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3 State Board of Examiners in Speech-Language 1 2 Pathology and Audiology March 9, 2018 3 * * * 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 6 Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and 7 Audiology was held on Friday, March 9, 2018. Jonette B. Owen, Aud.D., Chairperson, called the meeting to 8 9 order at 9:39 a.m. Roll call was taken. * * * 10 11 Appointment - Budget [Julie Snader, Finance and Operations Manager, 12 Division of Fiscal Management, Bureau of Finance and 13 14 Operations, introduced herself and Kimberly Adams, 15 Chief of Division of Fiscal Management. 16 Ms. Snader provided information on the Board's 17 licensee population, which was at 8,839 for Fiscal Year 2017-2018. 18 19 Ms. Snader attributed 93 percent of the Board's 20 revenue to renewals and applications. She referred to 21 the biennial totals for Fiscal Years 2015-2016 and 22 2016-2017. Ms. Snader noted that the last fee 23 increase was approved in November of 2015 and will 2.4 become effective in July 2018. 25 Ms. Goldman questioned whether geographical

studies were available regarding new applicants and 1 2 the cause of the increase. Ms. Matter stated PALS had 3 scripted standard questions and suggested the 4 Commissioner's office add questions to the renewal 5 applications to obtain additional information. 6 Ms. Snader reviewed cost categories and expenses 7 for Fiscal Year 2015-2016 and Fiscal Year 2016-2017, and the budgeted amount for Fiscal Year 2017-2018. 8 9 She explained expenses are incurred from direct 10 charges, timekeeping charges, and licensee-based 11 charges. 12 Ms. Snader discussed the anticipated balance at the end of Fiscal Year 2017-2018. She concluded that 13 14 the Board will stay within budget as in previous 15 years.] * * * 16 17 Report of Prosecutorial Division 18 [Adam L. Morris, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, addressed 19 the Board at 9:54 a.m. for the purpose of presenting 20 the Consent Agreement for File No. 17-68-12231. 21 Ms. Roman recused herself from the matter.] * * * 22 23 FYI - Case Status Report 24 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel, 25 noted the December 2017 Case Status Report is provided

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by the Office of Prosecution. She also noted a Motion 1 2 to Enter Default and Deem Facts Admitted filed in 3 Kristi Lee Pennypacker, File Nos. 12-68-11109 and 14-68-06865, for deliberation in Executive Session.] 4 * * * 5 6 Approval of Minutes of the December 8, 2017 meeting 7 CHAIRPERSON OWEN: If we can look at the December 8 minutes 8 9 and if anyone has any correction to 10 them? 11 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes and tabled approval of the minutes.] 12 * * * 13 14 Report of Board Counsel 15 Regulations 16 [Judith Pachter Schulder, Esquire, Board Counsel, 17 referenced the request from James Shafer, AuD, on 18 behalf of the Pennsylvania Academy of Audiology 19 (PAA) to add delegation language to the Board's 20 regulation similar to the State Board of Medicine 21 regulation. She provided Section 17 of the Medical 2.2 Practice Act (MPA) regarding the delegation of duties 23 section for discussion. 24 Ms. Pachter Schulder explained the Board relies 25 upon Section 5(8) of the Speech-Language Pathologists

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1 and Audiologists Licensure Act as authority to write 2 regulations governing persons functioning under the 3 direction of audiologists or speech-language 4 pathologists. She stated the language in Section 5(8) 5 of the Act is not as inclusive as the MPA delegation 6 section.

7 Ms. Pachter Schulder discussed the differences 8 between indirect supervision and direct supervision 9 and its impact on whether the Act must be amended. 10 She explained indirect supervision would also require 11 additional delegation provisions in the law.

12 Chairperson Owen referred to the American Academy 13 of Audiology (AAA), the American Speech-Language-14 Hearing Association (ASHA), and the Academy of Doctors 15 of Audiology's (ADA) positions on the training of 16 audiology assistants. She specifically referred to a 17 state-by-state reference table from ASHA.

18 Ms. Pachter Schulder compared Section 45.307, 19 limitations, where an assistant may not engage in 20 activities reserved by the act to the licensees of the 21 Board, with Section 45.305, the functions and duties 2.2 of assistants for discussion. There was further 23 discussion regarding the language in the regulations 24 referencing limitations and the activities of 25 licensees, particularly fittings and assessments.

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Ted Mowatt, Senior Associate, Wanner Associates, 1 2 representing PAA, noted PAA's recognition of the 3 authority of assistants within the limits of the 4 regulations and the law. He discussed amending the 5 regulations to provide an amplification of the 6 authority and duties of assistants due to insurance 7 reimbursement issues and coding. Ms. Pachter Schulder 8 explained the regulatory process and the various legal 9 reviews by the Independent Regulatory Review 10 Commission, the Office of Attorney General, and the 11 Office of General Counsel. She further discussed the 12 authority to delegate duties to unlicensed persons 13 under the regulations.

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Ms. Pachter Schulder referred to Section 45.305, relating to the practice of audiology or speechlanguage pathology, in comparison to the definitions of practice of audiology and practice of speechlanguage pathology in the law.

The Board discussed Section 45.401, noting that assistants deliver audiology services under the guidance of an audiologist. Mr. Mowatt noted that the supervision and liability remain with the licensee. He also suggested considering the optometry model, rather than the medical. Ms. Pachter Schulder noted that Section 45.102(c)(1) of the Code of Ethics

1 contained in the regulations.

2	Concerning the insurance reimbursement and coding			
3	issues, Ms. Pachter Schulder noted that the Board does			
4	not have a role. The Board suggested that PAA speak			
5	with insurance companies about the proper coding for			
6	audiologists as limited by the nonmedical diagnosis			
7	language in the regulations. There was discussion			
8	referencing similar language for nurses, occupational			
9	therapists, and physical therapists.			
10	Ms. Pachter Schulder explained the steps involved			
11	in a legislative initiative.			
12	Ms. Pachter Schulder referred to Section 45.301			
13	regarding assistants' minimum education. She noted			
14	that Dr. Shafer had previously indicated that the			
15	original intent of the provision was to ensure that			
16	all properly trained assistants could participate in			
17	patient care under the guidance of a licensed			
18	audiologist; however, this provision only allows			
19	assistants to participate in tasks outlined in the			
20	listed duties.			
21	The Board agreed to discuss continuing			
22	education, both in ethics and supervision, at a future			
23	meeting.			
24	Chairperson Owen referred to a statement from			
25	ASHA that prior to the use of an assistant, the			

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1 licensee must obtain evidence of one of the following, 2 referring to Section 45.304, completion of 30 semester 3 hours or the equivalent of an accredited institution 4 of higher education in the area of speech-language and 5 hearing before receiving a certificate from the 6 Council for Clinical Certification of ASHA.

7 Ms. Pachter Schulder stated that the regulation 8 is similar, stating an accredited institution of 9 higher education in the area of speech-language and hearing as outlined in the requirements as specified 10 11 for a Certificate of Clinical Competence from the 12 Council on Professional Standards in Speech-Language 13 Pathology and Audiology of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association. The Board discussed 14 15 prior amendments to the regulations.

16 Mr. Mowatt suggested sending a letter to 17 Dr. Shafer summarizing Board's discussion of his 18 letter and thanking him for his comments.

Ms. Pachter Schulder commented on the differences between the requirements of each profession and what the professional associations and federations believe to be appropriate versus the extent of statutory authority. She explained the Board is bound by the "no medical diagnosis and treatment" unless the statute change.

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Ms. Pachter Schulder referred to the Speech Language Pathologists and Audiologists Licensure Act
Section 6(a) License, except as provided in Subsection
(b), no person may practice as an audiologist or
speech-language pathologist unless he holds a current
unsuspended, unrevoked license issued by the Board.
She also noted exemptions.

8 Ms. Pachter Schulder also referred to Section 3 9 and Section 5(8) regarding the Board delegation. 10 She noted Section 45.305 together with Section 45.307.

11 The model bill for state licensure of 12 audiologists, speech-language pathologists, and 13 audiology and speech-language pathology assistants 14 from ASHA was also discussed.

15 Mr. Mowatt suggested a substantial change can be 16 made to Section 45.304 and Section 45.305 to reflect 17 the current use of assistants. Ms. Pachter Schulder 18 explained that while the Act recognizes ASHA and AAA, 19 the Board is still bound by the scope of practice in 20 the Act and other relevant licensure laws and cannot 21 ignore those laws by incorporating the scope of 22 practices of the organizations.

23 The Board agreed that no further amendment to the 24 Assistant provisions was necessary.]
