3 State Board of Examiners in Speech-Language 1 2 Pathology and Audiology 3 September 4, 2020 * * * 4 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 5 6 Board of Examiners in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology was held on Friday, September 4, 2020. Sarah E. Delano, M.Ed., CCC-A, Vice Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:07 a.m. 10 K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, was not present 11 12 at the commencement of the meeting. * * * 13 14 [Nicole VanOrder, Esquire, noted the meeting was being 15 recorded and participation in the meeting would be 16 considered consent to that recording.] 17 Introduction of Board Members 18 19 [Vice Chair Delano welcomed the Board's newest 20 members, Lisa Butler and Andrew McCall. 21 Andrew McCall, M.D. introduced himself as a 22 practicing neuro-otologist at the University of 23 Pittsburgh Medical Center. Lisa Butler, M.A., CCC-SLP, introduced herself as Speech-Language 24 25 Pathologist, currently working in a school setting.]

* * * 1 2 [There was an introduction of Board members, staff and 3 members of the public in attendance.] * * * 4 5 Approval of Minutes of the June 5, 2020 meeting 6 VICE CHAIR DELANO: I would like to make a motion to approve 8 the Minutes from the June 5, 2020 9 meeting. 10 MR. MURPHY: 11 I second. 12 A roll call vote was taken as follows: 13 14 Delano, aye; Stimson, aye; Butler, 15 abstain; McCall, abstain; Murphy, aye; and Stauffer, aye. 16 17 [The motion carried. Dr. McCall and Ms. Butler 18 abstained from voting on the motion.] * * * 19 20 Report of Prosecutorial Division 21 [Paul J. Jarabeck, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, 22 had no Consent Agreements to present.] 2.3 24 Report of Deputy Chief Counsel 25 Regulations

- 1 [Cynthia K. Montgomery, Esquire, Deputy Chief Counsel,
- 2 referred to 16A-6805 Child Abuse Reporting
- 3 Requirements Proposed Rulemaking for further
- 4 discussion. She directed members to the Preamble and
- 5 | Annex in the Child Abuse Regulatory Requirements for
- 6 further discussion. She explained that Annex A was
- 7 | the text of the regulation, proposed deletions of the
- 8 | Board were bracketed, and new language was underlined.
- 9 | She provided an update with regard to definitions,
- 10 additions and deletions to the regulation as follows:
- 11 Section 45.12 was being updated to include the
- 12 requirement that speech-language pathologists and
- 13 audiologists complete at least three hours of approved
- 14 training in child abuse recognition and reporting.
- 15 Section 45.13 was being updated to include the
- 16 requirement that licensees complete at least two hours
- 17 of approve continuing education in child abuse
- 18 recognition and reporting.
- 19 Section 45.401 was being updated to incorporate
- 20 definitions either added to or amended in the Child
- 21 Protective Services Law. Ms. Montgomery explained the
- 22 | biggest change is the definition of child abuse which
- 23 was completely revamped in the Child Protective
- 24 Services Law.
- 25 She noted the definition of perpetrator was

```
amended and the definition of program, activity or services was added. The serious physical neglect definition was added to the Child Protective Services
Law, as well as the definition of sexual abuse or exploitation had been amended quite substantially.
```

Ms. Montgomery explained Section 45.402, the Board's current section on the mandated reporting requirements, had been amended to consider licensees of the Board as mandated reporters under the Child Protective Services Law and sets forth the circumstances of the duty to report, which were clarified by Ms. Montgomery.

Section 45.404 provides for suspected death as a result of child abuse with the addition of language to include, report to a medical examiner.

Ms. Montgomery noted changes to Section 45.405, the immunity from liability section.

Section 45.406 is the confidentiality provision, that any rule of client confidentiality was basically trumped by the duty to report child abuse.

Section 45.407, the noncompliance section, related to disciplinary actions should a licensee fail to comply with reporting requirements.

Section 45.408 reflects the new mandated training requirement, that individuals applying for licensure

must submit proof of three hours of training in child abuse recognition, and licenses seeking renewal must complete two hours of approved training.

Section 45.409 relates to child abuse recognition reporting course approval process, which is reviewed by the Department of Human Services and the Bureau.

Section 45.501 includes the two hours of continuing education in child abuse recognition reporting.

Section 45.502 clarifies that there is no exemption for the two hours of mandatory training in child abuse recognition reporting.

Section 45.503 concerns the reactivation of expired and lapsed licenses.

Ms. Montgomery referred to the Preamble, the explanatory document, for further discussion.

She noted that if the Board approved the regulation as drafted, it would be sent on through the regulatory review process and would be published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin for public comment. Board members had questions for Ms. Montgomery.

Ms. Montgomery provided an overview of the regulatory process for the benefit of the Board members and also offered to present a Power Point presentation on the regulatory process at a future

meeting.

MS. MONTGOMERY:

2 Ms. Montgomery explained that the regulatory 3 process would include drafting the regulation, a vote by the Board to promulgate it as proposed rulemaking, 5 a review process by the Office of General Counsel, approval by the Governor's Office of Policy and 6 Planning, the Budget Office, the Office of Attorney General. Once approved, the regulation would be delivered for review to the House Professional 10 Licensure Committee and Senate Consumer Protection and 11 Professional Licensure Committees, and the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC), and then 12 13 published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin, allowed 30 days for public comment, and then comments from those 14 15 committees and IRRC.

She explained the regulation is then brought back to the Board for review of comments and discussion regarding the need for changes. Once the Board moves forward with final rulemaking, the package goes back through the same review process. IRRC has a public meeting on the regulation, and if approved, the package goes back to Office of Attorney General for final review and publication in the Pennsylvania
Bulletin as a final regulation.]

9 If there are no there questions, I would 1 2 be asking for a motion to approve the 3 Proposed Rulemaking to go forward through the regulatory review process and be 4 5 published for public comment. 6 MS. STIMSON: 7 I make a motion. MR. STAUFFER: 9 I'll second. 10 11 A roll call vote was taken as follows: 12 Delano, aye; Stimson, aye; Stauffer, aye; 13 Butler, aye; McCall, aye; and Murphy, aye. 14 [The motion carried unanimously.] 15 16 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of 17 Professional and Occupational Affairs, entered the 18 meeting at 9:55 a.m.] * * * 19 20 Report of Board Counsel 21 Act 53 of 2020 22 [Nicole VanOrder, Esquire, Board Counsel, discussed 23 Act 53. She explained this law amended CHRIA, the 24 Criminal History Record Information Act and provides

more transparency and structure around what

25

1 individuals, who are seeking a license, can expect in 2 regard to the treatment of prior criminal history.

Ms. VanOrder indicated this also requires that the Bureau produce a best practices guide and list of criminal offenses directly related to the profession. She noted, after the list has gone through the appropriate review process, the list would be presented to the Board for input.

9 Ms. VanOrder stated the Act codifies the existing 10 Act 48 law.

She explained Section One of the bill amends certain segments of Section 9124 of the Criminal History Information Act.

14 Section 3102 refers to a list of definitions. Section

15 3103 outlines the investigatory subpoena powers.

16 Section 3112 has provisions allowing for restricted

17 licensure specifically for barbers and cosmetologists.

18 Section 3113 generates a list of criminal offenses for

19 which Ms. VanOrder offered further explanation. A

20 list of crimes pertaining to this Board was reviewed

21 by Counsel and Board prosecutors and will be presented

22 at the next Board meeting.

Section 3116 concerns the best practices guide
that would summarize the content of several portions
of the regulation.

Commissioner Johnson inquired if requirements for licensure would be changed. Ms. VanOrder explained the requirements for licensure would not change, but the regulation would provide clarity for individuals about how criminal history would affect their ability to be licensed. Board members had questions.

Commissioner Johnson encouraged feedback from members.

9 | Sunshine Act and Recusal Guidelines

[Ms. VanOrder explained the Sunshine Act says that all discussions regarding matters, such as regulations, must be conducted in a public session appropriately noticed, so that individuals who would like to join the conversation may do so. She noted that it also means that Board members cannot discuss these matters

together outside of the board meeting. There are

criminal penalties for violating that rule.

Ms. VanOrder explained recusal guidelines are settings for some basic parameters for when a Board member would not be able to make an unbiased determination based on personal interest, financial interest or personal dealings with an individual who comes before the Board on a matter.]
