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   [Chairman Murphy requested a Bureau of Enforcement and
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   Investigation presentation to be scheduled for the
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   next Board meeting.]
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   Governor's Policy Office Presentation
   [Jacob (Jake) Derrick, Policy Analyst, Office of PA
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   Governor Tom Wolf, discussed reducing the barriers to
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   licensure and reducing unnecessary burdens on the
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   Boards. He noted inappropriate licensure and
   unnecessary costs for both time and money for
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   professionals.
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        Mr. Derrick noted Executive Order 2017-03, which
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   was a created to review data benchmarking every
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   profession licensed in Pennsylvania against other
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   states.
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        Mr. Derrick commented on recommendations from
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   that report, including a statutory change to change
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vehicle factory representatives from a license to a registration. He noted that Rhode Island was the only other state in the region that licenses vehicle factory representatives.

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Mr. Derrick stated that there are 1,173 vehicle

factory representative licenses in Pennsylvania. He
noted that the smaller the population of licensees the
higher the cost to cover the administrative functions
to regulate the profession. He commented on the
public safety concerns in the profession and suggested
this was an area that is overregulated.

Chairman Murphy noted his concerns regarding turnaround time in the Governor's office for appointees. He also discussed the significant length of time to change licensing fees.

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Chairman Murphy noted the Board's recommendations being ignored on a couple of bills. He specifically mentioned the burden of temporary licensing that went through after the Board recommended against it.

Chairman Murphy discussed reestablishing roundtable meetings. He noted the need for the Governor's office to get involved so that all of the agencies could talk to each other and communicate on similar subjects.

Mr. Derrick agreed to work with Mr. Harlow on the Board's vacancies.

Mr. Derrick reviewed the licensing fee process, noting that it is a two-year process with special vetting for fees ahead of that. He referred to the nature of the regulatory structure and the difficulty

to lower that.

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Mr. Derrick expressed an appreciation of the Board's feedback and input, along with stakeholder and industry information, and was open to all levels of communication. He will investigate reestablishing the roundtable meetings.

Chairman Murphy noted complaints and his concern concerning online auctions.

Commissioner Harlow stated the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA) was aware of these practices, which are being investigated by the State.

13 Chairman Murphy commented on the Attorney

Commissioner Harlow noted the need to encourage better communication with BPOA, the Governor's office, and committees.]
