1 Chairman Murphy thanked Mr. Stoy for all of his  
2 years of service.

3 Mr. Stoy commended everyone involved with the  
4 Board meetings. He also thanked Commissioner Johnson  
5 and Governor Wolf for the proclamation he received.

6 Commissioner Johnson thanked Mr. Stoy for his  
7 service and being an exemplary model of public  
8 service.

9 Mr. Fritz recommended everyone look at their  
10 quorum and USQ time.]

12 Report of Commissioner

13 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of  
14 Professional and Occupational Affairs, thanked Board  
15 members for continued patience while maneuvering  
16 through virtual meetings.

17 Commissioner Johnson congratulated Mr. Stoy for  
18 his years of service. He welcome Angel Layton to the  
19 Board, stating that her presence will complement the  
20 Board. He also welcomed Mr. Davis back to the Board.

21 Commissioner Johnson thanked Ms. Cline and Board  
22 counsel, noting they have been remarkable throughout  
23 the last several months.]

25 Appointment - Act 53 of 2020 List of Relevant Crimes

1 Presentation

2 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of  
3 Professional and Occupational Affairs, addressed Act  
4 53, noting it to be a comprehensive piece of  
5 legislation that reformed the way criminal history is  
6 used to make determinations about licensure. He  
7 stated Act 53 was passed in June 2020 with an  
8 effective date of 180 days.

9 Commissioner Johnson discussed his directives to  
10 oversee the publication of the list of offenses  
11 relative to each of the boards and commissions under  
12 the statutory auspices of Act 53. He was also  
13 directed to provide the opportunity for business  
14 members within the regulated communities to review the  
15 list, provide feedback, and consult with the boards  
16 for approval of the lists.

17 Commissioner Johnson stated Chief Deputy Counsel  
18 Montgomery and Board counsel reviewed the crimes code,  
19 practice act, and disciplinary procedures and curated  
20 a list of criminal offenses that directly relate to  
21 the profession.

22 Commissioner Johnson explained that Act 53  
23 creates opportunities for more equitable outcomes and  
24 provides transparency in the licensure process. He  
25 mentioned the Bureau will also create a best practices

1 guide for the public, licensees, and perspective  
2 licensees to better navigate the journey from layman  
3 to professional. He commented that the list of  
4 offenses was not a terminal list and would have to go  
5 through the regulatory review process.

6 Cynthia K. Montgomery, Esquire, Deputy Chief  
7 Counsel, Department of State, explained that the items  
8 on the list were intended to be crimes that would  
9 directly relate to the profession and provide a  
10 definition of "directly relates." She stated most of  
11 the offenses are theft, fraud, and forgery.

12 Ms. Montgomery referred to § 3113(e) regarding  
13 acts of violence, where an individual convicted of a  
14 crime of violence may be granted a license if at least  
15 3 years from incarceration or 3 years from imposition  
16 of the sentence have lapsed, the individual has  
17 remained conviction-free, and demonstrates significant  
18 rehabilitation.

19 Ms. Montgomery also stated the Board must be  
20 convinced that the individual did not pose a  
21 substantial risk to the health or safety of the  
22 public, customers, or clients or a substantial risk of  
23 further criminal convictions. She mentioned that the  
24 violent crimes are provided in Act 53, where all  
25 boards must follow § 3113(e) when considering violent

1 crimes.

2 Ms. Montgomery mentioned the Board is tasked with  
3 determining whether the list of crimes are directly  
4 related to the profession and should remain on the  
5 list. She explained that crimes on the list gives  
6 notice to individuals thinking of entering the  
7 occupation of vehicle sales as to what types of crimes  
8 the Board deems to be related to the profession.

9 Ms. Montgomery noted the list of crimes would be  
10 incorporated into a best practices guide that lets  
11 individuals know how the Board considers criminal  
12 history information, what crimes are directly related  
13 to the various professions, and the process of  
14 convincing the Board they do not pose a risk to the  
15 public or risk of further criminal convictions. She  
16 stated the burden was on the applicant or licensee to  
17 demonstrate they are not a risk if the crime is on the  
18 list.

19 Ms. Montgomery addressed rebuttable presumption,  
20 where individuals with crimes on the list of offenses  
21 directly related to the profession would be believed  
22 to pose a significant risk to the safety of their  
23 clients or the public or a significant risk of further  
24 criminal convictions. She noted the individual would  
25 have to prove they do not pose such a risk.

1 Ms. Montgomery explained the two-stage analysis,  
2 noting the first stage is to determine whether the  
3 crime is on the list as directly related, where the  
4 burden is on the applicant or licensee to demonstrate  
5 they do not pose a risk to the public.

6 Ms. Montgomery stated the crimes, not on the list  
7 of directly related to the profession, would need an  
8 individualized assessment using criteria set forth in  
9 § 3113(c) to determine whether the individual does  
10 pose such a risk or should be granted a license  
11 notwithstanding the criminal conviction.

12 Ms. Montgomery commented that many of the factors  
13 all of the boards consider anyway but had been laid  
14 out in the statute and provided in the best practices  
15 guide so licensees know what to present to the Board.

16 Ms. Montgomery addressed preliminary  
17 determination, where an individual could ask in  
18 advance whether their criminal history would pose an  
19 impediment to licensure or an applicants. She noted  
20 this to be utilized when imposing discipline as well.  
21 She stated the Commonwealth must demonstrate the  
22 conviction does pose such a risk if the crime is not  
23 on the list.

24 Mr. Fretz noted the Board sees a lot of informal  
25 matters concerning DUI and drug charges that happened

1 a decade ago and questioned whether those would still  
2 require the Board's approval or would that go through  
3 the license process without the Board's approval.

4 Ms. Montgomery noted the Board to be one of the  
5 few boards that do informal conferences for  
6 individuals with criminal history and did not think  
7 that would change with regard to crimes that are not  
8 on the list. She stated it would be the crimes on the  
9 list where the Board may or may not want to have an  
10 informal conference and go straight to a hearing.

11 Ms. Montgomery stated the Board could still  
12 consider crimes that are not on the list by performing  
13 an individualized assessment to determine if the  
14 person poses a risk. She noted Board staff could  
15 still just process applications if the Board is not  
16 concerned about an offense.

17 Mr. Fritz noted the importance of focusing on  
18 crimes directly related to the vehicle sales  
19 profession as far as protecting the public. He noted  
20 focusing on fraud, anything to do with money, odometer  
21 tampering, and stealing money. He mentioned that he  
22 did not want to put anything on the list to make  
23 individuals think they will automatically be denied.  
24 He commented that the list was not set in stone and  
25 could be amended.

1 Chairman Murphy requested clarification of  
2 whether the list was produced by the Commissioner for  
3 the Board and not produced by legislation or the  
4 governor.

5 Commissioner Johnson explained that it is a  
6 directive from legislature, and Act 53 requires  
7 everyone to do this. He emphasized that none of the  
8 responsibilities of the Board have changed. He  
9 mentioned the directive in terms of publication puts  
10 the deadline at December 26 for the list.

11 Ms. Djannie agreed with this list, noting a  
12 similar approach was taken at the Office of Attorney  
13 General, where it is looked at from a review  
14 standpoint for the applicant process as opposed to  
15 automatic denial or approval.

16 Ms. Montgomery noted no comments were received  
17 from interested parties and stakeholders. She stated  
18 the intent of this list was to identify the crimes the  
19 Board deems related to the vehicle profession and to  
20 look at it through the definition of the statute.

21 Mr. Fritz stated the list is not requiring  
22 prosecutors to prosecute the licensee if they have  
23 this conviction and is also not saying if it is not on  
24 this list that they cannot prosecute them.]

4                   subsequently has to promulgate it as a  
5                   regulation. It has to be published by

8 delay from PennDOT in providing paperwork and  
9 registrations to people.

10 Ms. Layton mentioned a slight backlog in the  
11 processing units as far as registrations are  
12 concerned.

13 Chairman Murphy suggested PennDOT recognize  
14 delays and apply something showing they will not be  
15 punitive regarding that issue.]
