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- 1 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a
- 2 regulatory status report for the Board's review. He
- 3 referred to 16A-5726 regarding the euthanasia
- 4 regulation. He mentioned drafting the annex,
- 5 preamble, and Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF) and noted
- 6 updates due to changes in the law since the first
- 7 draft. He mentioned regulatory counsel was evaluating
- 8 | the draft, and he would inform the Board following
- 9 receipt of a report.
- Mr. Davis referred to 16A-5730, which allows
- 11 licensure by endorsement for all of the Bureau of
- 12 Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA) licensure
- 13 boards for easier procurement of licensure in
- 14 | Pennsylvania.
- Mr. Davis noted the Board's review of the annex
- 16 at the previous meeting. He provided a draft of the
- 17 preamble and requested the Board's approval of the
- 18 preamble and annex as presented, which then would be
- 19 promulgated through the regulatory review process.
- 20 Ms. Kehoe questioned whether veterinary licenses
- 21 and veterinary technician certificates should both be
- 22 | worded as licenses in the preamble.
- 23 Mr. Davis referred to the Pennsylvania Veterinary
- 24 Medicine Practice Act Section 11 where it reads, it
- 25 | shall further be the responsibility of the Board to

promulgate by regulation the qualifications and requirements for the certification and regulation of veterinary technicians. He commented that there was not much difference by use of the terminology.

Ms. Kehoe questioned whether a provisional license was for both veterinarians and veterinary technicians.

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Mr. Davis referred to provisional endorsement and license as it refers to veterinarians in the annex at § 31.11(e) and provisional endorsement certificate at § 31.33(c).

Ms. Kehoe requested information regarding the process of a technician who is certified, licensed, or registered coming from another state to work in Pennsylvania.

Mr. Davis explained that individuals would be required to prove their licensure, registration, or certificate was in good standing; prove competency by validating their work experience as a certified veterinary technician (CVT) for 2 of the last 5 years; and confirming the requirements for licensure, certification, registration, etc., in their home jurisdiction was substantially similar to commonwealth requirements.

Mr. Davis referred to $\S 31.33(b)(1)(i)$ regarding

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   CVTs for clarification, mentioning that it is
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   practically worldwide as long as their practice is
