of  
18 supervised experience. Ms. Wucinski suggested putting  
19 something under announcements and in the FAQs.

20 Ms. Stuckey noted that September 2015 or after is  
21 automatic. She noted the importance of it being clear  
22 on the transcript when someone started their program.  
23 She mentioned that the director of clinical training  
24 for the doctoral program completes a form to verify  
25 that the program was accredited. She noted that the

1 Board asks for the date of predoctoral internship,  
2 because when the Board is looking for that second year  
3 to come after that, the Board needs to know when the  
4 predoctoral internship is finished.

5 Ms. Stuckey commented that those who began a  
6 program September 2015 and forward are automatic and  
7 assumes that anyone who began their program prior to  
8 that would have the burden of proof.

9 Ms. Stuckey referred to Item No. 20 on the agenda  
10 regarding APA-Accreditation Standards for Practicum  
11 Training. She noted that Dr. Knauss provided a copy  
12 of the prior 2010 practicum requirements for APA for  
13 comparison.

14 Ms. Wucinski suggested the addition of a  
15 subsection that states, "or can show they completed  
16 the requirements outlined in these regulations while  
17 in their doctoral program in an APA-accredited  
18 school."

19 Ms. Wucinski referred to Section 41.52, noting  
20 the amendment or addition, "or other country" in  
21 accordance with the Act 41. She questioned removing  
22 or adding language to the regulation that will allow  
23 people from non-APA-accredited schools after a certain  
24 number of years. She questioned whether the Board  
25 wanted to have a standard or keep those case-by-case

1 to see if they are exceptional in the field of  
2 psychology or have a standard that states they have  
3 been practicing.

4 Chairperson DonGiovanni preferred a case-by-case  
5 basis. He questioned whether a subcommittee would  
6 need to be formed concerning requirements of both  
7 legislation and ethical changes in terms of APA.

8 Chairman DonGiovanni requested an extra Board  
9 meeting in September for regulatory review.

10 Ms. Stuckey informed the Board that Cindy  
11 Montgomery will be attending the October meeting for a  
12 review of the regulatory process.]

13 \*\*\*

14 MS. WUCINSKI:

15 I believe the Board will entertain a  
16 motion to waive the Board's regulation  
17 at 49 Pa. Code 41.32(a) for any  
18 applicant who began their doctoral  
19 program from an APA-accredited program  
20 on or after September 2015. That  
21 portion of the regulations will remain  
22 in effect for all other applicants.

23 DR. MCALEER:

12 Professional and Occupational Affairs, on behalf of  
13 Acting Commissioner, K. Kalonji Johnson, reported on  
14 the operational work of implementing Act 41. She  
15 stated PALS was being updated in terms of questions to  
16 accommodate those applications. She explained that  
17 applicants will apply for a new license, and the  
18 system will direct them to the appropriate  
19 application.

20 Ms. Lambert stated a new application will  
21 eventually be created once the regulations are in  
22 place. She commented that endorsement applications  
23 are currently being used and applicants may be asked  
24 for additional documentation.]
