3 * * * 1 2 State Board of Veterinary Medicine 3 July 17, 2020 * * * 4 5 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 6 9:30 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 7 with Thomas Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations. 8 9 The Board returned to open session at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 10 11 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Board of Veterinary Medicine was held on Friday, July 12 13 17, 2020. Thomas Garg, V.M.D., Chairman, called the meeting to order at 10:36 a.m. 14 * * * 15 16 [Thomas Garg, V.M.D., Chairman, announced that Julia 17 Feld-Caralle was not at the Board meeting today due to 18 health issues. He wished her a speedy and complete recovery on behalf of the Board. 19 20 Chairman Garg introduced Dr. Joe Bender as a new 21 Board member. 22 Dr. Bender provided a brief history of his 23 professional background. 24 Chairman Garg noted the Board was grateful to 25 have Dr. Bender as a member, noting his ability to

1 provide guidance from his knowledge of dairy.] * * * 2 3 [Introduction of Public Members] * * * 4 5 Approval of minutes of the May 8, 2020 meeting 6 CHAIRMAN GARG: 7 Does anybody have any comments or 8 questions regarding the previous 9 minutes? 10 Would anybody like to make a motion 11 to accept those? 12 DR. NEBZYDOSKI: I'll make a motion. 13 MS. KEHOE: 14 I'll second that. 15 16 CHAIRMAN GARG: 17 Any further discussion? Roll call. 18 We will come back and do all of the 19 20 voting at the end. * * * 21 22 Report of Prosecutorial Division 23 [Christopher K. McNally, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, 24 presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 19-57-25 007662.

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Steven D. Snyder, Esquire, Cipriani & Werner, 1 2 counsel for the respondent, was present and 3 participated in the discussion regarding Case No. 19-57-007662.] 4 * * * 5 6 [Peter D. Kovach, Esquire, Senior Prosecutor in 7 Charge, presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 8 17 - 57 - 002912. Joseph A. Breymeier, Esquire, Naulty, 9 10 Scaricamazza, & McDevitt, LLC, Counsel for Respondent, was present and participated in the discussion.] 11 * * * 12 13 [Peter D. Kovach, Esquire, Senior Prosecutor in 14 Charge, presented the Consent Agreements for Case No. 15 18-57-009902 and Case No. 19-57-002547.] Joseph A. Breymeier, Esquire, Naulty, 16 17 Scaricamazza, & McDevitt, LLC, Counsel for Respondent, 18 was present and participated in the discussion regarding Case No. 19-57-002547.] 19 * * * 20 21 [Charles J. Hartwell, Esquire, Dethlefs-Pykosh Law 22 Group, Counsel for the Respondent, presented the 23 Adjudication and Order for Case No. 17-57-01301.] * * * 24 25 Report of Board Chair - No Report

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6 * * * 1 2 Report of Commissioner - No Report * * * 3 4 Report of Board Counsel 5 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the 6 regulatory status report on the eAgenda. He stated 7 the euthanasia regulation was coming along quite well, noting the annex and preamble are finished. 8 He was hopeful to have the draft to regulatory counsel near 9 10 the end of July or early August. 11 Mr. Davis addressed Act 41 concerning regulations 12 for licensure by endorsement. He mentioned receiving 13 comments from the Pennsylvania Veterinary Medical Association (PVMA) regarding the exposure draft that 14 15 was sent out on May 27, 2020. 16 Mr. Davis stated PVMA suggested it to be 17 unnecessary and burdensome to require a veterinarian 18 or a certified veterinary technician (CVT) provide a 19 copy of their current applicable state laws and 20 regulation, suggested clarification of having 21 experience in the profession for at least two years, 22 and suggest no discipline was too harsh. 23 Mr. Davis referred to the comment, where it was 24 unnecessary and burdensome to require a veterinarian 25 or a certified veterinary technicians (CVT) provide a

copy of their current applicable state laws and
 regulations. He noted every Board was being affected
 by Act 41 with a standard template that all Boards are
 using.

5 Mr. Davis explained the importance of applicants 6 proving what was required in their home jurisdiction 7 to get licensed because they must be substantially 8 equivalent to those requirements in the commonwealth. 9 He mentioned that it was not the commonwealth's 10 burden, noting how difficult that would be especially 11 with individuals from foreign jurisdictions.

Mr. Davis suggested leaving it the way it was in the interest of uniformity.

14 Mr. Davis referred to the request for 15 clarification of having experience in the profession 16 for at least two years. He stated the language was defined as "actively engaged in a clinical practice in 17 18 that state," and offered to change that to "having 19 experience in a profession for at least two years" to 20 keep it uniform within the Veterinary Board's own 21 regulations.

Mr. Davis addressed the comment from PVMA, where no discipline was too harsh. He stated that was directly from a statute, and the Board does not really have the ability to change that. He mentioned the

regulation gives the Board discretion to determine that a violation of the section was not an impediment to licensure. He noted, while it says they have not incurred discipline in their own jurisdiction, the Board needs to find out what that discipline is, and the Board has the ability and discretion to waive that.

8 Ms. Kehoe commented that there are a lot of CVTs 9 who work in research or teaching and wanted to make 10 sure reciprocal licensure would be available for those 11 people.

Mr. Davis mentioned that Ms. Kehoe may have brought up an argument to not further define "having experience in a profession for at least two years" because having experience in a profession for at least two years was a little more nebulous than "actively engaged in clinical practice."

18 Mr. Davis stated it might make it harder for a 19 CVT in that positon to at least think that they could 20 gain licensure through endorsement and would be the 21 Board's argument to keep it as is.

Jennifer A. Keeler, CAE, Executive Director,
Pennsylvania Veterinary Medical Association, commented
that the points made by Mr. Davis are fine and will
report back to PVMA.]

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* * * 1 2 Miscellaneous 3 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed Act 53 of 2020, formerly Senate Bill 637, signed by 4 Governor Wolf on July, 1, 2020. He stated the act 5 6 requires occupational licensing boards and commissions 7 to apply one common set of rules when considering whether to deny, suspend, or revoke a license on the 8 basis of a criminal conviction. 9 10 Mr. Davis commented that it will amend the Criminal History Record Information Act known as CHRIA 11 to require the Boards only withhold a license for 12 13 convictions directly related to the practice of the occupation and that the Boards consider the nature of 14 15 the offense, the amount of time passed since the conviction, evidence of the applicant's fitness to 16 practice the occupation, and other relevant factors 17 18 prior to withholding the license. 19 Mr. Davis stated the Boards will have to develop 20 a list of crimes that directly relate to the 21 occupation or profession. He noted the commissioner's 22 office has been tasked with lists of crimes directly 23 related to each Board but was requesting help from the 2.4 Boards. He stated within the next couple of months 25 the Board will need to provide a list of crimes that

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would essentially stop someone from becoming a
 veterinarian.

Mr. Davis commented that the Board would have to determine whether the nature of the criminal conviction licensure of the individual would pose a substantial risk in health and safety of the individual's patients or clients for individuals who have a criminal conviction not on the list.

9 Mr. Davis stated the Board may not issues a 10 license if the individual was convicted of a sexual 11 offense. He stated applicants convicted of "crimes of 12 violence" as assigned under Title 42 Pa.C.S. Section 13 9714 may only be granted a license if the crime and 14 the applicant met certain conditions listed under the 15 act.

Mr. Davis stated the existing provisions related to felony drug convictions shall only apply to an individual who has been convicted of a drug trafficking offense as defined by the act.

20 Mr. Davis addressed preliminary determinations, 21 where an applicant with a criminal history was unable 22 to determine whether the applicant's criminal history 23 would disqualify the applicant, and they will need to 24 file a petition for preliminary review.

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Mr. Davis commented that the Department of State

must develop a best practices guide for applicants 1 2 with criminal convictions summarizing certain sections 3 of Act 53 describing what it does.] * * * 4 5 MOTIONS 6 CHAIRMAN GARG: 7 We will jump back to the draft minutes.
