21 forward through the legislature and review process.]

13 Report of Board Members - No Report

14 ***

15 Appointment - Pennsylvania Psychological Association
16 (PPA) - Prescriptive

17 Privileges for Psychologists

18 [Anthony Ragusea, Psy.D., American Board of
19 Professional Psychology, presented to the Board to
20 discuss regulatory implications of House Bill 2607.
21 He stated House Bill 2607 would need to be
22 reintroduced next session, along with finding a new
23 prime sponsor.

24 Dr. Ragusea informed Board members that there is
25 not a lot about the Pennsylvania Board in the bill,

1 but there would be additional responsibilities that
2 would fall upon the Board if it were to become law.
3 He noted responsibilities would include keeping track
4 of how many prescribing psychologists there are,
5 possibly creating mechanisms for applying to become a
6 prescribing psychologist, creating template
7 application forms to help verify people have met
8 criteria, and likely manage disciplinary actions of
9 prescribing psychologists.

10 Dr. Ragusea stated the Board would also forward
11 information about who has prescriptive authority in
12 the state to the Board of Pharmacy. He mentioned the
13 Board of Pharmacy has not been involved in discussions
14 about the legislation. He noted the need to notify
15 the State Board if there is any termination,
16 suspension, or reinstatement of someone's prescriptive
17 authority license.

18 Dr. Ragusea stated PPA would like to have
19 prescribing psychologists on the licensing board and
20 have them be part of the rulemaking process if the
21 bill passes. He noted the importance of prescribing
22 psychologists to be assertive because physicians will
23 sometimes try to dominate the rulemaking stages and
24 dictate things.

25 Chair Spayd requested information regarding

1 states that currently have prescriptive privileges and
2 if there had been any history of disciplinary action.

3 Dr. Ragusea reported prescribing psychologists
4 have existed for about 30 years, starting with the
5 Department of Defense Psychopharmacology Demonstration
6 Project back in the 1990s. He noted Louisiana, New
7 Mexico, Illinois, Idaho, and Iowa permit prescribing
8 psychologists. He mentioned other locations where
9 prescribing psychologists can practice medicine is for
10 the military, on Indian reservations, and other
11 certain public health sites if they have a license in
12 a state that permits it.

13 Dr. Ragusea reported that there have only been
14 about 250 prescribing psychologists because of a lot
15 of hoops and obstacles, noting the numbers could
16 increase by reducing barriers.

17 Dr. Ragusea mentioned that disciplinary action
18 has been a little unclear, but in terms of official
19 disciplinary actions by state boards, there had been
20 only a couple and a small percentage over 30 years of
21 practice. He noted that malpractice rates had not
22 increased much in states where prescribing is legal,
23 but could expect to pay \$75 to \$100 extra in their
24 insurance.

25 Dr. Ragusea commented that part of the plan is to

1 introduce a companion bill to the Senate next year.
2 He stated the continuing education requirement in the
3 bill would be in addition to the 30 they already get
4 as psychologists and monitoring of that would be part
5 of the Board's responsibility.

6 Mr. Ragusea suggested the Board think about
7 approving practicum sites because one of the major
8 obstacles to becoming a prescriber is that it is very
9 difficult to find people to train someone and provide
10 residency supervised hours required in the bill. He
11 mentioned that Illinois has a system for formally
12 approving practicum sites and is something to
13 consider.

14 Dr. McAleer commented that the law states the
15 Board would be required to approve a national exam for
16 practice of psychopharmacology by a psychologist for
17 prescribing and asked how many exams currently exist.
18 He also asked whether anything would be in the next
19 version of the bill that modifies the nursing law
20 because there is nothing in there that gives
21 psychologists the ability to order nurses to do
22 anything.

23 Dr. Ragusea stated there is one exam and did not
24 think there was any plan to modify the nursing law,
25 noting there would be a lot of pushback from

1 physicians.

2 Dr. DonGiovanni commented that medical societies
3 were pretty much antagonistic to the proposed laws in
4 other states regarding prescriptive authority and
5 asked how medical societies in Pennsylvania view this.

6 Dr. Ragusea stated the medical societies are
7 being intentionally reserved and waiting to see how
8 much support they get in the House and Senate and then
9 would weigh in. He mentioned medical societies may be
10 open to negotiate because the American Medical
11 Association (AMA) did not oppose the bill in Illinois,
12 so the AMA could probably get behind the bill in
13 Pennsylvania too.

14 Ms. Miley commented that Dr. Ragusea's
15 presentation was informative, and PPA was not seeking
16 any direction from the Board at this time. She stated
17 the Board does not speak on legislation, which would
18 come from the Department and the administration, and
19 any support would be determined at a higher level than
20 the Board.

21 Chair Spayd asked whether the additional exam CE
22 would be permitted by medical doctors or whether it
23 has to be a prescribing psychologist.

24 Dr. Ragusea explained that the continuing
25 education was not specified in the bill, so the

1 continuing education could be from any source but has
2 to be relevant to the practice of a prescribing
3 psychologist.

4 Mr. Giunta referred to the conditional
5 certificate section in House Bill 2607 and asked
6 whether the supervision by a physician continues after
7 the license or certificate is granted or just during
8 the conditional certificate.

9 Dr. Ragusea explained that a provider who is
10 fully licensed as a prescriber would be allowed to
11 prescribe independently but, as indicated in the bill,
12 also be expected to do so in collaboration with the
13 patient's primary care provider.

14 Mr. Giunta requested information regarding who
15 would be monitoring a conditional prescribing
16 psychologist. He also asked whether there was any
17 adoption for prescribing guidelines and whether the
18 bill affords the Board any regulation-making ability
19 on the type of guidelines that would be necessary to
20 be implemented.

21 Dr. Ragusea stated that monitoring is not in the
22 bill and is something that would need to be discussed
23 and determined. He noted the American Psychological
24 Association has published guidelines for the practice
25 of psychopharmacology that applies to prescribing

1 psychologists and non-prescribing psychologists for
2 direction. He mentioned the Board could collaborate
3 with other states to find out more about how they do
4 things.

5 Mr. Giunta asked whether prescribing
6 psychologists would have to check the Prescription
7 Drug Monitoring Program routinely before giving a
8 prescription to make sure the patient-client is not
9 doctor shopping. He stated the prescribing
10 psychologists would have to register with the Drug
11 Enforcement Administration (DEA) and asked whether
12 there has there been any collaboration or contact with
13 the DEA on how that would work.

14 Dr. Ragusea noted that PPA would support
15 Prescription Drug Monitoring Program checks. He
16 stated PPA has not been in touch with the DEA on that
17 issue and believed that part of the bill originally
18 comes from the model bill published by the American
19 Psychological Association (APA) and approved by APA
20 attorneys.

21 Chair Spayd commented that the primary
22 responsibility of the Board should this go through
23 would be to approve practicum sites, approve the exam,
24 track additional CEs, and include a prescribing
25 psychologist on their Board.

1 Dr. Ragusea noted the Board would also track the
2 number of prescribing psychologists and communicate
3 that information to the Pharmacy Board, along with
4 changes to their licensure status and managing
5 disciplinary actions. He commented that PPA would
6 like at least one or two prescribing psychologists to
7 be involved in the decision-making processes.

8 Carole Clarke Smith, Esquire, Senior Board
9 Counsel, informed Dr. Ragusea that having a
10 prescribing psychologist as a seat on the Board would
11 have to be made part of the bill and part of the act.

12 Chair Spayd thanked Dr. Ragusea for the
13 presentation.]

22 the state, as well as internship and residency
23 supervisors involved in ethics education.

24 Dr. McAleer informed Board members that the
25 Pennsylvania Psychological Association has again

1 requested the Board give a presentation to the
2 educators regarding review of the general functioning
3 of the Board and how the Board analyzes cases in the
4 decision-making process.

5 Dr. McAleer and one of the Ethics Committee
6 members, Dr. John Gavazzi, have agreed to partake in
7 the overall presentation on October 21, 2022, at
8 Messiah University and asked whether anyone else would
9 be interested, and Dr. Spayd noted she would also like
10 to attend.

11 Dr. McAleer commented that he would be putting
12 together a proposal for PPA to be able to receive
13 continuing education credits and would need approval
14 of attendance and preapproval for the slideshow.]


