Boards to request the states support. He stated AVMA

desired regulations in place in the majority of

states, then the regulation would not be necessary at

the federal level. He suggested passing this to the

regulatory committee for review.

Dr. Horbal agreed to put regulations in place because of the reasons why veterinarians will not write prescriptions for online pharmacies, particularly for the safety of the animals.]
