Thomas Garg, V.M.D., Chairman, called the meeting to order at 9:07 a.m. 10 Approval of Minutes of the September 21, 2018 meeting 11 CHAIRMAN GARG: 12 We are just going to go ahead and make 13 certain that everybody had a chance to look at the minutes from the last 14 15 meeting to see if there were any 16 comments on those minutes. 17 DR. NEBZYDOSKI: 18 I make a motion to accept the minutes. 19 MS. KEHOE: 20 I second. [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.] 21 22 CHAIRMAN GARG: 23 Does anybody have any other comments? 2.4 DR. NEBZYDOSKI: 25 I will make a motion we accept the

5 minutes with those changes. 1 2 MS. KEHOE: 3 I second. 4 CHAIRMAN GARG: 5 Any further discussion? All in favor, 6 say aye. [The motion carried unanimously.] Report of Prosecutorial Division 10 [Julia Feld-Caralle, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, noted 11 that the Consent Agreement for File No. 17-57-08991 12 was tabled until March. 13 Ms. Feld-Caralle presented the Consent Agreement for File No. 15-57-02528.] 14 15 16 [Kimberly A. Adams, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, 17 presented the Consent Agreements for File No. 13-57-03880 and File No. 14-57-03325.118 \* \* \* 19 20 [Codi M. Tucker, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented 21 the Consent Agreement for File No. 17-57-009614. 2.2 Chairman Garg recused from discussion on this 2.3 matter.] 2.4 25 [Paul J. Jarabeck, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison,

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1 introduced Christopher McNally as a new Board
2 prosecutor.
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Mr. McNally provided a brief summary of his professional background. Chairman Garg welcomed Mr. McNally.

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7 Appointment - Bureau of Animal Health and Diagnostic 8 Services Presentation

9 | [David R. Wolfgang, V.M.D., Ph.D., State

10 Veterinarian/Director, Bureau of Animal Health and

11 Diagnostic Services, discussed his role as State

12 Veterinarian. He introduced Dr. Michael Kornreich,

13 Area Veterinarian in Charge/Assistant Director for

14 | Animal and Plant Health Inspection Services (APHIS)

15 and David C. Kennedy, Legal Counsel from the PA

16 Department of Agriculture.

Dr. Wolfgang noted Category I and Category II veterinarian Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) accreditation with the USDA.

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Dr. Wolfgang mentioned regulations and statutes, noting suggestions by former Counsel, Teresa Lazo, on augmentation of the current regulations.

Mr. Kennedy addressed the Accreditation Program that the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture was

running on behalf of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). He stated the department does not have statutory authority to write regulations that put the federal standards into play in Pennsylvania.

Mr. Kennedy discussed codifying the criteria, where the department, through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) or even through some mechanism within the regulation, continue to administer the program, but the Board have the authority to set standards and enforce those standards should there be violations of those standards.

Dr. Nebzydoski noted his concerns in contacting the USDA in Harrisburg.

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Dr. Kornreich supported Dr. Wolfgang's idea that the Board should consider linking accreditation and licensure and violations and penalties by drafting regulations that would allow the Board to discipline veterinarians who fail to properly carry out their duties in accordance with USDA/APHIS guidelines.

Mr. Kennedy commented that the Department of Agriculture in Pennsylvania does not have any codified accreditation standards, and those standards are USDA standards and enforced by Pennsylvania basically

through the federal standards. He stated the program would be better if Pennsylvania at least codified those USDA standards.

Chairman Garg stated that veterinarians are required to adhere to all applicable legal guidelines when practicing. He questioned the point of codifying the regulations on a Pennsylvania level when in the past people have been able to be referred to the Board for failure to follow regulations.

Dr. Kornreich referred to a case where a veterinarian was not accredited in Pennsylvania and the USDA did not have the administrative ability to penalize or impose any kind of penalty on that veterinarian for that activity in Pennsylvania.

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Mr. Kennedy clarified that Pennsylvania currently has no regulations for this federal program and no set regulatory standards for certifications in Pennsylvania, and the Department of Agriculture does not have the statutory authority to codify those standards.

Dr. Kornreich described the process of removing accreditation from underperforming individuals. He discussed making a decision whether the violation was

- 1 part of their accreditation duties and fall under 2 certain sections of 9 CFR (Code of Federal
- 3 Regulations), where voluntary suspension would be
- 4 recommended. He also noted that if the individual
- 5 decided not to take that voluntary suspension, then it
- 6 | would be decided by the courts.

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- 7 Dr. Kornreich noted the desire to link
  8 professional duties regarding accredited federal
  9 accredited work to professional duties as Pennsylvania
  10 veterinarians.
  - Mr. Kennedy explained that the Pennsylvania

    Department of Agriculture requested to be able to work

    across agencies to utilize the Board's authority to

    codify standards in Pennsylvania with regard to

    accreditation.
  - Mr. Davis questioned whether the Department of Agriculture has ever tried to acquire statutory authority through the legislature. Mr. Kennedy stated the preferred initial course of action was working with state agencies to deal with the problem without having to approach the legislature and request statutory authority.
  - Dr. Wolfgang provided an Accreditation Manual for the Board's review.]
