[C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred to 16A-6015 regarding the general fee increase, noting comments from PAA.

Chad W. Marsar, Esquire, General Counsel,

Pennsylvania Automotive Association, commented that

renewal fees are appropriate but believed application

fee increases to be excessive and requested the Board

to consider a more graduated increase.

Chairman Murphy commented that there was a study almost three years ago by Saint Francis University comparing 21 states and other boards. He noted being on the committee with Commissioner Johnson and believed Governor Wolf published the results, where Pennsylvania was at or below the fees of surrounding states, and Vehicle Board fees were lower than everybody else. He also mentioned this to be driven by the budget department and not necessarily the Board.

Commissioner Johnson reminded all of the statutory requirement to make sure the Board maintains an adequate financial structure regardless of what the comparative evaluations are to other states. He noted graduated fee increases were considered, but the budget office generated the numbers and determined the lowest acceptable increase to still allow continued Board function.

Mr. Stoy questioned whether PPA had any dealer applicant state that the \$75 difference in the application cost would absolutely be a barrier to them being able to go into business.

Mr. Marsar explained that it would not be a barrier for a new dealer to go into business, but the 175% fee increase seems drastic from PPA's perspective. He stated that PPA is in favor of gradual increases over time but not a 175% increase after not raising fees in 20 years.

Chairman Murphy explained that some of the red tape involved when trying to change fees makes it almost prohibitive on a gradual basis every year. He acknowledges the fee increase should have been done over time noted being constrained by regulations, policies, and procedures.

Mr. Marsar reiterated that PPA numbers are based

14

off of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) and believed fee increases should be based more on CPI increases versus budgetary needs.

Chairman Murphy stated the Board met with the budget office three or four times throughout the assessment and noted the Board's need to be fair, equitable, and self-sufficient.]

Commissioner Johnson reminded everybody that the assessment and process for determining what the appropriate fee structure is for licensees is not based solely on a comparative analysis and is based primarily on ensuring the needs as an administrative body are met. He stated the numbers are not reflective of anything other than the bare minimum required to continue to function.

Commissioner Johnson welcomed Kyla Djannie to the Board and thanked her taking on the obligation in the role.]
