3 \* \* \* 1 2 State Board of Psychology 3 August 6, 2018 \* \* \* 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 6 Board of Psychology was held on Monday, August 6, 7 2018. Vito J. DonGiovanni, Psy.D., Chairman, called 8 the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m. \* \* \* 9 10 [Chairman DonGiovanni welcomed Dr. McAleer to his 11 first formal meeting.] \* \* \* 12 13 [Chris Stuckey, Board Administrator, reviewed the 14 emergency evacuation procedures for One Penn Center.] \* \* \* 15 16 Approval of Minutes of the June 12, 2018 meeting CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 17 18 Approval of minutes of the June 12 19 meeting. 20 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.] 21 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 22 Any other changes, amendments? All 23 those in favor of approving the minutes 24 as amended, please answer aye. Those 25 opposed?

[The motion carried unanimously.] 1 \* \* \* 2 3 Report of Board Prosecution 4 [Bridget K. Guilfoyle, Esquire, Board Prosecution 5 Liaison, introduced Alissa Harrison, Esquire, as a new 6 Board Prosecutor. Ms. Guilfoyle also noted Tara 7 Smith, Esquire, another Prosecutor joining the Board. Chairman DonGiovanni welcomed Ms. Harrison.] 8 \* \* \* 9 10 Report of Board Counsel 11 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 12 9:09 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session with Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, and for 13 14 the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations 15 on a number of matters that are currently pending 16 before the Board and to receive advice of Counsel. 17 The Board returned to open session at 10:47 a.m.] \* \* \* 18 19 [The Board recessed from 10:47 a.m. until 10:51 a.m.] 20 \* \* \* 21 MOTIONS 2.2 MS. WUCINSKI: 23 Having returned from Executive Session, 24 I believe the Board will entertain a 25 motion to deny the Motion for Early

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5 Termination of Probation of Deborah Jean 1 2 Greqq, M.A. 3 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: I need a motion? 4 5 DR. ERICKSON: So moved. 6 7 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 8 So moved, Dr. Erickson. Second? 9 DR. MCALEER: 10 Second. 11 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 12 Second, Dr. McAleer. All those in 13 favor? Those opposed? 14 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 15 16 MS. WUCINSKI: 17 I believe the Board will entertain a 18 motion to approve the draft Adjudication and Order as final at File No. 17-63-19 20 12770, the name of that file being Keith 21 A. 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8 1 DR. SPAYD: 2 So moved. 3 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 4 So moved, Dr. Spayd. Second? 5 DR. BRADLEY: 6 Second. 7 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 8 Dr. Bradley. All those in favor? Those 9 opposed? 10 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 11 12 MS. WUCINSKI: I believe the Board will entertain a 13 14 motion to grant the Application to 15 Practice Psychology for Persons Licensed 16 in Other States for the following: Dawn 17 Marie Raffa-Yoo, Ph.D.; and Lindsey Lee 18 Wilner, Psy.D. 19 DR. SMALL: 20 So moved. 21 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 22 So moved, Dr. Small. 23 DR. MCALEER: 24 Second. 25 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI:

9 1 Second, Dr. McAleer. All those in favor? 2 Those opposed? 3 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 4 5 MS. WUCINSKI: 6 I want to note that the Board has 7 directed the Board Administrator to 8 request additional documentation of 9 experience for Ari Benjamin Deutsch, 10 Psy.D., from August 16, 2017, until the 11 present. \* \* \* 12 13 MS. WUCINSKI: 14 I believe the Board will entertain a 15 motion to approve the following 16 fictitious names: Philadelphia 17 Association for Couple and Family Psychology; Creative Solutions 18 Behavioral Health LLC; Elite Mindset PC; 19 20 Red Bird Mental Health Services LLC; 21 Healing Path Psychology LLC; North Shore Counseling Services; Premier Health 2.2 23 Psychology LLC; Center for Loss and 24 Recovery LLC; West End Counseling & 25 Wellness.

Those 9 opposed? 10 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 11 12 MS. WUCINSKI: 13 Agenda Item No. 25. The Board has directed the Board Administrator to send 14 15 correspondence to Carl J. Longosky, 16 M.A., requesting additional medical 17 documentation. And upon receipt of that documentation, I believe the Board will 18 19 entertain a motion to approve his 20 request to complete CE by home study for 21 the 2015 through 2017 biennial period. 22 DR. SPAYD: 23 So moved. 24 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 25 Motion, Dr. Spayd. Second?

1 DR. ERICKSON: 2 Second. 3 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 4 Second, Dr. Erickson. All those in 5 favor? Those opposed? 6 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 7 8 MS. WUCINSKI: 9 I believe the Board will entertain a 10 motion to approve the request of Linda 11 P. Erlich, Ph.D., to complete 24 12 continuing education hours via home study and 6 hours via webinar for the 13 2017 through 2019 biennial renewal 14 15 period. 16 DR. BRADLEY: 17 I'll motion. DR. MCALEER: 18 19 Second. 20 CHAIRMAN DONGIOVANNI: 21 Dr. Bradley. Second, Dr. McAleer. All 22 those in favor? Those opposed? 23 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 24 25 [Chairman DonGiovanni noted the Recusal Guidelines for

12 the Board's review.] 1 2 \* \* \* 3 Report of Board Chairman - The National Psychologist 4 "VA's Telehealth Rule Raises Licensing Concerns" 5 [Vito J. DonGiovanni, Psy.D., Chairman, noted an 6 article in The National Psychologist related to 7 licensing concerns regarding the VA's telehealth rules 8 and its impact on various licensing agencies. Нe 9 commented that the Association of State and Provincial 10 Psychology Boards (ASPPB) has the Psychology 11 Interjurisdictional Compact (PSYPACT), which would 12 require a change to the law for this Board. He stated 13 ASPPB has not taken any formal position. 14 Chairman DonGiovanni stated the VA is permitting 15 telehealth within its system, which is not subject to 16 Board regulations. 17 Dr. Small questioned whether the Board has 18 jurisdiction over VA psychologists. Ms. Wucinski 19 advised that this Board does not have regulations on 20 the matter. The Board only has jurisdiction over 21 people receiving services who are physically located 22 in Pennsylvania. She stated some states do have 23 regulations, and until Pennsylvania does, this Board 24 has to go by jurisdiction. 25 Dr. McAleer noted that California has 30 days of

permission to practice outside of the state. 1 2 Ms. Stuckey noted that Pennsylvania has an 3 aggregate of 14 days if someone has an active 4 psychology license in another state. Ms. Wucinski 5 mentioned a telehealth bill that will impact all of 6 the health-related fields.] \* \* \* 7 Report of Commissioner - No Report 8 9 \* \* \* 10 Report of Board Members - No Report \* \* \* 11 12 Discussion Items - Act 53 of 2016 13 [Chairman DonGiovanni addressed Act 53 of 2016. Нe 14 referred to a letter that stemmed from Dr. Spayd and 15 Chairman DonGiovanni's communications with the 16 Pennsylvania Psychological Association of Graduate 17 Students (PPAGS) in June regarding changes in 18 predoctoral experience and allowing those hours to be 19 eligible for licensure supervision. 20 Chairman DonGiovanni stated the Board interpreted 21 the changes to refer to predoc experience, meaning 2.2 predoc internship. He noted that others felt that 23 this could also include predoc practicum because it is 24 a supervised experience. He suggested that the Board 25 specify predoc hours as internship in the new

1 regulations and provide clarification of the predoc 2 hours.

3 Ms. Stuckey commented that the law states that 4 individuals must have two years of experience. The 5 requirement that at least one year must be after the 6 award of a degree was removed. She stated the Board 7 has been interpreting the first year as the 8 predoctoral internship. She noted that individuals 9 could start their second year of experience after the 10 completion of the predoctoral internship but before 11 graduating. Ms. Stuckey stated, when reviewing the second year of experience on the supervised experience 12 form, she considers the regulations that refer to 13 14 postdoctoral experience. She noted that it is not 15 necessarily postdoctoral, but she still refers to the same criteria, a minimum of 15 hours experience but no 16 17 more than 45 hours and 2 hours a week of supervision. 18 Dr. McAleer addressed the history of the program, 19 noting that the bulk of clinical experience was 20 reserved for the internship and postdoc, where students now have more supervised face-to-face client 21 22 experience during the program, which should be 23 included as supervised experience.

Dr. McAleer mentioned the American PsychologicalAssociation (APA) model licensure and the social and

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political issues requiring students to wait another 1 2 year after graduating.

3 Ms. Stuckey stated the Board only reviews the 4 second year of experience, and the predoctoral 5 internship is a requirement their degree. She noted 6 that no degree is awarded if an individual has not 7 completed a predoctoral internship. The date is 8 verified to mark the beginning of the second year.

Ms. Stuckey addressed the Examination for 9 10 Professional Practice in Psychology (EPPP) and the 11 Pennsylvania Psychology Law Examination (PPLE). The 12 Board permits individuals to take these examinations immediately following graduation. 13

14 Chairman DonGiovanni referred to correspondence 15 regarding Act 53. He discussed the Board's 16 interpretation of the Act.

17 Ms. Stuckey noted the requirement within the law 18 to graduate from an accredited college or university 19 holding a degree in Doctor of Philosophy in 20 Psychology, Doctor of Psychology, or Doctorate in 21 Educational Psychology, and not less than two years of 22 supervised experience, provided that such experience 23 is acceptable to the Board pursuant to criteria 2.4 established by Board regulations. 25

It was noted that the State Board of Psychology

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is currently interpreting this section to mean any 1 2 hours accumulated after the completion of a 3 predoctoral internship may start counting experience toward the second year of supervised experience. 4 Ms. Stuckey stated the only documentation to 5 verify the second year of experience is the 6 7 verification of supervised experience form and questioned its use to verify practicum hours. 8 Dr. McAleer referred to the Association of 9 10 Psychology Postdoctoral and Internship Centers'

11 (APPIC) detailed application, but questioned whether
12 it meets the Board's regulations.

13 Chairman DonGiovanni stated the Board can 14 designate predoc hours as predoc internship, and the 15 other supervisory hours by approval by the Board.

Ms. Stuckey stated any experience completed before the predoctoral internship that meets the requirements within the regulations can be submitted for the Board to review. She will create a draft notice for the next meeting.] \*\*\* Association of State Provincial Psychology Boards
