He noted multiple companies in China 24 working on battery and self-driving cars. 25 Chairman Murphy mentioned the importance of

legislators being ready with laws to protect them and 1 2 the consumer, especially in the world of a driverless 3 car. 4 Chairman Murphy reported the sales of battery-5 powered cars are doubling and tripling each year. He 6 commented that some states already mandated laws for 7 battery-powered, cars but driverless cars are going to be a challenge. 8 Chairman Murphy announced Mr. Hufford's 9 10 resignation from the Board due to family health 11 issues. Counsel, Prosecution Division, provided highlights of 1 2 the prosecution division's work during the past year. 3 She commended staff for all of their hard work to make telework successful. She noted all decisions were 4 5 made thoughtfully and with the safety of all in mind. 6 Ms. DeLaurentis stated the Board prosecutors made 7 every effort to monitor the restrictions, waivers, 8 policies, and new procedures specific to the practice 9 in each profession regarding challenges imposed on licensees by the COVID-19 pandemic. 10

11 Ms. DeLaurentis noted the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) to be a lifeline. She stated the Bureau 12 13 of Enforcement and Investigation (BEI) worked closely 14 with prosecution to continue investigations and figure 15 out the best methods during statewide shutdowns and 16 stay-at-home orders. She also noted the Professional 17 Compliance Office continued opening cases and 18 processing files, and legal assistants have been 19 working a hybrid schedule to ensure mailings and 20 filings are completed.

Ms. DeLaurentis commented that the Board, Board staff, and counsel all have adapted to virtual Board meetings and prosecution will continue to work with everyone to ensure efficient and effective presentation and resolution of cases. She mentioned

1 2020 was a year filled with challenges, but the 2 prosecution division led by the incredible senior 3 staff rose to the challenge and will continue to do 4 so.

5 Ms. DeLaurentis informed the Board that 872 cases were opened in 2020 and 1,829 in 2019 with 1,173 files 6 7 closed in 2020 for the State Board of Vehicle Manufacturers, Dealers, and Salespersons. 8 She noted 9 976 open cases as of January 1, 2021. She thanked 10 Timothy Smith for his assistance providing information for 2020. 11

Ms. DeLaurentis addressed enforcement actions with 138 total cases that resulted in Board discipline in 2020. She reported 173 warning letters, 47 fines, Scitation fines, 65 suspensions with 2 automatic suspensions, 5 reprimands, 8 voluntary surrenders, and probations in 2020.

Ms. DeLaurentis discussed 2020 overall 18 19 prosecution as a whole. She noted 44 immediate 20 temporary suspensions. She mentioned 28 of the 1,223 21 opened COVID-19 cases are for the State Board of 22 Vehicle Manufacturers, Dealers, and Salespersons. She 23 reported the total number of open cases for the Bureau 2.4 of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA) is 25 12,250 and total number of files opened in 2020 is

13 13,394, which is down from 2019 at 16,295. She noted 1 2 13,274 files were closed in 2020 and 14,630 in 2019.] \* \* \* 3 Miscellaneous 4 [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted 5 2021 Board meeting dates. He advised Board members to 6 7 provide appropriate notice to Ms. Cline if unable to 8 attend any of the meetings. Chairman Murphy noted adjusting the June 22 9 meeting date and moving it to June 30. 10 11 Mr. Fritz addressed the need for Board members, noting four professional seats and three public seats 12 13 right now with the resignation of Mr. Hufford. Mr. Stauffer commented that the office is aware 14 15 of the need for Board members. 16 Mr. Fritz advised everyone to be aware of when 17 their term on the Board expires.
