19 Child Abuse Reporting Requirements - Proposed

20 Rulemaking (16A-6322)

21 [Cynthia Montgomery, Esquire, Deputy Chief Counsel,

22 referred Board members to the updated Annex and

23 Preamble for further discussion of the Child Abuse

24 Reporting Requirements Regulation, 16A-6322.

Ms. Montgomery noted that from 2014 through

November of 2019 the Child Protective Services had 1 2 undergone significant amendments including one to 3 Section 41.1, Definitions, the definition of child 4 The most recent addition was regarding abuse. 5 engaging a child in a severe form of trafficking and 6 leaving a child with a person determined to be a sexually violent predator or who has to register for life under SORNA or what is referred to as Megan's 9 Law.

The name of the Department of Public Welfare was changed to the Department of Human Services wherever it appeared in the regulations. The definition of mandated reporter was added, and to be clear, this Board requested that the term include the people that are being supervised as well because under Section 3311 of the Child Protective Services Law, individuals supervised by the psychologist are also mandated reporters.

Ms. Montgomery explained why the definition of perpetrator which was planned on being deleted was added back in and talked about new definitions that were added to the Child Protective Services Law.

Ms. Montgomery noted that with regard to Section 41.13, reactivation of licensure, the mandatory training requirements under the Child Protective

Services Law were added in. With regard to Section 4130, completion of three hours of training in child abuse recognition and reporting was added. Section 4152 was amended to require at least three hours of training in child abuse recognition and reporting for those applying for a license from another state.

Continuing Education, Section 41.59, was updated to include the required two hours of continuing education in relation to child abuse recognition and reporting. A provision provides that excess hours of child abuse recognition reporting may not be carried over.

Under Exemptions, Ms. Montgomery pointed out that two hours of mandatory training in child abuse could not be excluded or exempted except in accordance with Section 3170, where an exemption process is noted specifically for those hours.

Ms. Montgomery explained the substantial amendments to the child abuse reporting requirements under Section 41.71 including the duty to report, the personal duty to report not to be deferred to an organization or somebody in charge of an organization, the new reporting process and the content of the report. She noted a minor amendment to Section 41.72 which includes submission of photographs, medical

tests and x-ray of child within 48 hours.

Ms. Montgomery explained a minor amendment to Section 41.73, which relates to the suspected death as a result of child abuse, an amendment to Section 41.74, immunity from liability had been amended to conform to amendments in the Child Protective Services Law.

Section 41.75 refers to confidentiality and that privileged communications between a reporter and a patient or client does not apply to the situation involving child abuse and does not relieve the mandated report of the duty to make the report.

Section 41.76 concerns an increase in penalties with regard to noncompliance. Section 41.77 sets forth the mandatory training requirements and exemptions put in place by Act 31 of 2014. Section 178 is the Board approval process that has been in place since January of 2015.

Ms. Montgomery stated the Preamble is an overview of the regulation that gets published with the proposed amendments. Dr. DonGiovanni referred Ms. Montgomery to areas of the Annex that had not changed the Department of Public Welfare to Department of Human Services.]

A copy of House Bill 64 would be placed on the October agenda for review. For purposes of this regulation package Board members agreed to leave the language as proposed.

Regarding Section 41.59(c)(4) concerning credits obtained for professional writing and the Board's proposed ten continuing education credits reduced to five, Ms. Lutz indicated that the PPA suggested that it remain the same. PPA is also recommending that an author should be able to obtain credits for professional writing without having to divide the number of credits earned by the authors of the publication.

The Board proposed to delete Subsection (k)

Curing Deficiencies, and the PPA does not understand why this section was being removed and seeks clarification. Ms. Lutz commented that an explanation provided in the Preamble should be sufficient.
